

## seek, share, rejoice - fr. patrick's letter...

Dear Parishioners of our great parish OLPH,

I greet you in the Name of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Gospel reading of this Sunday talks about humility over ambition. Mark 10:35-45 highlights a key teaching of Jesus about true greatness and servanthood. In this passage, James and John ask Jesus for positions of honor in His glory. Jesus, however, challenges them by emphasizing that true greatness isn't about power or status but about serving others. He

reminds them that even He "did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45).

In a world where many strive for positions of power and recognition, Jesus' teaching is counter cultural. He calls us to lead by serving rather than seeking authority or acknowledgment.

For example, consider a workplace where people often compete for promotions. A person who follows the teaching of Jesus Christ might instead focus on helping his or her colleagues succeed, offering support where needed rather than focusing solely on advancing him/herself. This could mean mentoring a junior colleague or sharing knowledge with others without expecting anything in return. Jesus sets the ultimate example of serving others, even though He had the right to be served. It's a reminder that service to others should come before self-interest.

Think of a family setting where everyone is busy with their own routines. A person living out this teaching might go out of their way to serve the needs of their family members, such as helping with household chores, preparing a meal, or listening to a family member's concerns even when they have their own stresses and needs.


Some people think that being a leader is to command in every way, but Jesus redefines leadership as service. True leaders are those who put the needs of others before their own, acting with compassion and empathy.

In a family, church, school, or community setting, a leader who follows this principle might not just give directions but take time to understand the needs of the family, church or community for example, pray and visit the sick, sign up for being a catechist, lector, Eucharistic Minister, volunteer for less glamorous tasks like cleaning up after an event. All these demonstrate that leadership isn't about being above others but being among them and serving alongside them.

This passage challenges us to think differently about how we live and interact with those around us. Instead of seeking recognition or authority, we are called to embrace humility and service in all areas of life. It's an invitation to live in a way that reflects the self-giving love and humility of Jesus.

My appreciation goes to all of you who exhibit leadership in the form of service not authority. May Almighty God bless you and thank you for all you do for our Parish.

May Our Lady of Perpetual Help intercede for you. Amen Fr. Patrick Kizza

#### **Stewardship Report**

#### To all Parishioners:

The first quarter our fiscal year is already complete! The results of Collections for the three months are listed below. As a Parish Community, you have contributed \$592,990 towards Sunday and Holyday collections from July 1 to September 30, 2024. We are ever grateful for your generosity and the daily sacrifices you make to support OLPH parish.



You can see, though, from the charts below, that we are trailing in actual collections as compared to the quarter ended September 30, 2023, and we are also trailing budget for the current year. Collections in the months including the summer are traditionally lower than other months, but you can help OLPH by "bridging the gap" if you can. Your generosity is always greatly appreciated!

Please watch for a mailing from OLPH entitled "BRIDGE THE GAP," a campaign, which, with your help, will enable us to do just that. Our Bridge the Gap campaign last year helped us get back on track. The button is already open on GiveCentral and



the QR code is included on this bulletin page for your convenience, should you want to get a jump on the mail! Our FY25 budget for the general offertory collection, which includes Christmas and Easter, is just under \$3.4 million. We need to reach this goal to make certain we can cover


continued increasing costs, mainly in salaries and benefits (8.7%) and planned maintenance expenses (11%), as well as unbudgeted and unplanned repairs and maintenance costs which we have seen pop up this year already. These areas are vital to the life of the parish.

Direct support to the School and Religious Education programs is also

provided out of the general offertory collection. Our First Fruits program benefits from 6% of the annual collection, as well. All areas of parish life benefit from your generosity through the Offertory collection.

This is also the time of year when our parish provides a tool for parishioners to reflect specifically on their annual giving levels to the Offertory collection. We will be sending a new card for this new year, as a follow-up to last year's Intentional Offertory Initiative, which we encourage you to return to us indicating your commitment for the upcoming year. Our budget for FY25 includes a needed increase in the Offertory of approximately 4%. Last year's positive response to this effort enabled us to reach our FY24 budget goals!

We thank you for your continued sacrifice and efforts to help sustain the works of our parish and we are ever grateful for your time, talent and treasure shared here at OLPH parish!

#### **Mission Sunday/First Fruits**

World Mission Sunday sends us to "go and invite everyone to the banquet." (Mt 22:19)

Today, we celebrate that the Church continues to go out to the ends of the earth with the invitation of Jesus. As we gather on World Mission Sunday, along with Catholics around the globe, our prayers and our contributions to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith foster global missionary cooperation, enabling the pastoral and evangelizing work of the Church. This includes building churches, providing healthcare and education and training future priests and religious. Let us remember that our participation and support help invite countless souls to the feast of God's love.

Thank you for going out to everyone and extending the invitation to communion with Christ.

OLPH supports World Mission Sunday as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% of annual giving among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection on World Mission Sunday during the weekend of October 19-20, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.
