Jesus left death behind and embraced life. As his disciples, we must leave sin and death behind to embrace the eternal life the Lord invites us to share.



For more than a thousand years, the Church has sung five words that capture the message of Easter: *Christ our hope has risen.*

This simple phrase powerfully expresses the conviction that our hope is the very person of the Risen Christ. He not only rose from the dead two-thousand years ago but is present and active in our world today. What is special about Divine Mercy Sunday?

In 1931, **Maria Faustina Kowalska**, a Polish nun, reported visions and visitations from Jesus and conversations with him. He asked her to paint the vision of his mercy pouring from his Sacred Heart and specifically asked for a feast of Divine Mercy to be established on the first Sunday after Easter Sunday, so that mankind would take refuge in him.

Jesus spoke these words to St. Faustina:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." (Diary, 699)

In April 30, 2000, then-**Pope John Paul II** declared that the second Sunday in the Easter season, already referred to as Divine Mercy Sunday, is to be understood and acknowledged by the faithful as a day of complete mercy. On the same day, he canonized Maria Faustina Kowalska as St. Faustina.

As a sensory learner myself, I am drawn into a SPRED Mass because of the simplicity and joy of the liturgy: the music, the gestures, the movement, the intentional setting of Our Lord's table.

The three sentence Homily repeated to every section of the church speaks to my heart, as it often distills the scripture down to this:

I am a beloved child of God, my life has purpose and meaning, and I am to love others.

A SPRED Mass reminds its larger community of the essentials of Catholicism.

A healthy SPRED community does not rely on one or two people. There is one friend for every student. The friend does not need to know anything about disability or theology, just a willingness to know that they themselves are a beloved child of God, their lives have purpose and meaning, and they are to love others. What a beautiful job description!

The impact of having SPRED as a visible part of the parish community is to remind that community that the life of a Catholic is not really all that

complicated, as SPRED calls us to keep Christ's message in action focused and clear: To receive God's love. To rejoice in God's love. To trust in God's love. And to share God's love with others."

St. Joseph Men's Day of Reflection

On Saturday, March 29, 136 men of all ages gathered for the inaugural St. Joseph Men's Day of Reflection, hosted by OLPH.

Keynote speaker and former NHL player John Scott spoke of his respect for the leadership of Blackhawk teammate Jonathan Toews and of the profound impact his wife's strong faith had in leading him to Catholicism. Fr. James Wallace invoked the Gospel parable of the talents to encourage men to make the most of their gifts through selfless mentorship of others. Seminarian Charlie Leidel talked about his journey of discernment that set him on a path to become a diocesan priest.

A multi-generational panel featuring Gavin King, Leo Milano, Pat Collins, Dave Ludden, and John Clifford shared diverse perspectives on men and faith in today's world. Fr. Burke Masters described six ways in which men might become better disciples of Christ. He also introduced the afternoon's Eucharistic Adoration service and noted its potential to help us become more Christlike. After Eucharistic Adoration, which included a communal Rosary and Reconciliation, the day concluded with Mass celebrated by Fr. Jerry Boland.






