

Dear Parishioners,

"We have seen the Lord!"

This proclamation taken from the Gospel this weekend sums up the glorious message of the Easter Season. Each weekend we will hear accounts from the scriptures of those first witnesses to the Risen Christ. Again and again, we will feel the joy and drama that surrounded those first appearances of Our Lord.

We can get the impression that the recognition of Our Lord's Resurrection and the implications of it were quickly grasped by those first-century believers. The fact is that it

took many years for people to wrap their heads around the reality that Jesus had risen. It would be a long period of theological reflection to distinguish the difference between resurrection and resuscitation as was the case with Lazarus. Jesus would die no more and live in eternity. The various accounts of these first encounters were in the category, he looks the same to me or I did not realize he was with us as was the case of the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus that we heard recounted this weekend.

Our spiritual journeys are centered on encounters with the Risen Lord. Sometimes His presence is obvious and evident, other times we may lament, where is He?

How does our sense of being baptized in the life-giving waters and anointed with the oil of chrism change us?

The Easter Season will conclude with the celebration of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. Between then and now we have a lot to do. We will grow together in our love of the Lord and the proclamation of the Good News!

We have some new initiatives that I am very excited about. **Margie André** has been collaborating with a team of parishioners to launch a program called *Alpha*. It is a gathering where people come to discuss and explore issues related to their spiritual life. It will be gatherings where folks participate in conversations that give them the opportunity to reflect on how the Lord is directing their lives. You could be a cradle Catholic or someone who was not raised in a church-going family. Everyone

> is welcome, more information on this will be shared in the coming months as we look forward to next Fall.

> Our current capital campaign, "Generation to Generation: Answer the Call" moves into high gear. We are hoping to raise six million dollars to invest in the future of OLPH and the Church of Chicago. In the coming weeks you will be hearing more about this. I hope everyone in the parish will discern to what degree they can support our campaign.

All week I have been in the "afterglow" of our Holy Week and Easter celebrations. I am grateful beyond words to the legions of people who played an important role in this propound season of recalling our biblical and liturgical roots.

I am often struck by people's witnesses to Christ's presence in their lives. From its earliest expression Jesus saw the believers as living in community, "where two or three are gathered, I am in their midst." He sees us as moving forward in faith as a community.

The Easter Season is all about the formation of the community of believers. Lent was the season of personal transformation; the Easter Season is about our transformation together as a community. How do we witness together the transforming love of Jesus Christ?

Coming up on June 7, we will be celebrating **Fr. Patrick's** and **Fr. Larry's** appointments as future pastors. More info to follow.

What is special about Divine Mercy Sunday?



In 1931, Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, reported visions and visitations from Jesus and conversations with him. He asked her to paint the vision of his merciful divinity being poured from his Sacred Heart and specifically asked for a Feast of Divine Mercy to be established on the first Sunday after Easter Sunday, so that

St. Faustina

mankind would take refuge in him

Jesus spoke these words to St. Faustina:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners.

On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. (Diary, 699)

On April 30, 2000, then-Pope John Paul II declared the second Sunday in the Easter season to be Divine Mercy Sunday. On the same day, he canonized Maria Faustina Kowalska as St. Faustina.

SPRED has been an important part of our family for the last 23 years! My husband volunteered as a Catechist for 6 years. When he stopped I started up and am still volunteering. When we were blessed with our son JC, who has Down Syndrome, 25 years ago we knew he would also be part of SPRED. When JC turned 6 we enrolled him in the program at OLPH. When he aged out of OLPH at age 11 he went to the SPRED program at St Norberts. At the age of 16 he went to the program at St Catherine's until he turned 22. He then went back to St Norbert's for their 22 and up SPRED program (St Norbert's has two programs). Our family has experienced all three SPRED roles, Catechist, Friend and Parent!

My husband and I feel it's been so rewarding and a privilege to be Catechists and help our Friends in SPRED learn about Jesus and their religion. These children have the purest of hearts. SPRED is a unique religious education program. The SPRED model allows our Friends to experience Jesus in a simple concrete way. I truly believe God sends people with disabilities to us to teach us valuable lessons, so to be able to help them learn about Jesus is very special. Our son JC has learned so much during his years at SPRED. He has also created great friendships with his Catechists. To this day he still goes out with Madelyn, his Catechist from St Catherine's. My other two sons have participated in the SPRED Masses and always enjoy attending them.

If you have a child with a disability I can tell you first hand as a Parent and a Catechist the SPRED program will give your loved one an environment where they will grow in their understanding of Jesus and their Faith!




