Dear Parishioners,

"O Lord you have been our refuge."

This beautiful psalm is the responsorial for this weekend. It speaks to me in a special way because the Annual Block Party is the unofficial birthday of our parish. For many generations, Our Lady of Perpetual Help has been a refuge. A place where children have been educated and formed, young couples have been married, the

active formation of the adult community, our outreach to the world, a place we have worshipped God and a place where we found comfort when we were suffering or grieving.

It was a fateful day in October 1919 when **Cardinal Mundelein** appointed **Fr. Martin Schmidt** to found a parish at the corner of Church and Grove Streets in Glenview, Illinois. From a small farming community to a thriving suburban community, we have indeed found Our Lord as our refuge. Happy 106th Anniversary OLPH!

We enter the future empowered by encountering refuge of the Lord. We celebrate this anniversary aware of God's blessings. Nothing is perfect but we have much to celebrate as we reflect on our mission and our vitality.

Without your faithful and generous support, little could be accomplished. With your faith and the faith of those before us we move forward! Indeed, Our Lord has been our refuge.

We are still reeling from the tragedy at Annunciation School in Minneapolis. We must continue to hold in our prayers the victims who were murdered, the many who were injured and the long road ahead for those who have been traumatized by this senseless act of violence. As we pray, we must reflect on ways as a society we can provide more resources for those who struggle with mental health concerns. We must have the resolve to enact sensible gun safety laws. No one law or resource will end violence, but we must start somewhere.

I have been participating in several conversations with the staff to review our current protocols. We will never be 100% safe but certainly can become a safer place. One of our projects in the capital campaign, "Generation to Generation" is to invest in the safety infrastructure. We will be expediting these recommendations.

In the aftermath of September 11th, life changed here in this country as we all had to adapt to many safety procedures. How we boarded a plane, a train, entered certain buildings. We all had to concede some of our personal liberties for the greater good. The inconveniences have become part of living in society.

In the coming weeks we will be enacting some changes regarding access to our buildings and the way we enter and exit. We will soon be installing panic bars on all the Church doors. Some days with school and Religious Education we can have well over a thousand children on campus. We are going to be implementing some procedures to enhance a perimeter of safety for them.

I will keep you informed as these changes take effect. I will need your patience and support as we strive to make OLPH as safe as possible. We need to protect everyone, especially our children, who must deal with issues that would have been beyond my comprehension at their age. I am especially grateful to **Dr. Amy Mills** and **Erin Bretts** for their invaluable insights.

The Holy Father has pleaded that all Catholic communities assist the desperate situation in Gaza. The starvation and suffering of the Palestinians is beyond words. The Archdiocese has asked that a second collection be taken up at all the parishes for Catholic Relief Services that has become a vital partner in the humanitarian efforts to reach out to those afflicted. We will be contributing through our First Fruits program. If you would like to make an additional contribution, please write a check to the parish and put "Gaza Relief" on the memo line. Let us continue pray for end to this dreadful war.

The next semester of Scripture Study is around the corner. Our Scripture Study program has become the crown jewel of our efforts to better understand sacred scripture. This semester's theme is "The Gospel of Luke." There is still time to register. See the Bulletin for more information.

There was a beautiful celebration of **Sr. Joan's** life this past Thursday at the Motherhouse in Milwaukee. May she rest in peace!

We are still taking pledges to the capital campaign, "Generation to Generation". We are just shy of the 7.3-million-dollar mark! Thank you for your amazing sacrifices. About 4 million of the money pledged remains at OL.



The Adult Festival Choir

- We sing at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:00pm in the Church. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 9.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass throughout the year.
- All singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:30-9:00pm. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 9.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Sunday 5:00pm Mass and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students grade 7 through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearsals are in the church before the Mass at which they are singing, and sometimes on Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability).

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, either at the 9:00am or the 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearsals are in the church on Tuesdays, starting September 16, from 5:45-6:30pm


Cantors



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Daily, we hear heartbreaking stories of suffering from Gaza. So many innocent victims, including those who belong to Christian communities, face violence, dire living conditions, and hunger. Our Holy Father Pope Leo has said "Gaza is starving," as he called for a cease fire. In a particular way, the faces of Gaza's hungry children make an indelible impression on our hearts.

Perhaps we feel helpless to address this complex story that involves international players. There is, however, a pathway for us to respond. Two very reliable agencies of the Catholic Church are already there providing vital emergency humanitarian relief and medical and psychological care for the sick, malnourished, and wounded. They are the Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) and Catholic Relief Services (CRS).

On the weekend of September 6-7, the parishes of the Archdiocese of Chicago will take up a special collection that will be promptly forwarded to CNEWA and CRS.

Whatever you can give will go far to alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters in the Middle East. I know the compassion and generosity of the people of the Archdiocese of Chicago. In the name of all those who will benefit from your support, I thank you.

Finally, let us pray urgently for the gift of peace in our wounded world, a peace which only the Lord can give.


