Dear Parishioners,

"We are surrounded by a great crowd of witnesses."

There are many reasons that the Church has endured challenges over its 2000-year history. It is amazing what the church has faced. John McGreevy's work, "Catholicism", in which he chronicles the history of the Church the French Revolution, since makes one wonder just how the

church survived such dramatic social, cultural, and political divisions. Each generation has posed issues and changing circumstances that would have seemed insurmountable.

The main reason for the Church's endurance would be the Holy Spirit, which continues to guide and shape the mission.

Another major source of its perseverance and endurance has been the witness of faith by committed courageous and persuasive witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the Letter to the Hebrews proclaimed this weekend, we hear about the power of faith filled witness.

A few years ago, I participated in a pilgrimage to Greece and Türkiye in which we followed in the footsteps of St. Paul. The explosive growth of Christianity in the 2nd century has been a source of historical and religious research. By the 2nd century, all those who had known Jesus directly had died. The mission, the preaching, the liturgical life of the Church was now in the hands of a new generation whose faith relied solely on the testimony of those who were convinced of the power of the Good News. Their witness of faith was responded to by an avalanche of people who wanted to belong.

Rodney Stark's influential book, "The Rise of Christianity," attributes the rapid growth of the church to the compelling witness of the 2nd century believers. These first believers formed intense communities that witnessed to the Christian virtues of faith, hope, and love. Others saw the way the early Christians cared for each other and looked out for one another. The Christian lifestyle was a dramatic difference to the pagan cultures that were based on the survival of the fittest and little regard for the well being of others. Over the centuries we have been "surrounded by a great crowd of witnesses."

I am always struck how, in a parish, power of witness strengthens the bond of community and defines us as believers. There are tremendous graces that come from our dogmas, history, and tradition. Another compelling grace is looking around and seeing deeply committed believers in our midst. Just review the history of OLPH! We have been blessed by a legacy of faith that goes back to our founding in 1919. It is not just the voices of the past but the living witness of those here in the present, that challenge, comfort and encourage us so we can hand on our parish to future generations.

As we start a new program year with the beginning of efforts like the School, Religious Education, Youth Ministry and Scripture Study, to mention just a few, hearts will be touched, imaginations broadened, and faith deepened. We here at OL certainly have a "great crowd of witnesses" to spur us on.

I am very encouraged by the Teen Board that Erin Bretts is forming. This will be an opportunity for our high school students to gather and witness their faith and participate more significantly in our parish through service and leadership. We need their voices! They must have a place at the table where the needs and hopes of our parish are reflected upon. Please see page 4 of this Bulletin for more details.

The annual observance of the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation is quickly approaching. We have this wonderful tradition of gathering with the community of Sts. Peter and Paul Greek Orthodox Church to reflect on the blessed gift of creation and our responsibility to care for it. 


