Dear Parishioners,

"This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

This weekend's Gospel tells the story of the Transfiguration. This moment when Jesus' glory is revealed, and he is joined by two of Israel's most cherished people, Moses and Elijah.

So taken by the moment. Peter wants to hold onto it as long as he can, offering to erect tents so they can stay. But like so much in life, we are given glimpses of glory with the promise that one day in eternity we will know it all. In its fulfillment.

In the first reading the Lord God makes a covenant with Abraham and he gets a glimpse of the Promised Land. In Paul's Letter to the Philippians, we are told that ultimately our earthly bodies will conform to the glorified Christ.

We are filled with the promises of the possible when we anchor our faith in Jesus Christ. Our Lenten journey can be grounded in this sense that anything is possible with Jesus Christ. Remarkable things can happen if we embrace the invitation in the Gospel, "listen to him."

Lent invites us to prayer. Prayer can become the way we fine tune our spiritual "listening" skills. To listen we must be quiet; we must create in our heart a fertile place where the Word of God can take root. Lent invites us to rid ourselves of those obstacles that keep us from genuinely listening to God's Word.

Another pillar of our Lenten discipline is almsgiving. An ancient tradition that goes back to our Jewish roots. Almsgiving is an invitation to give of our treasure and our time to those who are in need. In this selfless giving we are encouraged to look beyond our own needs and open our hearts to the needs of others. Lent is the time of performing acts of charity and sacrifice.

As a parish we are teaming up again with Catholic Extension to pray for and support the parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Salinas, Puerto Rico, which is in the Diocese of Ponce.

We are delighted to welcome **Fr. Carlos Collazo** who will be speaking at all the masses and visiting with children from the school and Religious Education. He has served at OLPH, Puerto Rico. I have met him on mission trips sponsored by Catholic Extension and admire his energy, faith, and commitment. Salinas has significant challenges related to poverty and has had to face the worst of recent earthquakes and hurricanes. The church has been a major part of the restoration process. Thank you for your consideration of supporting our "sister" parish. We are both graced by the intercession of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

Last weekend was a whirlwind! The Men's Club St. Patrick's Party was terrific. Roundball got off to a fantastic start. These games are phenomenal. **Mike Haley** organized an event with over fifty of our students called Blessings in a Backpack. They put together 750 healthy lunches for children. They also participated in a conversation about hunger in our urban community. I am so proud of them. We had several students assist Guild One assemble the cartons of products for the Dignity Drive. They did a wonderful job!

This Sunday, March 16, **Russell Stern** has planned a concert, "Pilgrims of Hope". The concert is a celebration of the Jubilee Year and the fact that our parish has been designated a pilgrimage site.

We have two events that are coming up that could be of great possibility for your Lenten Journey. We have a wonderful Lenten Mission on Saturday, March 22, in the morning. There is information in the Bulletin. On Saturday, March 29, we have a Men's Day of Reflection with a terrific list of speakers in the Playdium.

Together, this Lenten Season, may we "listen to him."

Chicago-based Catholic Extension Society works in solidarity with people in America's poorest regions to build up vibrant and transformative Catholic faith communities. We have a strong partnership with Catholic faith communities to strengthen the presence of the Church and provide resources to develop ministries, leaders, and facilities, and assist in recovery efforts where needed.

Meet Fr. Carlos Collazo from Puerto Rico, who will be speaking at the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday, March 15th and 9:00, 10:30, and 12:00 Masses on Sunday, March 16th. Over the last seven years, Puerto Rico has endured immense challenges, including Hurricane Maria, devastating earthquakes, and

Hurricane Fiona. These natural disasters have left an estimated 1,000 Catholic churches and schools damaged or in ruins. With your help, we can restore these cherished mission churches and bring hope back to the island's communities, like Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Puerto Rico.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in the Diocese of Ponce, Puerto Rico is a great example of a Catholic community helping their neighbors. Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish is in one of the poorest areas of Salinas, Puerto Rico. Most struggle to survive, with more than half the population living below the poverty line and with a household income of just \$16,000. A major part of the community is composed of senior citizens, but they are also blessed to have a growing community of children and youth. These are joyful young people who have initiative, leadership, and a great spirit of teamwork. The parish is fortunate to have an active youth base who are altar servers, engaged in religious education and service to the community.



The Catholic Church in Puerto Rico serves not only as a place of worship but also as a vital community center that fosters social, educational, and charitable initiatives. Beyond religious services, many churches provide essential resources such as food pantries, basic necessities, educational programs, counseling services, and shelters for those in need. They act as gathering spaces where people come together for cultural events, youth activities, and support groups, strengthening the bonds of the community. In times of crisis, such as after Hurricane Maria, churches played a crucial role in relief efforts, distributing aid, offering refuge, and providing spiritual and emotional support. Their role extends beyond faith, making them integral to the social fabric of Puerto Rican society. Everyone in the community works for and contributes to the church's needs, but additional support is critical and necessary.

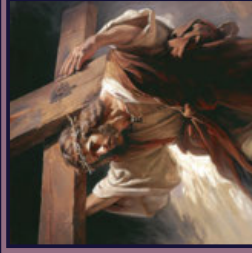

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance, puts us face to face with the mercy and forgiveness of Christ. Each Saturday afternoon, a priest is available in church to hear confessions.

Fasting

The Church requires all those between 18 and 59 years of age to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. All Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent.

Almsgiving
