

Dear Parishioners,

"Take away the stone."

Within walking distance from the old city of Jerusalem is the town of Al Eizariya, which means the Place of Lazarus. It is the site of the Gospel story we hear this weekend, the raising of Lazares. It has become a symbol of the intense source of suffering between Israelis and Palestinians.

Now there is a large wall and check points that restrict access because the town of Al Eizariya is in a Palestinian territory. One must now take a bus which can be a target for protests. Close to The Church of Lazarus is the place tradition holds is Lazarus' tomb.

One goes down a dramatically steep staircase that leads to a deep subterranean cavity where the tomb is. I laughed to myself when I first visited this place that the greater miracle, apart from Lazarus being called to life was how he got up those flight of stairs wrapped in the burial linens.

I would really encourage you to read **Fr. Jim Martin SJ's** book, "Called Forth," which is a remarkable meditation on this event. In the opinion of many, Our Lord's greatest miracle.

Jesus commands those present to "take away the stone" that seals the tomb. Onlookers were concerned that the stench of a body buried days ago might be overwhelming. As Lazarus comes forth, he leaves death behind to embrace life.

Fr. Martin has led many pilgrimages to the tomb of Lazarus, as he guides people down the staircase, he invites them to ponder what would they like to leave behind as they climb out of the tomb and get back into life?

Lent is in many ways a journey of determining what I need to leave behind to move forward. Some of those memories, choices, realities have a "stench" to them. This image of leaving behind the forces of sin and darkness to embrace the light of Jesus' healing love is the gift of Easter. It is a blessing to me as I ponder the raising of Lazares.

There is still time to leave behind sin and embrace life!

It is with tremendous joy and pride that I share the news that our two outstanding associates have been named

administrators. It is a great credit to both of them that they received such confidence from the Cardinal and his advisors to be enthusiastically recommended to the office of administrator. They will formally become pastors next year.



Lenten Food Drive


Please consider more frequent donations of non-perishable food during this, the season of almsgiving. Hunger is a daily struggle for so many and you *can* make a difference!

We recently asked several members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to share their experience on the board. Here are the responses from PPC Board Member **Bridget Baumstark**:

How and when did you and your family join OLPH?

My husband and I joined OLPH parish in 2001, shortly before the birth of our first child, when we moved from the city to Glenview. My family had had an association with the parish prior to that, and we were married at OLPH in 1997. Our children went through OLPH's Religious Education program and have received all of their sacraments at OLPH.

When did you first hear about the PPC?

I first heard about the PPC by seeing testimonials (like this one!) in the Bulletin, and I thought my background with HR and Finance might be of value to the Council.

Is there an aspect of the PPC that you enjoy the most?

I see the role of the PPC as helping **Father Boland** with anything related to parish life. That's what I enjoy most about the PPC - providing support and counsel to Father Boland. Prior to joining the Council, I had no idea how large and complex the parish is, and how much Father Boland relies on advisors such as the PPC to lead the parish.

How would you describe PPC meetings?

Our meetings are collaborative, with everyone working together in a healthy and supportive way.

What should OLPH parishioners know about the PPC?

Parishioners should know that joining the PPC can be a very enriching way to give back to OLPH, lending their experience and wisdom while receiving the satisfaction of knowing that they are making a difference.




Youth Ministry spent Saturday March 15th in retreat, deepening their understanding of our Lenten theme,


