Dear Parishioners,

"The wisdom from above is pure."

There is a wonderful exhibition at the Art Institute entitled, "My New Yorks." The exhibition features the paintings of the American artist, **Georgia O'Keefe**. I have always associated her with paintings of flowers and desert landscapes from the time she lived in Santa Fe, New Mexico. She began her career though living in New York City.

In the 1920's, New York was a boom town of construction. With the invention of the hydraulic elevator, skyscrapers became habitable. Georgia was enamored by the urban life of New York and featured buildings as the topic of her paintings of the 1920's.

In 1925, New York allowed people to live above the 11th floor of a building. She and her husband promptly moved into an apartment on the 30th floor of the Stanton Hotel on the East Side. She became fascinated with the view of the city high above street level. The perspective of the city from her living room captured her artistic imagination, the city in its complexity, diversity, and synergy. From above you could really "feel" the city as a living reality.

A lot of how we deal with life can be affected by our perspective. If we only deal with our life from "the street level," we fail to see the bigger direction of our lives, where we have been, where we are and where we are headed.

If we only see our life from a "high altitude view" we may fail to appreciate the day in day out realities that can be the source of our struggles or joys.

In St. James Letter that is proclaimed this weekend we hear that the wisdom from God comes from above and is not diminished by the reality of evil. The wisdom from "above" is peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits. Our spiritual life is enriched when we are open to the "wisdom" from above as we navigate the challenges and the struggles of living on the "street level" of life. The Lord seeks to lead us to a life of meaning and purpose. We are challenged to get in touch with the wisdom the Lord seeks to share and to better discern where the Lord is leading us.

This weekend is the annual Seminary Appeal in which we are asked to financially and spiritually support our seminary program. The Appeal is supported through our First Fruits

program in which we tithe our weekly collections to support the many second collections.

OLPH has a great history of supporting the formation of seminarians and newly ordained priests and that tradition continues! The seminary can in some ways provide a "high altitude" picture of the ministry of a parish priest, the parish can provide the "street level" picture. They both are critical. You need to be able to understand the theology of the sacrament of marriage, you also must be able to help form an engaged couple attending marriage prep, how does this form me? I am getting married in six months!

Our parish teaching program seminarians will be speaking at all the masses this weekend. **Charlie Liedel** and **Andrew Whipple** have been present at religious education, the family catechesis program, the Men's Spirituality Group, and youth ministry. **Jeff Davlin** and **Tony Davies** will be present at the school, liturgy, and other parish events. We are so blessed to have them. Charlie, Andrew, and Jeff belong to the Diocese of Grand Rapids and Tony is studying for the Archdiocese of Chicago. Tony will be here full time in January for his parish internship assignment. I am grateful to you the parishioners for the important part you serve in forming future priests.

We also cannot forget our native son, **Luke Lato!** He is in second theology and continuing his journey to the priesthood. He is the son of **Mark and Vivi Lato** and is a graduate of our school. He will be a terrific priest!

I had the privilege of participating in the funeral of **Lud Miller**, the brother-in-law of **Sister Paulanne** in Belgium, Wisconsin last week. Every time I meet Sr. Paulanne's family I am so impressed by their faith and goodness. Lud was a beloved grandfather and highly regarded member of his community. May he Rest in Peace!

This Saturday, Sept. 21 is one of my favorite celebrations in Glenview! It is Blocktoberfest! Check it out! Under the leadership of **Zoe Sundstrom** many of our teens will be helping out. Our Men's Club has also done a lot to support this great community event.

We have already been doing some of the groundwork for the upcoming capital campaign, "Generation to Generation: Answer the Call." We will be in the first phase beginning in January.

INSTRUMENTALISTS AND SINGERS OF ALL AGES NEEDED



Anytime is a great time to join one of the choirs and help continue to build the Music Ministry at OLPH. This is a wonderful opportunity to serve God and the parish through sharing your gifts of music and song. And it promises to be a lot of fun as well! The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- We sing at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesday evenings from 7:45-9:15pm. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 17.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass throughout the year.
- All singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 17.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Sunday 5:00pm Mass and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students grade 7 through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church before the Mass they are singing at and sometimes on Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). We will have a welcome meeting/ rehearsal on Oct. 1 at 6:45pm in the Church.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 10:30am Mass from October through Mother's Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- · 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesdays, starting Oct. 1, from 5:45-6:30pm

Cantors

 Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors will sing periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.

good to see you all again. This summer I remained at Holy Name of Jesus Parish, where I'd been since January, and continued to minister to parishioners.

for our seminarians, taken up in the Archdiocese during the weekend of September 21-22, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.
