Dear Parishioners,

"His dominion is everlasting."

This weekend marks an ending and a beginning. We acknowledge the end of the liturgical year with the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ the King. We will begin a new liturgical year next weekend with the First Sunday of Advent.

The readings this weekend speak of ultimate things. They speak of

the end times, judgement and our heartfelt and universal acceptance of Jesus Christ.

The readings speak to taking stock of our lives, the choices we have made, the values we have embraced. What is the legacy of faith we are building? Where have I struggled? Where do I need to be healed?

Life as we know passes very quickly, especially as we get older. There is an urgency to embrace the moment and do what we need to do to live a life of meaning and purpose.

As this liturgical year draws to a close, the evangelist Mark has guided us. Throughout the past year we have had many gospels proclaimed with him as the author. His writing style is direct and to the point. His is the oldest of the four gospels. He focuses on Jesus' deeds. Reflection on these acts of Jesus invite us to repentance and conversion. Time is of the essence!

Last week, I attended a conference for priests who will turn 70 next year. Some of the agenda was focused on the very practical: Social Security, Medicare, and a host of other financial issues.

Most of our time though was a reflection on where we are emotionally and spiritually. There was a lot of time to reflect on where I have been and where do I see myself headed questions very suited to the scriptures this weekend.

I was led to a book I would highly recommend, "The Gift of Years, Growing Old Gracefully," by **Sr. Joan Chittister** OSB. It is a wonderful guide for all of us as we age. We can so easily be held hostage by feelings of regret and miss all the opportunities the present and future have in store.

As we age, we need to gradually make more adjustments to our way of living. We need to keep cultivating friendships. We need to recall the blessings and wisdom we have accumulated. We need to prevail against forces of fear about the future or being inundated with anxiety about circumstances we have no control over. We can shape our legacy.

The writer **David Brooks** speaks of the difference between resume virtues and eulogy virtues. The resume virtues are

the ones you put on your resume which are the skills you bring to the marketplace. The eulogy virtues are the ones mentioned in your eulogy. They are much deeper than a skill set: Who were you? What was the nature of your relationships? Were you bold, loving, consistent, present? Eulogy virtues are far more significant than resume virtues.

We are encouraged through our reflection on the weekly scriptures to assess where we are at and where do we want to be headed.

Take the time to reflect on the moments of grace and accomplishment of the past year. Take stock of who you are becoming!

A highlight of this past week for me was celebrating Mass at Chestnut Square. Each month we celebrate the liturgy with a wonderful community that lives there. Several members of the Scripture Study group gathered to honor residents and parishioners, **Bob and Penny Piersen**. We were celebrating the tremendous influence they have had on our Scripture Study program here at OLPH. Hundreds of parishioners have benefited from this program. Over the years many of the books of the Bible have been explored; Bob and Penny, in many ways, formed and shaped the program today in which well over two hundred parishioners participate. From all of us, Bob and Penny, thank you, we love you!

I attended a wonderful evening with the former presidents of the Women's Club hosted by **Debbie Mulroy**. This annual gathering supports and encourages the new president, **Colleen Mocogni**. As I looked around the room, I felt how blest we are as a parish with those who have served with leadership and passionate commitment for our parish.

As Thanksgiving approaches, I am beyond grateful for you! May your holiday be awesome and if you are traveling be safe!


Photos in Remembrance of our Loved Ones





What is a Blue Christmas Service?

Blue Christmas Services are often held near Dec. 21 (the longest night of the year) as solace for those who do not find Christmas a happy event. This may include those who are mourning the death of a loved one or a divorce; those who are suffering from illness, addiction, or estrangement; those who are lonely, struggling financially, or simply those with hard memories of Christmases past. Whatever the reason, this service acknowledges that God still loves us and continues to be the light of the world even if we struggle to rejoice.

On December 18, 2024, the Catholic Community of Glenbrook (Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Catherine Labouré, St. Norbert & Our Lady of the Brook), will be offering a Blue Christmas Service. This event will be held at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in the main church. No registration is required and there is NO fee. All are welcome.

The service will be facilitated by certified spiritual director, Paula Kowalkowski, and will consist of reflective prayer and music. The service is a gentle reminder that we are never alone and that there is always hope.

Brief background of Paula Kowalkowski

Paula Kowalkowski has worked as a music educator on the high school and college level for over 30 years. She currently is the Music Director at St. Thomas Becket Church in Mount Prospect. 


