Dear Parishioners,

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only son."

This quote from this weekend's gospel is often seen on posters at sports events, John 3:16. The Gospel reminds us that God the Father sent his only son into the world not to condemn the world but to love it.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast

of the Exaltation of the Cross. The Feast commemorates the finding of the true cross in Jerusalem by St. Helena of the Cross, the mother of the Emperor Constantine in the third century.

The image of the cross looms large in Christianity and has been the most public way Christians identify themselves and the places where they worship.

The cross reminds me of the suffering and passion the Lord endured on Calvary that led to his resurrection.

Our Lord was not exempt from suffering and the cross for many of us is a place we turn to as we encounter suffering.

Violence has plagued the human community, and in the course of a lifetime, we will all bear heavy crosses.

Considering the tragic shootings in Minneapolis, I have found myself so heart sick over the amount of gun violence that seems to be getting worse and worse. Mass shootings have become so common that it really must be bad to even make the news. There is a generation of young people that have been dubbed, "the mass shooting generation."

We just have been unable to come to consensus in our country with how to deal with it. Conversations on gun control often dissolve into a shouting match with no one listening. We have got to do something!

I have been engaged in many conversations on safety protocols for our campus. They are exhausting but so necessary. When we talk about public safety, we need to plan on how to deal with a tornado, a fire, a roof collapse, a train derailment.

Most protocols deal with what do we need to do in the case of an active shooter. If the church of the Annunciation did not have its doors locked the killer could have caused a massacre of catastrophic proportions.

When it comes to gun control, I have no problem with firearms used for hunting or people who use firearms for

legal recreational purposes. The gun owners, I know, take extreme precautions to ensure their safety and the safety of others.

What I do have a problem with are the accessibility of military grade, high powered assault weapons that use bullets designed to inflict as much damage as possible on a human person. Why on earth would any person need that kind of weapon. The ER doctor in Minneapolis said he can tell immediately what kind of bullet was used on victims of a gunshot. The survivability of a person wounded by these kinds of weapons is dismal.

Recent polls suggest that many Americans support universal background checks and assault weapon banns. Unfortunately, state and federal legislatures are plagued by elected representatives beholden to the gun lobby.

Pope Leo has declared gun violence a pandemic.

While I am on my soap box, we must expand, not defund, mental health resources. Many people who struggle with mental health issues pose no danger but there is a subset within a subset that do. We need to accompany all those who need support and medical attention.

Our country loves to tell other countries how they should live. Maybe we need to start listening to them. Why do cities like London, Paris, Toyko, have much lower rates of gun violence than Chicago? Why do they do a much better job of identifying people who might pose a threat? They are thriving democracies.

I know there are no simple solutions to complex issues. We must deal with the fact that no one law or investment is going to solve the issue of gun violence. Choosing to just throw up our arms is getting us nowhere. When it comes to the safety of children, the freedom to bear arms must be far more reasonable than it is now.

Our parish task force is reviewing several protocols to make our campus safer. After September 11th we all had to adapt to a changing reality. Such is going to be the case here.

I am grateful for the many suggestions and conversations I have had with parishioners. We all love this parish and want to do whatever is necessary to make us safer.

Sorry if I have offended anyone with my feelings about guns. I just plead that we find a better way to be a community, redeemed by the blood of the Cross,



- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:30-9:00pm. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 9.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

#### The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Sunday 5:00pm Mass and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students grade 7 through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearsals are in the church before the Mass at which they are singing, and sometimes on Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability).

#### The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, either at the 9:00am or the 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearsals are in the church on Tuesdays, starting September 16, from 5:45-6:30pm


#### **Cantors**




