Dear Parishioners,

We all love a good plot twist, don't we? Except perhaps when we're on the receiving end, caught like a deer in the headlights. That's what happened to the rich young man in our Gospel from Mark this Sunday. He seems to have it all together and has a genuine desire to inherit eternal life. So, he runs up to Jesus and says, "I've kept all the commandments! What else do I need to do?" Jesus, in his calm and wise way, basically says, "Great

job! Now just sell everything you have. Give the money to the poor, and follow me." (You can almost hear the record scratch in the background!) The man's face falls, and he walks away—torn between his earthly security and the spiritual calling Jesus presented.

To put it in perspective, that's like going to the gym (feeling good & proud of yourself for working out) until your trainer tells you one BIG harsh truth: "If you want to get fit & healthy, you need to give up all the junk food. Also, no alcohol, no white bread, no pasta, no cake, no cookies, no pizza, none!" Ouch!

Just like a personal trainer, Jesus doesn't sugarcoat things. He gets straight to the heart of the matter. The message here is really about what holds us back from truly following Christ. Jesus isn't saying we all need to be poor or that having material wealth is wrong.

What he is emphasizing is that when our wordly possessions become an attachment or obsession—where nothing else matters but our money or success—it will lead to spiritual emptiness because it draws the heart away from God and fosters a false sense of security. It's a pathway to greed, anxiety, and a loss of inner peace.

We must, instead, prioritize spiritual richness over material security. Jesus' command to "sell everything" highlights that true discipleship requires sacrifice.

In many ways, the sacrifice of a disciple is similar to that of a sports team (though they serve different ends). Dedication, discipline, and self-denial are in play. A disciple sacrifices personal comfort, ambitions, and even safety to follow Christ, aiming for spiritual victory and eternal life.

Likewise, a sports team sacrifices time, energy, and individual glory for the collective goal of victory. Both endure hardships and challenges for a greater cause. This couldn't be more evident in the homecoming victory of our **8th Grade Warriors** last weekend! (The long touchdown

pass with only seconds on the clock goes down in the record books as one of the best Warrior moments on the field!) Congratulations also to our **5th graders** for their victory! These incredible and well-deserved outcomes serve as a testament to their hard work and preparation throughout the season.

Not to be outdone, our amazing soccer team led by **Coach Javier Ayala-Morteo**—boasts 12 wins and only 2 losses. At press time, they will have already headed for the playoffs, with Finals slated to take place at Notre Dame HS the following week. This is Coach Javier's fourth year of coaching junior varsity and varsity soccer. Under his leadership, the team won the Championship his second year. Mission Sunday/First Fruits

Next weekend, we celebrate World Mission Sunday, a powerful reminder of our call to be missionary disciples. This year's theme, "Go and invite everyone to the banquet," emphasizes our common call to bring God's love and message to the ends of the earth. On this day we reflect on and support the Church's missionary efforts while also recommitting ourselves to the same mission. The contributions given for the World Mission Sunday collection are crucial for sustaining the Church's work in over 1,150 territories where the Church is young or struggling. Let us prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate together.

OLPH supports World Mission Sunday as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% of annual giving among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection on World Mission Sunday during the weekend of Oct. 19-20, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.








Russell's Next Concert

Domestic Violence Awareness Ministry

Bystanders Intervention - What to do if you witness abuse?



As a friend, colleague or family member, you can make a big difference if you see or know about abuse or violence in a marriage. Only step in when it is safe to do so!

ASK: "Are you okay?" "What do you need from me right now?"

LISTEN: Empower them to make choices. Avoid telling them what to do. Praise them for coping in such a difficult situation.

SAY: Keep calm. Keep it simple. "I saw/heard/notice...and I'm feeling worried about you."

STAND BESIDE: Sit next to them and ask "How can I help?" or "Would you like some help?"

DOCUMENT: Suggest they keep evidence such as photos, dated journal entries screenshots.

TELL: Get support from trusted professionals.

GET HELP: Have a support option ready, if they give you permission: 1-800-799 (SAFE) 7233. Secure an online chat: <u>loveisrespect.org</u>. TEXT "loveis" to 22522.

CALL 911: If you think that you or someone else may be in danger

DON'T GIVE UP on them as a friend, even if they choose to stay in the relationship.

LOOK AFTER YOURSELF: Pay attention to how you are feeling. Set limits for what you can reasonably do to help.
