Dear Parishioners,

"I came so that they may have life."

The month of October is our annual observance of Respect Life Month. We meditate during these autumn days the beauty, the sanctity and the challenges that confront life from conception until natural death. Issues regarding the sacredness

Issues regarding the sacredness of life are complex and there is an intensity regarding these issues during an election year.

The Church encourages us to support the range of challenges that undermine our commitment to protect and advocate on behalf of the most vulnerable.

From the unborn child, to the person on death row, to the homeless migrant, to the dying patient in a cancer ward, there are so many vulnerable people. There are victims of gun violence and those who suffer as the result of chronic poverty. We need to reach out to the child who is food insecure and the person in desperate need of mental health resources.


We must resist the politicization of our many Respect Life ministries. This year's theme for our observance of Respect Life Month is. "I have come so that they may have life." The Lord Jesus is the one who calls us to life and to accompany those who are vulnerable and discarded because they do not count.

The popes of the 20th and 21st centuries have been tireless in their advocacy of the sacredness of life in all its stages. Their teachings have been challenging from Pope John Paul's extraordinary encyclical, "Evangelium Vitae, The Gospel of Life" to Pope Francis recent lamentation about the realities of the culture of death as reflected in abortion, the cruelty to migrants and refugees, the death penalty and oppressive homelessness.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has invited American Catholics to seize upon the graces of the Eucharistic Revival in which we are in the midst. The Eucharist reveals to us Christ in the fullness of life. Every person bears the face of the Lord. Every life from the unborn to the person facing the end of their earthly journey reveals Our Lord's presence, an invitation to be loved, protected and cared for.

May the Eucharistic Revival strengthen our resolve to ground our ministry and faith in the advocacy of the sacredness of life. Seeing this deeper connection to the range of life issues and the eucharist itself will sustain us at this time when life is being threatened on so many fronts.

I am grateful to our Respect Life Ministry here at OLPH under the leadership of **Lloyd and Monica Cassidy**. Over the year, they have raised our consciousness on many issues. I appreciate especially efforts to support at risk moms and their newborn children. We walk with those each year who have had to deal with the death of a child. Over the year our Sharing Room Ministry and Women and Men's Club drives result in providing desperately needed resources.
