

Dear Parishioners,

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit."

I was recently recollecting, with a few friends, about some of the more creative ways we coped with the worst of Covid, those long months of isolation and anxiety.

I was sharing with them how I got hooked on the ESPN's series. "The Last Dance." It was a series that

profiled Michael Jordan and the Bulls as they attempted to achieve winning their sixth championship in eight seasons. It was the 1997-1998 season that would end in triumph but with then result in the dismantling of one of the greatest sports dynasties ever.

The series focusses on Michael Jordan who as his statue at the United center proclaims, "the best there ever was." The series is an in-depth view into the drama of that final season but a remarkable exploration into the person, Michael Jordan is. From his childhood to his evolution to becoming a global superstar, you are drawn into the challenge of being the best, knowing yourself, and adapting to the many obstacles that can come your way.

The scriptures, this weekend, invite us to reflect more deeply on who we really are, the basic challenge of who I really am. How do I cultivate the gifts God has given me? 



The Sacrament of the Annointing of the Sick

"Anointing the Sick and the Dying: A GIFT NOT TO BE DELAYED"

Procrastination is a fine art—until it isn't! We delay chores, ignore emails, and put off calling the plumber until the kitchen turns into a swimming pool. But when it comes to the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, waiting too long can mean missing out on the grace, peace, spiritual strength, and, when God wills it, physical healing it offers.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the Church's greatest gifts given to those who are seriously ill, elderly, or facing major surgery. It is often confused with the term "Last Rites." **Last Rites** refers to the final sacraments given to a dying person, which typically include the Anointing of the Sick, Confession (if possible), and Viaticum (Holy Communion as food for the journey to eternal life). Last Rites is not a separate sacrament but a collective term for these final spiritual preparations before death.

Too often, families hesitate to call a priest until their loved one is actively dying or unconscious. This delay is a bad Catholic habit that can have several unfortunate consequences. First, the person may not be conscious. One of the great benefits of this sacrament is the opportunity to **receive it with full awareness**, offering prayers and uniting suffering with Christ. But if a person is unconscious or unable to communicate, they may miss the peace and reassurance the sacrament brings.

Secondly, the person may not be able to confess. If the sick person has not confessed their mortal sin, receiving the sacrament earlier ensures they can also go to Confession and be fully reconciled with God.

Thirdly (and perhaps the most problematic), there might not be any priest available, or the priest is unable to arrive in a timely manner. The sad reality is there aren't enough of us priests to go around. Priests do their best to respond quickly, but emergencies and busy schedules may cause delays. Calling for the sacrament earlier ensures that the person receives it without the stress of urgency.

Sometimes families prefer their favorite priest to administer the sacrament. While that is well within reason, it can lead to **unnecessary delays** and misunderstandings about the sacrament. The power of the sacrament comes from Christ, not the individual priest, and any validly ordained priest acts as his instrument. What matters most is receiving the **grace** and **healing** offered through the sacrament, not personal preference.

Lastly, this Sacrament is more than a deathbed ritual. Receiving the Anointing of the Sick in the early stages of an

illness allows the person to experience **spiritual strength throughout their suffering.** It is not about waiting for the moment of death but about receiving God's grace in times of need.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is a gift that cannot be delayed. If you or a loved one meet one of the following criteria, please **call a priest!**

- 1) Diagnosed with a serious illness
- 2) Will undergo a major surgery
- 3) Elderly person getting significantly weaker
- 4) Struggling with a long-term illness that is worsening
- 5) Entering hospice or palliative care.

Please note that the last criterion (ie. hospice) is when families sometimes "wait it out" until the last minute. It is precisely this unnecessary delay that I am addressing in this article.

The Anointing of the Sick is a powerful sacrament of healing, **not a sacrament of despair**. Rather than waiting for the final breath, we should embrace it as soon as serious illness arises, allowing God's grace to work in the person's life for as long as possible. God's grace is best enjoyed sooner rather than later. So don't delay; after all, no one wants to be the person who postponed a blessing!






