Dear Parishioners,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me."

The Australian economist **Henry Egras**, who taught for some time at the Harvard Business School, is considered one of the founders of the 'mission driven' concept for business, governmental and not for profit organizations. This concept has been influential in

getting employees to think outside the box when it comes to how one sees the product they are producing or the effect they hope they are having in the workplace.

A mission driven organization thinks beyond profit margins and efficiency. You see yourself as part of a larger process that involves everyone in the organization, from the custodian to the CEO. It sees everyone as crucial to the organization and its success. There is an old Sicilian proverb that a fish rots from its head!

Years ago, Northwestern Hospital described its mission in two words, "Patients First." Everyone, from the valet to the President of the hospital, was committed to doing their part to make the mission happen. Nowadays businesses have corporate retreats for senior management to motivate everyone to influence the mission. Employees at their annual performance reviews are evaluated on how committed they are to the organization's mission statement.

One of the great best sellers of recent years was **Rick Warren's** "The Purpose Driven Life." That book continues to have a major impact on how people see their life work as consequential.

This is all interesting and thought provoking. With no offense to Professor Egras or Rick Warren, there was someone else long before them that was driven by a sense of purpose and mission. That person was Jesus Christ.

The mission driven force of Jesus' ministry can be traced to this weekend's Gospel, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor."

We find ourselves in the early weeks of the New Year, we need to recapture our sense of mission. We are part of a 2000-year effort to transform the world considering the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are indeed "mission driven" and it takes every one of us to do our part to make the mission real. Baptized and anointed, we are part of the mission driven outreach of the Church. It must impact

everything, from the Scouts pancake breakfast to the Sharing Room, from Knit for Life to the Scripture Study Program. I am blessed everyday seeing the "mission" being realized by so many here at OLPH.

One way we will be ensuring the mission of the future is participation in the Archdiocesan Capital Campaign, "Generation to Generation, Answering the Call." We are just in the early stages of launching the campaign here at OLPH. I am deeply grateful to Bill and Kilby Macfadden, Bob and Anne Michels, Dave and Dawn Ludden and John and Maureen Clifford who are willing to serve as Co-Chairs of the campaign at the parish. There will be much more about this, and many more people will be involved, but the purpose of the campaign will only make sense if we see ourselves as "mission driven" on behalf of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

This weekend we celebrate one of the many results of being mission driven, our parish school. This week we celebrate Catholic Schools Week, and we celebrate the efforts of our school founded in 1929. Not the best year to begin a school, but not even the depression could stop what has become in the eyes of many, the crown jewel of the Catholic School System in the Archdiocese of Chicago. We are the largest school in the system and each of our students excels in academics, faith formation, athletics and Christian identity, Education on the elementary level has never been more challenging. I commend Dr. Amy Mills, her administrative staff and faculty for the outstanding school they have formed. Talk about "mission driven"! I also thank the parents and parishioners for their tremendous sacrifices to give us the resources we need to be an excellent place for learning.

Our school through Dr. Mills' leadership sees our Catholic identity and culture as essential to our mission. I am so proud of our team; our faculty truly have a vocation to teach, and we celebrate their commitment. Teaching is a noble vocation, and we all have teachers that were of enormous impact on our lives and the people we became. To our teachers and all teachers, thank you!!



## TEN COMMANDMENTS

## TO CONSIDER WHEN CONTRIBUTING TO SHARING

The Sharing Committee is extremely grateful for the generosity of parishioners over the past 43 years. We are often overwhelmed by the outpouring of goods for the needy. OLPH volunteers work many hours to sort, organize and coordinate pick up or delivery of donations. To facilitate the sharing process, please consider the guidelines outlined below.

- 1. Non-perishable food items continue to be our greatest need. Please donate items with their original seal and within their expiration date. Avoid glass containers.
- 2. We are abundantly blessed to be able to give so generously. Please consider the dignity of the needy when evaluating what to donate. Those receiving will appreciate items that are clean and in good repair. Ask yourself whether you would be comfortable passing an item on to someone you know.
- 3. When donating your gently worn, clean, in season clothing, please deliver them to the Sharing Room folded in boxes or bags, or on hangers if fresh from the cleaners, keeping weight of bags manageable for our volunteers. All types of clothing are welcome with the exception of used undergarments (men's undershirts are welcome).
- 4. Shoes should be gently worn.
- 5. Small household items in clean, good condition are welcome. Small appliances need to be complete and in working order. We cannot accept TVs.
- 6. Contact the Parish Center for donation of larger furnishings. We will contact you to discuss the items. If they are in good condition and we are sure we have an outlet for the goods, pick-up or delivery will be arranged. Please do not deliver furniture or appliances to the Sharing Room without authorization.
- 7. We can only accept NEW toys.
- 8. We do find homes for most books, but are unable to find outlets for encyclopedias and textbooks.
- Please do not donate redecorating or construction materials.
- 10. Please be mindful that the dumpsters outside the Sharing Room door fill routinely with items we do not feel comfortable passing on. This creates an unnecessary expense and reduces funds for the poor.






