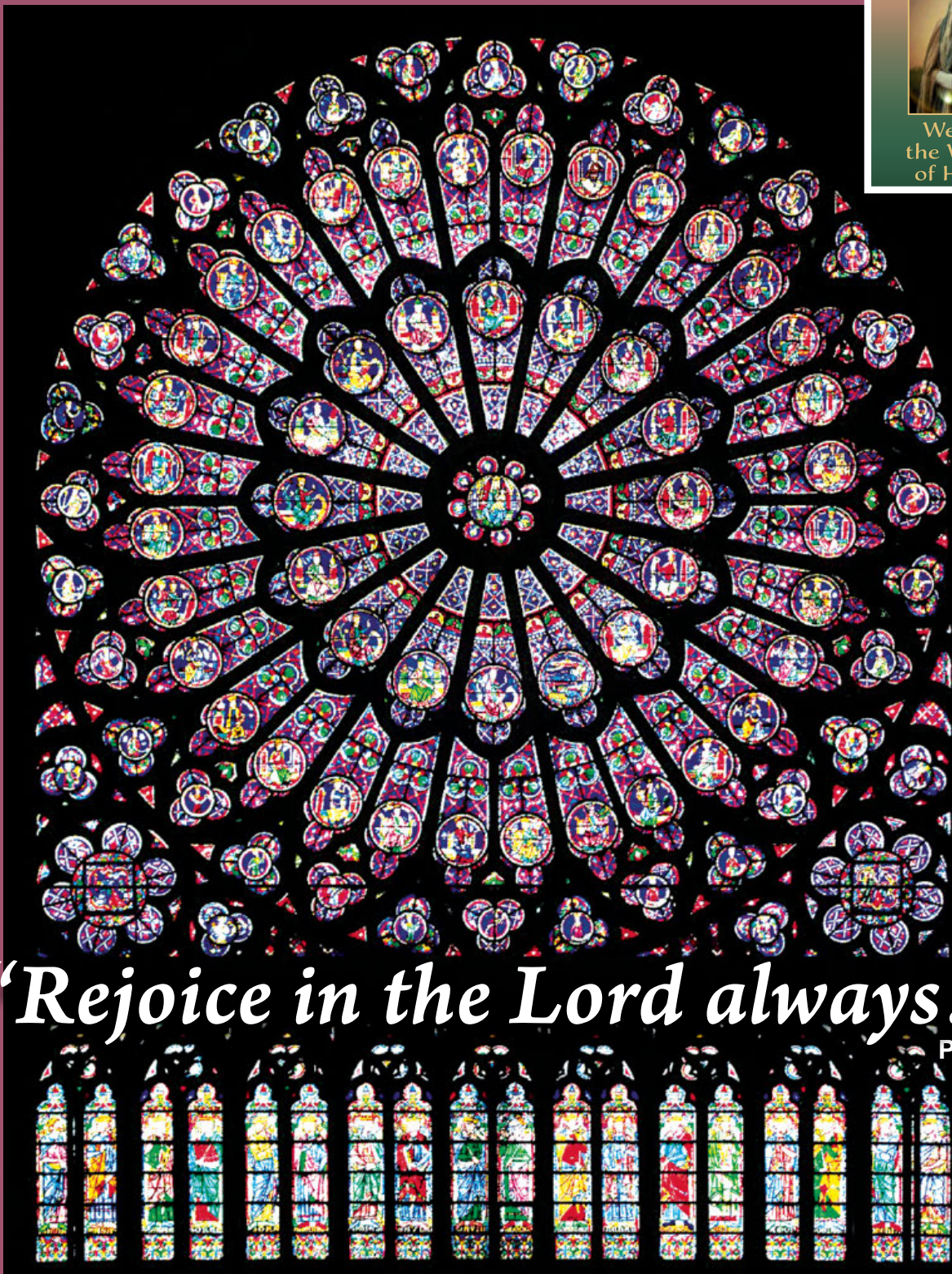

Dear Parishioners,
"Rejoice in the Lord always!"

Last week many throughout the world rejoiced with the reopening of the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris. Five years ago, the Cathedral experienced a devastating fire that questioned whether it could be repaired.

On April 15, 2019, thousands of Parisians gathered as they saw the fire rip through the cathedral as the historic spire crashed through the roof. People spontaneously began praying the rosary and prayed for the safety of first responders attempting to extinguish the fire and save as many treasures as possible. The fire would burn through the night, as word spread, people throughout the world prayed in solidarity for this treasured house of worship.

As morning dawned the next day, one of the cherished treasures of the Cathedral, the Statue of the Virgin Mary of the Pillar, one of the most venerated treasures of the Cathedral, was seen unharmed and resilient. She has been a focal point of the Cathedral since the 14th century. She would once again be the rallying force of the Parisians and became the icon of determination in restoring the Cathedral. Now the pulpit has been placed at the foot of the statue to show the Virgin Mary was the first hearer of the Word of God.

The newly consecrated altar has eight relics of French saints embedded in its base, one of them being St. Catherine Labouré!

Five years later, \$750 million dollars later, the Cathedral is resplendent. I have been captivated by the brilliant images of the restoration. The [National Geographic](#) cable channel has presented several special documentaries of the extraordinary effort to restore the Cathedral and to preserve its future for many generations to come.

This moment captures so much the message of Advent and the spirit of this Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of rejoicing, so close is our celebration of the Incarnation of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

We rejoice as the rose candle is lit on our Advent Wreath.

There are many events taking place to make the most of our Advent journey. This coming Tuesday is the annual

Communal Reconciliation Service. It will be held at St. Norbert in Northbrook at 7:00pm. There will be several confessors available.

As much as the spirit of rejoicing is in the air, for many the upcoming holidays can be difficult and painful. For some there can be painful memories of Christmases past when death or illness remains close to the surface. Some are dealing with losses of a psychological or emotional nature, loss of a job, a close friend, a personal crisis. On Wednesday, December 18 at 7:00pm, we are hosting a service of hope and healing. Through music and words of comfort we will celebrate the profound love God has for all of us.

I am grateful to the Men's Club for hosting our annual Christmas Party for the children of St. Sabina Parish. Under the faithful leadership of **Tony Indovina**, it was a great celebration. Thanks to everyone who played a part in this wonderful celebration. Tony, with his wife **Pat**, have been the chairpersons of this event for 34 years. Thank you!

We recently celebrated the 90th birthday of **Father Bob Borre**. Fr. Borre was raised here at OLPH and had a great career in the military as a chaplain. He retired with the rank of Brigadier General. He often serves as a confessor here at the parish. I am so grateful for his presence and priesthood. Congratulations General!

One of the great organizations is, "Rebuilding Together, North Suburban Chicago." Under the leadership of parishioner **Sharon Riley** with the help of her husband **Jim** and many parishioners and beyond, they help many to be able to stay in their homes. They assist in repairing and replacing aspects of a person's home that have deteriorated or broken down or for which they have had issues that the homeowner has not been able to address. With amazing energy and generosity, they take on several home projects that have resulted in remarkable stories of new hope and life for the families and individuals involved. 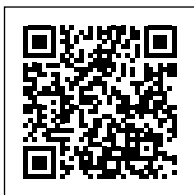

What is a Blue Christmas Service?

Blue Christmas Services are often held near Dec. 21 (the longest night of the year) as solace for those who do not find Christmas a happy event. This may include those who are mourning the death of a loved one or a divorce; those who are suffering from illness, addiction, or estrangement; those who are lonely, struggling financially, or simply those with hard memories of Christmases past. Whatever the reason, this service acknowledges that God still loves us and continues to be the light of the world even if we struggle to rejoice.

On December 18, 2024, the Catholic Community of Glenbrook (Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Catherine Labouré, St. Norbert & Our Lady of the Brook), will be offering a Blue Christmas Service. This event will be held at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in the main church. No registration is required and there is NO fee. All are welcome.

The service will be facilitated by certified spiritual director, **Paula Kowalkowski**, and will consist of reflective prayer and music. The service is a gentle reminder that we are never alone and that there is always hope.

Respect Life Ministry

Please contact your state senator and representative now to express your opposition to Senate Bill 3499, a proposed piece of legislation that seeks to legalize assisted suicide in Illinois.

Proponents refer to this as Medical Aid in Dying (MAID), but using the word "medical" to describe the intentional taking of a life distorts the meaning of medicine and masks what SB 3499 is about, which is why we continue to refer to this as "assisted suicide."

The proponents of this bill are actively urging lawmakers to pass SB 3499 during the upcoming Lame Duck session, which begins on January 2 and concludes on January 8, when the 104th General Assembly is sworn into office.

In keeping with our faith traditions, legalizing assisted suicide goes against the Church's teachings on the sanctity and dignity of human life. It undermines the value of each human person, particularly those who are vulnerable.

Laws permitting assisted suicide pose significant risks to the poor, marginalized, and disabled, who may face pressure to end their lives rather than receive the care and compassion they need and deserve. There are documented cases from states where assisted suicide has been legalized, where individuals with rare or life-threatening conditions were denied necessary medical treatment and were instead offered life-ending prescriptions.

We urge lawmakers to look to the example set by Canada, where initial safeguards meant to limit assisted suicide to individuals with terminal illnesses have been gradually expanded to include people suffering from mental illness. The Illinois bishops' letter, A Better Way Forward, offers further insights into the dangers of assisted suicide.

Illinois does not need to legalize assisted suicide. What we truly need is increased access to quality health care, enhanced palliative care options, and loving and compassionate support services for those at the end of their life. These are the alternatives that uphold the dignity of every person.

Finally, we ask for your prayers for the conversion of hearts among those who support assisted suicide.

seek, share, rejoice - fr. larry's trip to europe...

Last November, I, **Fr. Larry Basbas** - along with **Fr. Carl Morello** of St. Giles Parish (Oak Park) - led a group of parishioners on a wonderful and memorable pilgrimage to **Lourdes** and **Spain**. **Fr. Tom May** of St. Paul VI (Riverside) and our own **Fr. Jim Barrett** accompanied us on this trip.

In Lourdes, our group walked in the footsteps of **St. Bernadette**, visiting the Grotto where the Virgin Mary appeared to her, and we joined pilgrims from around the world in prayer and the candlelight procession. The water ritual at the site was a particularly profound moment for all of us. We were guided, four people at a time, into a small station that contained a pool filled with the holy spring water. The ritual has since been modified due to Covid.

Instead of immersing in the pool, we were asked to cup our hands into which holy water was poured by a guide. The first pour was to wash our face and hands as a gesture of humility and cleansing... and the second pouring was to drink the spring water as a symbolic act of inner purification.

Our group also traveled to Spain, where we marveled at the spiritual legacy of **St. Teresa** in **Avila**, walking along the city's ancient walls and visiting her convent. We also spent some time visiting the capital city, **Madrid**, and other historically significant cities like **Zaragoza** and **Toledo**. And what a way to end the last three days of the trip than with a visit to the **Catalonian region** of Spain, inspiring us with the breathtaking beauty of both **Montserrat** and the Sagrada Familia basilica in **Barcelona**, a testament to faith and artistry. Montserrat is a Benedictine monastery renowned for its stunning natural setting ("serrated mountain") and the venerated statue of the Virgin of **Montserrat**, also known as "La Moreneta." I was honored to celebrate my first Mass in Spain there.

Still under construction since 1882, **Sagrada Familia's** intricate facades, towering spires, and symbolic interiors make it a masterpiece of spiritual and artistic expression. If you're a fan of **Antoni Gaudi's** work, a visit to Barcelona is a MUST. I especially want to express my heartfelt gratitude to our OLPH parishioners for joining me on this unforgettable pilgrimage. Your faith, camaraderie, and joyful spirit made the journey truly special.

To all Parishioners:

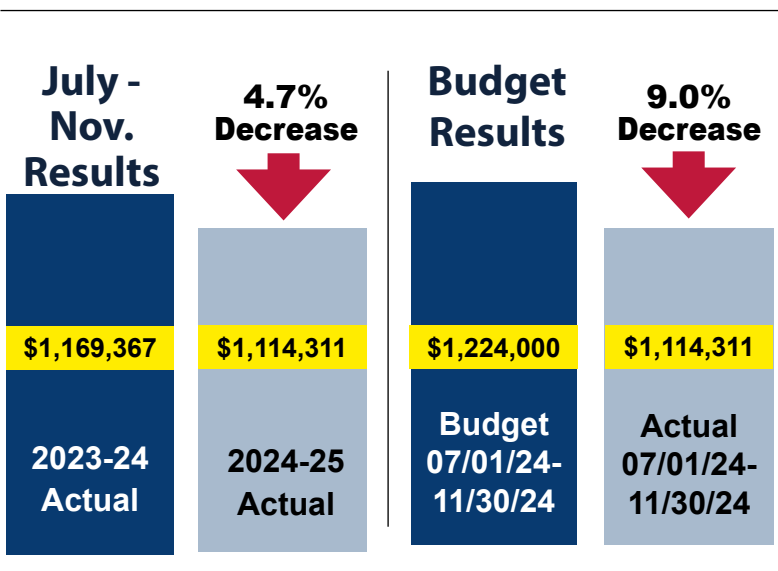

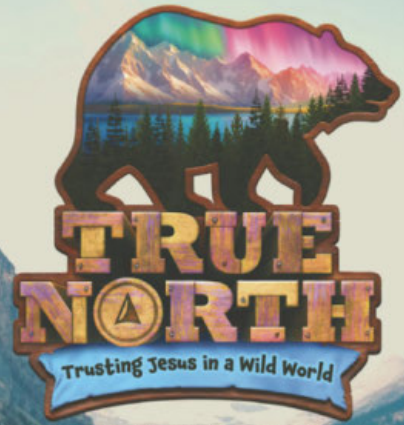
