Dear Parishioners,

"The Lord has given us a spirit of power and love."

So much is happening as this month of October begins! I would like to call your attention to two observances that stand before us. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has invited all Catholics to observe October as Respect Life Month. October is also Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Each October the Bishops ask us to pray and get informed on the many challenges that face life in our country from the moment of conception until the end of our earthly journey. The theme builds on the Jubilee year, "Building a culture that cherishes and protects human life."

The sanctity of life is under tremendous threats these days from abortion to a growing number of states adopting assisted suicide laws, to poverty, gun violence to the abuse of the elderly. We must get informed on the deeper level of moral issues in these threats and not get trapped in political rhetoric. I would encourage you to visit the USCCB website and explore the Church's moral positions on these complex topics: usccb.org/prolife.

Domestic Violence continues to plague our nation. It takes many forms and targets vulnerable children and adults. Prevention and resources are available. Here in Glenview, we have several places people can turn to. Throughout the month there will be resources described in the Bulletin.

Building a culture of hope amid these many challenges requires deep faith and a strong moral compass. As Paul teaches us in this weekend's second reading, "The Lord has given us a spirit of power and love." This faithful reassurance can help us truly build a culture where people put down their weapons, make sacrifices to build strong loving families and communities. We must embrace the Lord's commandment, "Love one another as I have loved you." Every human being has been created in the image of God. We must be strong advocates of condemning violence in all its forms.

I am grateful to **Monica and Lloyd Cassidy** for their extraordinary leadership of our Respect Life ministry and all those who serve with them. Throughout the year they educate us and support our efforts to cherish and protect every human life.

We have a wonderful ministry as well on Domestic Violence Abuse and Prevention. Thank you to **Kim Hand, Peggy Gately, Elizabeth Swider, Elaine Michelini** and **Zoe Sundstrom**. They also help us keep this issue in front of us. Glenview is not immune to this reality.

Congratulations to our OLPH 8th grade girls' volleyball team. They were crowned Catholic League champions after crushing the championship title game last Saturday.

Congratulations to **Terry Luc** our Communications Director for being awarded The Publicity Club of Chicago's coveted Golden Trumpet award for his coverage last year on "Bringing Back the Bells at OLPH" Dedication event.




