

Dear Parishioners,

"I was blind but now I see."

This weekend's Gospel from John is one of my favorite Lenten gospels. Lent is the season of identifying those forces that keep us spiritually blind. There are many things that can keep us from seeing both that which is good and that which is evil. For instance, we as a society have

become much less sensitive to the specter of violence. It must be really horrific to make the evening news.

The Lord seeks to lift our blindness. The blindness that keeps us from seeing the good in others, the blindness that keeps us from responding to those in need, the blindness that keeps us from changing.

The man born blind had is eyes opened by the Lord. Lent is the season where we are invited to allow the Lord to open our eyes. Not only is his physical blindness lifted, but he also came to see the Lord and worship him.

Last week's Lenten mission was for me such a powerful testimony to the power of Our Lord's presence in our lives especially when we are confronted with a crisis. I would really encourage you to view it on our website. It was deeply moving as the panelists shared moments in their life when Jesus was their strength, their song, their salvation.

One of the great graces of the Lenten journey is the grace to see more clearly the Lord at work in our lives and in the larger world. I can more readily notice the Lord's marvelous power from a beautiful sunset to an unexpected act of kindness, to the healing of a relationship.

Lent always begins in winter and ends in spring. Even the name Lent comes from an old English word, "lencten" meaning the lengthening of the day as spring approaches. We are blessed with more and more daylight until we embrace the rising of the sun on Easter morning. Jesus is the Light of the World!

Hopefully our spiritual vision will be liberated from the darkness of evil, of sin, of indifference.

Saturday, March 29 will be our highly anticipated St. Joseph's Men's Day of Reflection. There is quite a lineup of great speakers, time for confession, adoration and Eucharist. All men from age 13 and up are invited. It could be a great Father/Son experience. All ages are

welcome. I am so grateful to **Bill Harlan**, **Rick Schultz** and their steering committee for the hours of work that has gone into planning this event. This has been a dream of Bill Harlan's for many years.

Tuesday, April 1 will be our Annual Communal Penance Service at St. Catherine Labouré beginning at 7:00pm.

Last weekend I announced the public launch of our capital campaign "Generation to Generation: Answer the Call." We have an ambitious goal of 6 million dollars, and we are within striking distance of being halfway to our goal. The more of us that are invested in this campaign, the more power it will have in deepening our bond to OLPH and its future.

This is a program I would 100 percent recommend to anyone who needs that smaller and more supportive faith Community!





Kevin Ryan

We recently asked several members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to share their experience on the board. Here are the responses from PPC Board Member Kevin Ryan:

How and when did you and your family join OLPH?

I was raised in Glenview and attended both OLPH and public schools. My own family joined OLPH in 2003 after returning to Glenview when our twins were born. We have three kids, all now attending college.

When did you first hear about the PPC?

I first heard about the PPC probably 15 years ago but having young kids - I never thought much about it. Then two friends, Julie Ruchniewicz and Mark Cullum, both served terms as President and raved about their experiences. Mark encouraged me to apply a few times and last year I finally did.

What does the PPC do?

The PPC tries to help Father Boland in any way we can. With 15 members we can really be more eyes and ears in the parish for him. We listen to and encourage the various ministries we all work with and try to develop a robust culture of involvement in parish life.

Is there an aspect of the PPC that you enjoy the most?

The aspect of the PPC I've enjoyed most is meeting new people from various generations. We have grandparents who have been in the parish for 50 years and members with school age kids. Everyone brings a nice mix of experience.

How would you describe PPC meetings?

Monthly meetings follow an agenda depending on various issues and the calendar and move at a lively pace. We generally wrap up in 90 minutes or so but have several dinners throughout the year that are a lot of fun.

What should OLPH parishioners know about the PPC?

Anyone interested in PPC should not be scared of the time commitment. I held off for years thinking I was too busy to make it work. I wish I had joined sooner.

GENERATION TO GENERATION ANSWER THE CALL: SUPPORT OUR PRIESTS

Last week at OLPH, Fr. Jerry announced the Archdiocese of Chicago's *Generation to Generation* capital campaign, aimed at raising funds for four key initiatives. One of the main goals is to raise \$100 million to support our priests. This support will be directed to the following critical investments:

- Seminarian Education: The archdiocese sponsors the tuition for our Chicago seminarians, and this fund will help us educate and form our next generation of parish priests.
- Priest Pastoral and Professional
 Development: Support will include coaching
 and mentoring priests through individualized
 formation and trainings on team leadership,
 foundational preaching, and shared ownership
 for parish renewal.
- Caring for the Health and Well-Being of Our Priests: In addition to the healthcare provided by the archdiocese, significant funds will be required to support our priests to ensure they can enjoy a dignified and healthy retirement.
