

Dear Parishioners,

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

The season of Lent is upon us. This is the time we begin our annual retreat to examine the ways we can embrace a more authentic life as a follower of Christ.

We are not alone in this journey of purification and renewal. We have the rich traditions of our church, we

have the sacraments, we have one another! During these early days of this 40-day journey we can have a sense that there is a lot of time to get into the groove. The reality is that these Lenten days will pass very quickly and if we are not careful, we could be prone to the lament, boy I wish I had gotten into the Lenten spirit earlier. Suddenly it will be Holy Week and Easter.

The opening words of the first reading that was proclaimed by the Prophet Joel on Ash Wednesday have an urgent dimension to them, "Now is the time, says the Lord to return to me with all your heart." The time to begin the process of spiritual renewal is NOW! We cannot kick the can down the street in hopes of a more convenient time. It is never easy to change patterns, alter routines, to begin anew.

Please take the time to review our Lenten offerings that are described in the Bulletin and web site. The calendar of Lent and Holy Week alerts you to many offerings to enrich your Lenten pilgrimage. Try something new, consider the Lenten Morning of Renewal on March 22, or the Men's Day of Reflection on March 29. Maybe you haven't been to confession in a long time, maybe you need to incorporate prayer more deliberately in a day, Daily Mass, a visit to the Church, attending adoration on Fridays, there are so many possibilities. Make sure you get a copy of our Daily Lenten reflection booklets.

The three pillars of the Lenten Journey are prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Our Lenten almsgiving project is to support Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish in Ponce, Puerto Rico. I have visited this parish a few times when I have visited Puerto Rico on mission trips organized by Catholic Extension. This parish is in one of the poorest areas where more than half of the community lives below the poverty line. Unfortunately, where it is situated, it is often ravaged by hurricanes and earthquakes.

Next weekend, I am delighted to welcome **Fr. Carlos Collazo** who has served OLPH in Ponce to speak to us about the challenges his parish is facing. The second

collection will be our almsgiving gift to our "sister" parish. The parish provides many services to the parish and larger community. It is a faith community that embraces the biblical call, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved". I am grateful to our parishioner **Elisa Kline** who works at Catholic Extension who has helped organize this visit. I cannot wait for you to meet Fr. Carlos; he is a remarkable priest. He will also be visiting with our students in the school and religious education. Bienvenido's!

We are gradually getting in place the leadership of some of our ministries in the parish for next year. One of the reasons our parish is thriving is because of the generous and influential leadership that parishioners provide. I am grateful to **John Kurkowski** who has served so faithfully as the Chair of the Endowment Board for many years. While John will continue on the Board, **Rob Guttschow** will be serving as the new Chair. Thanks, Rob! **Mike Crowe** will continue as the President of the Pastoral Council and **Bridget Baumstark** will continue as Chair of the Finance Council. I am so grateful for the service of Mike and Bridget.

Special thanks to **Beth Engels** who each year gathers gifts for the New Hope Apartments and Christmas and Easter. She has organized a legion of parishioners that provide hundreds of dollars in gifts that are so deeply appreciated by the residents.

Later in the Spring the Women's Club sponsors a Spring Gala at Sunset Ridge Country Club. We are looking for auction prizes to help raise money to support the parish. If you have anything you would like to offer, let me know and I will pass it along to the committee.

Thank you to the Dussman Council of the Knights of Columbus for their wonderful Clergy Appreciation Spaghetti Dinner last week. They presented very generous gifts to the parish and our Youth Ministry Program. The highlight of the evening was their tribute to Sr. Paulanne.

KoC Clergy Appreciation Spaghetti Dinner

The Knights of Columbus held their 7th Annual Clergy Appreciation Spaghetti Dinner on March 1 at St. Catherine Labouré and 150 parishioners came out to show their love for our Clergy. We were blessed with four Seminarians, two Deacons, six Priests and the main Honoree, **St. Paulanne Held**. Sister received a standing ovation as she made her way to the stage to receive her Certificate of Appreciation for 64 years of service to the Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish.

Honoring Sr. Paulanne

Here is the tribute in its entirety from **John O'Malley**, Grand Knight, Fr. Dussman Council:

"Sr. Paulanne has served the OLPH Parish for well over forty years. She has seen pastors come and go. **Fr. Boland** is the Pastor now, but everyone knows who's really in charge!

"During her tenure, she has been helping families in crisis in Glenview and the North Suburban Area. In the early 1980s, Sr. Paulanne and **Pastor Fr. Myles McDonnell** decided to put more structured support around the assistance to those in need and The Sr. Paulanne Needy Family Fund was named. Many of the people who have received assistance have faced unemployment, under employment, illnesses, loss of a loved one, foreclosure, rental eviction, and homelessness. Their needs include food, clothing, diapers, gas, school supplies, car repairs, as well as rent, medical and dental assistance. Her personal outreach to needy who come to her door has grown into an effort which provides consistent financial and material support to well over 50 households.

"She also founded the Sharing Ministry some 43 years ago, initiating an effort to collect food for the needy with the formation of an outreach group to take on this task, the Sharing Ministry.

"OLPH began providing food support to four inner-city parishes which, over time, established food pantries. What started out as a once-a-month food collection at church has grown into a weekly

delivery effort which includes food, clothing, hygiene items, diapers, school supplies, sleeping bags, laundry detergent and much, much more. OLPH continues to support these four innercity parish pantries and additionally provide consistent support to ten additional institutions. Tens of thousands of people are touched by the efforts of this ministry on an annual basis. All of this is done under the direction of Sr. Paulanne.

"It is said that a Nun is symbolically married to our Lord Jesus Christ. She has shown herself to be a most loving and faithful spouse in service to His Church. She has touched the lives of generations of students at the OLPH school as well as parishioners, priests,

deacons, seminarians and families, not only locally, but in the inner city as well. Because of all this and more, it is my honor, on behalf of my Brother Knights, and fellow Parishioners, to present this amazing lady a certificate of appreciation for her lifetime of dedication and service!"





Chicago-based Catholic Extension Society works in solidarity with people in America's poorest regions to build up vibrant and transformative Catholic faith communities. We have a strong partnership with Catholic faith communities to strengthen the presence of the Church and provide resources to develop ministries, leaders, and facilities, and assist in recovery efforts where needed.

Meet Fr. Carlos Collazo from Puerto Rico, who will be speaking at the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday, March 15th and 9:00, 10:30, and 12:00 Masses on Sunday, March 16th. Over the last seven years, Puerto Rico has endured immense challenges, including Hurricane Maria, devastating earthquakes, and

Hurricane Fiona. These natural disasters have left an estimated 1,000 Catholic churches and schools damaged or in ruins. With your help, we can restore these cherished mission churches and bring hope back to the island's communities, like Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Puerto Rico.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in the Diocese of Ponce, Puerto Rico is a great example of a Catholic community helping their neighbors. Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish is in one of the poorest areas of Salinas, Puerto Rico. Most struggle to survive, with more than half the population living below the poverty line and with a household income of just \$16,000. A major part of the community is composed of senior citizens, but they are also blessed to have a growing community of children and youth. These are joyful young people who have initiative, leadership, and a great spirit of teamwork. The parish is fortunate to have an active youth base who are altar servers, engaged in religious education and service to the community.

The Catholic Church in Puerto Rico serves not only as a place of worship but also as a vital community center that fosters social, educational, and charitable initiatives. Beyond religious services, many churches provide essential resources such as food pantries, basic necessities, educational programs, counseling services, and shelters for those in need. They act as gathering spaces where people come together for cultural events, youth activities, and support groups, strengthening the bonds of the community. In times of crisis, such as after Hurricane Maria, churches played a crucial role in relief efforts, distributing aid, offering refuge, and providing spiritual and emotional support. Their role extends beyond faith, making



them integral to the social fabric of Puerto Rican society. Everyone in the community works for and contributes to the church's needs, but additional support is critical and necessary.





What is the OLPH Parish Pastoral Council?

The OLPH Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is an advisory body that supports the Church's concept of shared responsibility among laity, religious, and clergy. The PPC is made up of 15-16 parishioners and our pastor, **Fr. Jerry Boland**. Its purpose is to:

- Listen to, identify, and examine the needs, ideas, and hopes of our faith community.
- Engage with the 60+ OLPH ministries to understand and affirm their work and help them address their needs and challenges.
- Create a "culture of involvement" within the parish that welcomes and embraces others and encourages the development of leaders across the parish.
- Help envision, shape, and implement the future goals of our parish and monitor our ongoing success as we strive to fulfill the Church's teachings.

The PPC meets throughout the year on the 3rd Monday of every month. Meetings follow an established agenda defined in advance based on input from Fr. Boland and PPC members. Members also organize and plan an annual gathering of inspiration and prayer every fall, as well as the Ministry Appreciation Mass and Dinner Reception every winter.

PPC members serve a 3-year term beginning each July.



Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. All Catholics age 14 and fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.


