
Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Dear Parishioners,

"Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

I have found great meaning in the opening hymn to our Lenten liturgies this year, "Lead Me to the Cross." Each year in the heart of winter, Lent leads us on a journey that leads us to the cross and eventually to the empty tomb.

As Lent progresses, as a priest I feel the cumulative power of the Lenten pilgrimage. I hear it in the tenor of confessions, I see it in the generosity of people, I see it in the efforts to deepen one's spiritual life. Lent is not easy, but if we open ourselves to the power of its invitation, we will be led to the cross, we see in the cross, our Lord's redemptive love for us.

Lent is, in a sense, an encounter with some of the crosses we bear. For some of us it is declining health, for others troubled relationships, for others, regret over poor choices. We have been let down by others, we have had to deal with complicated situations we had no control over, we have had to deal with disappointments. Through it all, we have not been abandoned by the Lord, but we discover he has been accompanying us. He helps us shoulder the crosses we have had to carry.

In honor of the Holy Year, there is a marvelous exhibition in Rome featuring paintings of the Greek master, El Greco. These are paintings by El Greco that are in the possession of parish churches. One of my favorites is El Greco's Cristo abbracciato alla Croce, "Christ carries his cross." It captures Jesus in a moment of reflection as he continues his journey to Calvary. (See Bulletin cover.)

There is a tenderness to the painting which acknowledges Our Lord's anxiety but his resolve to fulfill salvation history by his passion, death, and resurrection. Despite the brutal agony he has been subjected to, his face is not downcast, but he looks upward, in a heavenly gaze. I think of all the people in my life who have had to carry heavy crosses, but do so with such courage and faith.

Palm Sunday is one of the most dramatic liturgies of the year. We begin with Our Lord's triumphal entrance into Jerusalem being adored by the crowds and we end with the Proclamation of the Passion and the Lord's body being laid in a borrowed tomb.

I pray this Holy Week will be abundant in its graces for you! Please consider attending our liturgical celebrations of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter. These liturgies are so powerful!

Please check the bulletin for the schedule of many services to be conducted this week. The Church is open everyday for a visit. If you would like your confession heard, please call the parish office and ask for one of the priests.

We are honored to welcome the Dussman Council of the Knights of Columbus for the New Member ceremony this Sunday afternoon. Also Sunday evening, Youth Ministry will have a viewing and a discussion of the "Passion of the Christ."

Last week we had a wonderful celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation of our Religious Education 8th graders. I was so proud of them. The presiding bishop was our new Vicar, Bishop Timothy O'Malley, his first of what I hope will be many visits to OLPH. Thank you to Erin Bretts, our DRE, the catechists, and the sponsors for their great commitment to our students.

This week we welcome our new Director of Facilities Tito Diaz. He comes to us with a wealth of experience of managing schools and multi-building campuses. He has a wonderful way about him and I am sure he will continue the great tradition here of maintaining and enhancing our beautiful campus. Welcome Tito!

On Holy Thursday, after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, there is a very beautiful and ancient tradition of visiting seven churches. Each Church will have an Altar of Repose of the Blessed Sacrament, so while the rest of the world goes to sleep, Catholic pilgrims will be traveling late into the night keeping Jesus company on the eve of his Crucifixion. This is a time for intense prayer and devotion in the presence of the Most Holy Sacrament as we enter into the holiest days. Visiting the altar of Repose in seven churches stems from pilgrims visiting the seven churches of Rome as a form of penance.







Holy Saturday Blessing of Easter Foods

On Holy Saturday, April 19, 11:30am we invite you to join in Swieconka, the Slavic Easter celebration. In this service, foods traditionally eaten for breakfast on Easter Sunday are blessed.

Choose your favorite basket to fill with:

Eggs - a symbol of new life and the resurrected Christ

Ham - an acknowledgement of the New Law, putting aside the Old Law which forbade the eating of pork

Lamb - made of butter or cake dough, symbolizing Christ as the Sacrificial Lamb

Horseradish - a reminder of Christ's suffering and the bitter herbs offered Him on the cross

Salt - symbolizing wisdom needed in our daily lives

Bread - the essence of nourishment for our bodies and the appearance under which Christ is present



What is the OLPH Parish Pastoral Council?

The OLPH Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is an advisory body that supports the Church's concept of shared responsibility among laity, religious, and clergy. The PPC is made up of 15-16 parishioners and our pastor, **Fr. Jerry Boland**. Its purpose is to:

- Listen to, identify, and examine the needs, ideas, and hopes of our faith community.
- Engage with the 60+ OLPH ministries to understand and affirm their work and help them address their needs and challenges.
- Create a "culture of involvement" within the parish that welcomes and embraces others and encourages the
 development of leaders across the parish.
- Help envision, shape, and implement the future goals of our parish and monitor our ongoing success as we strive to fulfill the Church's teachings.

The PPC meets throughout the year on the 3rd Monday of every month. Meetings follow an established agenda defined in advance based on input from Fr. Boland and PPC members. Members also organize and plan an annual gathering of inspiration and prayer every fall, as well as the Ministry Appreciation Mass and Dinner Reception every winter.

PPC members serve a 3-year term beginning each July.


