Dear Parishioners,

"No servant can serve two masters."

In the spiritual world there are always forces competing for our attention. Some of these forces are grounded in evil, others in good. It is the challenge of discernment to distinguish the difference between the two.

Given the insipid nature of evil, we are called to vigilance in our daily

prayer. I have adopted the practice of the daily examen.

The Daily Examen is technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day. Where did I sense God's presence? The practice of the Daily Examen was described by St. Ignatius of Loyola in his Spiritual Exercises.

There are five steps to the Daily Examen:

- 1) Become aware of God's presence.
- 2) Review the day with gratitude.
- 3) Pay attention to your emotions.
- 4) Choose one feature of the day and pray about it.
- 5) Look forward to tomorrow.

In my recent Daily Examen, I have been reflecting on the recent canonization of St. Carlos Acuitis. He is the first saint

who belonged to the Millennial Generation. What caused the world to reflect on him was his devotion to the Eucharist. In the midst of being a part of the world of video games, soccer and the internet, he cultivated a deep spiritual connection to the Eucharist, to his family and to his friends. He evangelized many non-church going people like his parents to reconsider their relationship with the Lord and to begin weekly participation in the Mass.

St. Carlos is buried in a beautiful church in Assisi. He is giving St. Francis and St. Clare a run for their money with the lines of pilgrims visiting his tomb. What is striking is the number of teenagers and young adults who feel a powerful connection to him and his witness to a Eucharistic foundation to faith.

All over the world young people are expressing a desire for a deeper spiritual life. We see this in more young people participating in the OCIA, attending Mass, becoming more involved in youth ministry and campus ministry.

St. Carlos Acutis, pray for us, especially young people who seek your intercession on behalf of their spiritual growth.

Here at OL we are committed to the ongoing spiritual of all our people. Check out our Scripture Study program that is focusing on Luke. After the first of the year, men and women are invited to participate in a weekend retreat experience at Bellarmine Retreat House in Barrington. See the Bulletin for more information. For parents of second graders and eighth graders get involved with your children's sacramental programs and grow spiritually along with them!

OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP CHURCH

Dear Parishioners,

This coming Sunday will be the funeral of Charlie Kirk. He was assassinated at an event in Utah.

A couple of weeks ago I addressed the scourge of gun violence in our country as result of the mass shooting of school children at Annunciation school in Minneapolis.

I was grateful for the significant response to those comments. I appreciated how many of you recognized that I speak out on such matters as a moral not political voice. People want to reduce such issues to political judgment. Jesus was not a politician he was a moral teacher, and I look to follow him. My reflections come from a place of moral and not political reflection. I based that column on the 5th commandment, "thou shall not kill" and the development of moral law by St John Paul II, in his encyclical, "Veritatis Splendor". John Paul was a staunch defender of the sanctity of life, he abhorred the culture of death as was revealed by senseless gun violence.

I need to speak again from a moral perspective. Whether you agreed with Charlie Kirk or not his murder is a moral outrage. His life was sacred and a gift from God. No one had the right to take it. The weekend Charlie was killed, dozens and dozens of innocent Americans had their lives ended because of gun violence.

The collateral damage is profound. His beautiful wife of 36 years of age is a widow, and those two beautiful children have lost their dad. By all accounts he was a wonderful husband and father. Every time those children google their dad's name they will see horrific images of his death.

May they be embraced by the love of the Good Shepherd who cherishes us all.

Charlie, "may the angels lead you into paradise, may the martyrs come to welcome you, and lead you to the new and eternal Jerusalem".

May the God of peace relieve us of the scourge of gun violence.







Stewardship Report

To all Parishioners:


The results of collections for July and August 2025, the first two months of FY26, are listed below. As a parish community, you have contributed \$405,608 towards Sunday and Holy Day collections for these two months. We are grateful for your generosity and the sacrifices you make to provide support to OLPH Parish.

Compared with the same period last year, actual collections for the two months increased by 2.5%. We are, however, trailing the budget projection for the new fiscal year by 10.5%. This amounts to approximately \$47,000. Summer months traditionally yield less giving than the remainder of the year, and many of us no longer spread donations out week by week or month by month. It is important, though, that we keep watch over this variance, as our operating budget is built mostly around projected collections for the fiscal year.

As of this date, Generation to Generation: Answer the Call Campaign has raised \$7,275,000 in pledges. OLPH will receive 65% of collected funds. To date, the OLPH portion of collected funds is \$1.2 million. The Generation to Generation Project Steering Committee is sorting through projects, timelines, estimated costs and timing of funds available as we move into the project phase of the campaign.

The Annual Report is due to the Archdiocese by September 30th. Upon their acceptance and approval, we will be publishing our Parish Annual Report. Look for it, at the latest, by the beginning of November. Our results will show in pictures, numbers, and words all the blessings our parish has received, and all that we have shared with others.

As always, we thank you for your continued sacrifice and efforts to help sustain the works of our parish and we are ever grateful for your time, talent and treasure shared here at OLPH and beyond!






