Dear Parishioners,

"There are different gifts but the same Spirit."

Dealing with differences is a major challenge in life.

The great Swiss psychologist, Jean Piaget taught that one of the major breakthroughs in our cognitive development is when we come to the realization, we are not the center of the universe.

As infants we cry and we are fed, we scream, and Mom or Dad come running. We soon discover that there are others who have needs and desires.

Navigating the world of me vs. us is never easy. We learn to deal with differences. I do not rule the universe, there are others whose needs are more important. There are times when I need to share or defer to those who have wisdom and experience.

We learn as we get older who we are and the unique gifts the Lord has blessed us with. We learn from each other, no one is perfect, no one has cornered the market on gifts and talents. In God's great design we all bring our gifts into life and the more we see ourselves in community the healthier we are.

This sense that we are better together is a foundation to Jesus' teaching. The community he was inviting us to belong to would be made up of people with many different gifts but created by the one God, the one Spirit.

Our second reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians speaks so powerfully to this reality. The Church in Corinth was bitterly divided and there was significant conflict. No one would give in. Everyone thought their way was the only way.

The teachings of Jesus invite us to build bridges rather than walls. We need to work harder at understanding differences, we need to seek common ground and appreciate the deeper levels of life that unify us. "There are different gifts but the same Spirit."

The challenge to live amid differences is a challenge for a family, for a parish, for the world!

Several of our parishioners are dealing with family members and friends who have been devastated by the fires in Southern California. We must pray for the safety of all, especially First Responders who have been nothing short of heroic.

This coming Monday is a day of significance. As a nation we remember the extraordinary contributions of **Dr. Martin**

Luther King Jr. He challenged America to deal with what many call our Original Sin, racism. He challenged us to address this racial wound that had so significantly divided America. We are still on the road to racial healing, but progress has been made but this "wound" is never far from the surface. We must pray for endurance to keep confronting the forces of racial injustice and evil.

Monday also marks the Inauguration of **President Donald Trump**. We pray for his success. We are deeply divided as a nation and might all benefit from a reflection Paul's letter proclaimed this weekend. Inauguration Day is a time for a national new beginning. We need to find ways to work to achieve, "a more perfect Union." Our Constitution acknowledges that the American Republic is built on the desire for progress; never an easy journey.

OLPH has been designated a pilgrimage site for the Holy Year that began on Christmas Eve by **Pope Francis**. Most people will not be able to visit the five Holy Doors in Rome, so each diocese was asked to designate some churches that pilgrims could visit and participate in the Holy Year. The theme of the Holy Year is, "Pilgrims of Hope."

The Pope feels that there are so many people dealing with war, poverty, and fear. The Christian Gospel is rooted in the promise of Hope. I pray that one of the graces we will all receive is a renewed sense of hope in our lives. I have already met several pilgrims visiting our parish to observe the Holy Year. 

TEN COMMANDMENTS

TO CONSIDER WHEN CONTRIBUTING TO SHARING

The Sharing Committee is extremely grateful for the generosity of parishioners over the past 43 years. We are often overwhelmed by the outpouring of goods for the needy. OLPH volunteers work many hours to sort, organize and coordinate pick up or delivery of donations. To facilitate the sharing process, please consider the guidelines outlined below.

1. Non-perishable food items continue to be our greatest need. Please donate items with their original seal and within their expiration date. Avoid glass containers.

2. We are abundantly blessed to be able to give so generously. **Please consider the dignity of the needy when evaluating what to donate.** Those receiving will appreciate items that are clean and in good repair. Ask yourself whether you would be comfortable passing an item on to someone you know.

3. When donating your gently worn, clean, in season clothing, please deliver them to the Sharing Room folded in boxes or bags, or on hangers if fresh from the cleaners, keeping weight of bags manageable for our volunteers. All types of clothing are welcome with the exception of used undergarments (men's undershirts are welcome).

4. Shoes should be gently worn.

 Small household items in clean, good condition are welcome. Small appliances need to be complete and in working order. We cannot accept TVs.

6. Contact the Parish Center for donation of larger furnishings. We will contact you to discuss the items. If they are in good condition and we are sure we have an outlet for the goods, pick-up or delivery will be arranged. Please do not deliver furniture or appliances to the Sharing Room without authorization.

7. We can only accept NEW toys.

8. We do find homes for most books, **but are unable** to find outlets for encyclopedias and textbooks.

9. Please do not donate redecorating or construction materials.

10. Please be mindful that the **dumpsters outside** the Sharing Room door fill routinely with items we do not feel comfortable passing on. This creates an unnecessary expense and reduces funds for the poor.
