

#### seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"If you do not repent, you will all perish."

"Repent and believe the Good News", is one of the options that can be said when a person is being signed with ashes. The season of Lent is a clarion call to conversion, to engage in a process of purification.

We are all sinners! We all need

the Lord's healing and merciful love. The pattern of some sin can run deep. Some habitual sins are complicated and may be the source of lifelong struggles. No matter how entrenched some behaviors and attitudes might

be, the Lord is always close at hand, inviting us to his love.

Lent invites us to deliberately reflect on where the sources of sin can be found in our lives. There can be the memory of people who have hurt us, circumstances that were not fair, poor choices of long ago that still have a hold on us.

With Christ's love we can let go, move on, and be healed. The Lord rejoices when we choose good over evil. There are so many voices that bring the best or the worst out of us. The Lord calls us to repent. Once we have named the sin in our life, we can feel a

power over it. The Lord is unconditionally there for us! He calls us to a life filled with abundant grace, but we must receive him in our heart through prayer.

In my former parish, Holy Family on Roosevelt Road there is a magnificent stained-glass window of the parable of the Prodigal Son. While the window is beautiful, I love that it is over a door leading into the church. The Lord is always there, seeking, yearning to welcome us back. All of us that enter the doors of a church are sinners, on the road to repentance and forgiveness.

I hope that we all will find time this Lent to seek repentance through prayer, making amends, celebrating the sacrament of confession.

I recently celebrated the sacrament with our second graders for their first time. One little guy after receiving absolution said to me, "Father, I feel better already!" I was so moved by his genuine feeling that he was blest and forgiven by the Lord.

We celebrate the sacrament every Saturday from 4:00 – 5:00pm. We have scheduled our annual Communal Penance service on April 1 at St. Catherine Labouré at 7:00pm.

Confession will be available at the Men's Day of Reflection on March 29. If those times do not work, do not hesitate to call the parish office and schedule a time with one of the priests.



We recently asked several members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to share their experience on the board. Here are the responses from PPC Board Member Cindy Rourke:

How and when did you and your family join OLPH?

My husband, Mike, and I joined OLPH as newlyweds in 1993 when we moved to Glenview. All three of

our children were baptized, celebrated their first communion, and were confirmed at OL, and our daughter, Katie, was married at the church in the fall.

When did you first hear about the PPC?

I first heard about the Parish Pastoral Council after 6:30am Mass when John Simons asked if I had ever thought about joining PPC. I responded that since I wasn't familiar with it, I hadn't. John explained that the council members meet with Father Jerry once a month to share updates and offer feedback about what's happening in the parish.

#### What does the PPC do?

One of the roles of a PPC member is to act as a liaison to parish ministries. PPC members are assigned to different ministries so we can report back to the group about what is going on in our large, active parish community.

It's been interesting to hear perspectives from members at various stages of life who look to the church to address different things. I'm amazed at what a great job is done at our parish to meet the needs of all parishioners. I have also enjoyed seeing and hearing first hand all the work that goes into keeping OLPH such a vibrant parish.

#### Is there an aspect of the PPC that you enjoy the most?

My favorite part of being a member of the Parish Pastoral Council has been getting to know the other members, as well as meeting more parishioners as a result of my involvement. We have amazing, faith-filled men and women of all ages in our parish!

We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. Because, by your Holy Cross, you have redeemed the world.

We had a wonderful turnout for the Taizé Stations of the Cross on Friday, March 14. We even had visitors from other parishes given our status as a pilgrimage site for the Jubilee. This was the first time OLPH has offered Friday Night Stations with Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the sanctuary. The candlelit altar steps, purple-draped crucifix, and fragrant incense contributed to a dramatic Lenten setting for worshipping Jesus in the monstrance, all created by the Arts & Environment Ministry. The Way Ministry led St. Alphonsus Ligouri's Way of the Cross with alternating choral and instrumental hymns and periods of silence for contemplation of Jesus' Passion. Our visitors said they were overwhelmed by the reverence shown to Jesus, the prayerful meditations, and the beauty of our church. Parishioners said the evening changed the way they experience the Way of the Cross. We hope to make this a part of Lent at OLPH every year.

From the moment of our birth.


