Dear Parishioners,

"The Lord stood by me and gave me strength."

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, the apostles. I have been to Rome on this Feast Day, and it is like our celebration of July Fourth. There are parades, picnics, fireworks and of course the Mass at St. Peter's Basilica. This feast is the celebration of the birth of Christian Rome.

St. Peter and St. Paul loom large in the history and culture of Rome. At the base of the dome of St Peter's are the words in Latin, *"Tu es Petrus, you are Peter and upon this rock I will build my Church."* The Basilica of St. Paul outside the walls is where St. Paul is buried. It is a bit outside the historic center and many pilgrims never get there during their visit to Rome. It is a magnificent place.

In most churches in Rome, Peter and Paul figure prominently; Paul always is carrying a sword and Peter the keys. Peter and Paul had their differences, but they always worked things out and the Church benefited by their collegial relationship. This was no more evident than at the Council of Jerusalem where the apostles concluded that Gentiles could become Christian.

Another highlight of this Feast Day is the tradition of the imposition of the Palliums on the new archbishops of the world. The pallium is a wool band the archbishop wears around his neck which indicates the special relationship Archbishops have with the Holy Father, the chief shepherd of the Church. The wool bands are woven from sheep that are raised in the monastery where St. Paul was martyred.

This will be **Pope Leo's** first celebration of this Mass. It is very special that three Chicago priests will be receiving palliums because they have recently been appointed archbishops, Archbishop **Jeff Grob** of Milwaukee, Archbishop **Bob Casey** of Cincinnati, and Archbishop **Michael McGovern** of Omaha will receive their palliums. Chicago rocks! What a significant influence of Chicago priests at this liturgy including the Pope himself. I am so proud to be a Chicago priest.

This feast day is also the anniversary of **Father Larry Basbas'** priesthood anniversary, his fifth. Usually, ordinations are in May but because of Covid his ordination was delayed. I will never forget **Cardinal Cupich** as he was about ordain Larry and his classmates said that he had never ordained masked men before!

Transitions are happening here as this is moving out week for Fr. Larry and **Fr. Patrick Kizza** and moving in time for **Fr. Honoratus Mwageni** and **Fr. Roy Belocura**.

We also are saying goodbye to **Sr. Anna Thottunkal** who has served as our social worker for the Sr. Paulanne Needy Family Fund. Sr. Anna is returning to India. She has been a great resource here and we will miss her.

Thanks again for your generous consideration of the capital campaign, *"Generation to Generation: Answer the Call."* We have reached the 6.5 million-dollar mark, which is awesome. We are still accepting pledges and would love to expand the base of parishioners who have supported the campaign. Additional resources will safeguard projects considering inflation and possible tariffs. We might also be able to expand the Rectory garage to accommodate **Sr. Paulanne's** car and to replace the heating pipes that service the Church.

There was a funeral this week for **Sr. Rosemary Connolly** of Misericordia. She was the administrator there for 59 years. Her funeral was a powerful celebration of her remarkable life. What a legacy she leaves in her passionate advocacy of those who live with developmental disabilities. We are a better Church because of her! We will never know how many people were touched by her compassion and care. No one was a better example of what it means to be pro-life. May she rest in peace. Her sister **Kathryn** is a parishioner here and I extend our heartfelt sympathies to her.

Next Sunday the 9:30am family Mass returns! Until McDonnell Hall reopens, come rain or shine, the Mass will be celebrated under the tent on the Rectory lawn. It will be great to see all the kids again!

No better way to celebrate the Fourth than to have a "fully loaded" hot dog and fries from Spiro's on Waukegan Road!

My dearly beloved parish family of OLPH:

Hard to believe that five years have passed since I was first ordained a priest on June 29, the Feast of Saints Peter & Paul. My arrival at OLPH in July of 2020, right in the thick of a global pandemic, feels both like yesterday and a lifetime ago. There were no packed churches, no receptions, no handshakes or hugs—just a quiet beginning for me as the world held its breath.

Ministry was distant, bizarre and often lonely. But when the world finally opened up again—what a gift it was to see your faces, hear your voices, and feel the warmth of real community. I was overwhelmed by the love, faith, kindness, and the generosity of heart that greeted me.

You welcomed me not just into your parish, but into your lives. And for that, I will always be deeply grateful. More than that, because of you, I've grown not only as a priest at the altar, but as a human being at heart. Through your joys and sorrows, your questions, challenges, and daily witness of faith, I've learned to love more deeply, listen more humbly, and grow in compassion and wisdom.

To **Sr. Paulanne**, whom I adore, you are a radiant spark of joy. I will miss our banter and our Monday dinners with you. You're a holy hoot and a half, and the Church is brighter because of you. Thank you.

Even as I say goodbye, I take heart knowing that I'm going from one Marian parish to another. Our Lady has always been close to me—and now, she gently leads me from OLPH to St. Mary / Mater Christi. Please keep me in your prayers, just as I will always carry you in mine. And if ever you find yourself in Riverside or North Riverside, come by—I'll put on a pot of coffee and we'll pick up right where we left off.

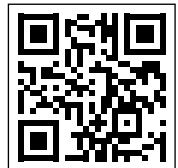
