

Fr. Jerry Boland, Pastor

This week Fr.Jerry is on a pilgrimage to Portugal and Spain. In lieu of his weekly Pastor's Letter, he wanted to share with parishioners this article from the archdiocese on the upcoming process to appoint a new pastor at OLPH upon his retirement next July. The discernment process will begin in November and continue until March 2026. We encourage all parishioners to participate.

PARISH CONSULTATION AT OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

Upon the retirement of **Father Jerry Boland** in July of 2026, **Cardinal Cupich** will be appointing a new pastor to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. The process of selecting that priest involves a great deal of prayer, research, discernment and discussion.

One of the important groups in this process is the Priest Placement Board (PPB). This group advises Cardinal Cupich on candidates for pastor based on the talents and skills of the priest-candidates in light of the strengths and challenges of the parishes in the pastor pool.

The PPB is composed of nine priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago who serve full-time as pastors or associate pastors; one of the members is retired. The work of the PPB is directed by **Fr. Michael Knotek**, the Vicar for the Professional and Pastoral Development of Priests who does this work full-time along with the ongoing formation for priests.

In order to gain wisdom from parish staff and parish leaders about the skills and talents needed in your next pastor, the PPB will be conducting a Parish Consultation at OLPH on November 18, 2025. Two members of the PPB will facilitate two meetings, one with the staff and the other with the Parish Council Members and Finance Committee. These discussions are very important to give the Priests Placement Board insight about OLPH and the capabilities needed in your next pastor.

The wisdom from the parishioners is also extremely important in the pastor selection process. To gather that wisdom, a form will be made available to parishioners to answer the following questions which the staff and lay leadership will also address in their discussions:

- A. What are the strengths of your parish? What is working very well presently?
- B. What are the specific challenges your parish is currently facing?
- C. What current ministries and programs in your parish are vitally important and must continue in order for the parish to remain vibrant and grow?
- D. What programs for parish renewal and evangelization are currently in place at your parish?
- E. What are the specific and unique skills, talents and capabilities needed in your next pastor?

These parishioner input forms will continue to be gathered until January of 2026.

The discernment process leads up to a two day meeting in early March of 2026 whereby Cardinal Cupich gathers all of the input from the Parish Consultations and meets with the Vicar General, all the Auxiliary Bishops, the Priests Placement Board members, and other key personnel at the Archdiocese to make his decision about who he will appoint to be the next pastor of OLPH as well as pastors for the other parishes in the pastor pool this year.

Please pray for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit to help identify the next pastoral leader of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish.



Happy Sunday to my OLPH family!

I am so excited to be leading our parish in this year's OLPH United! Before arriving, I thought it would be good to give you the elevator pitch of who I am.

I grew up in East Glenview, right down the street from Hackney's on Harms. I am number three out of four children in my family, and we all went to OLPH for grade school. During my time at OLPH, I was either on the football field or in the Church altar serving. It was surreal to reflect over my eight years I spent at OLPH.

These were incredibly formative times that introduced me to the basic tenants of the faith. I will never forget my religion class with **Sister Marie Krippner**. However, the greatest experiences I had at OLPH were through Totus Tuus summer camp. It was the only week during the entire year where the youth got to immerse ourselves in the faith, and really experience the love of God through friends, teachings, and prayer.

After graduating from OLPH, I spent the next four years at New Trier High School (Go Trevians!). It was an exciting time where I was enriched with a solid academic tradition, engaged in many social groups and activities, teared it up on the football and lacrosse fields, led student sections at various sporting events, and sat on the student government board.

These were exciting years, but also difficult at times. I found myself only practicing my faith for an hour of the week. I went to Sunday Mass, but every hour after that I lived a life that did not reflect our Catholic faith. Towards the later years of high school, I felt an emptiness. My heart longed for more.

So, in my senior year of high school, I went to Medjugorje. My mom and I found ourselves in the middle of nowhere Bosnia Herzegovina. Yet, The Blessed Mother had been appearing there for over forty years. I was surrounded by hundreds of thousands of Catholic youths from around the world. We would hike every morning, listen to amazing conversion and healing miracle stories, and most importantly we would enter deep times of prayer. During this pilgrimage, I encountered the love and thirst of Jesus for the first time in my life. I fell in love, and my life changed forever.

When I returned, I finished up my senior year of high school and then entered George Washington University. Day one, I felt Jesus say to my heart, "either live for me or continue on the path you are on", and he gave me the grace to choose him.

I discovered the Catholic Newman Center where for the first time in my life I discovered friends of true communion, a holy young priest, and incredible FOCUS Missionaries. I did not just join any ordinary community, rather, I entered a place of communion where our lives centered around Christ. My friends at Newman became the deepest relationships I had ever experienced. Living in a place of true intimate communion allowed me to encounter

even more of God's love and even opened my heart up to hearing his priestly call.

After two years of incredible faith growth, I entered the seminary, one of the purest forms of a place of true communion. Our lives are centered on the Eucharist, Our Lady, and brotherhood. Together, we grow as human beings, discovering more and more about ourselves, especially through healing.

We grow intellectually by being immersed in the two thousand years of rich theological tradition. We learn how to be holy and faithful pastors. Further, most importantly, we fall more in love with Jesus and discover more of who he is through daily prayer, retreats, spiritual conferences, and through one another.

To sum up, it was when I entered places of true communion that I discovered and experienced the depths of God's love for me. This is what I hope and desire to share with you all in the next few weeks. I pray and hope OLPH will continue to become more fully a place of holy intimate communion.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick

Oct. 25 & Nov. 1

Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to parishioners who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or in the hospital. They share with them the word of God in scripture, pray with them for the Church and the world, and offer them companionship.



Through the Ministry of Care, we are able to keep longtime parishioners of OLPH connected and active in our faith community.

The work of the Ministry of Care is open to all members of our parish community, and a basic training course for new Ministers of Care will take place in Hickey Hall at OLPH.

The training will take place on two successive Saturday mornings this fall:

- · October 25
- November 1

Both sessions will focus on various aspects of the Ministry of Care; however, the unifying thread woven through all is a commitment to helping you develop the skills and confidence needed to be a source of comfort to those who are sick, elderly or homebound.

These sessions will be facilitated by **Rick Nash** and **Jim Vlazny**, Coordinators of the Ministry of Care at OLPH. Completion of this course qualifies you to receive the Archdiocesan mandate to bring Communion to the sick, homebound and hospitalized of our parish.

Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples


Today we join with our brothers and sisters in faith around the globe to celebrate our vocation to become missionaries and witnesses to the great hope given by the Lord Jesus. Each one of us participates in the universal evangelizing mission of the Church by our witness of life, prayer, sacrifice and generosity.

Donations offered through the collection support The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, a worldwide network overseen by Pope Leo XIV. Our gifts are shared with 1,124 mission areas where the church is too young, too poor or persecuted and needs our help. We support offering the Sacraments and teaching the faith, building new churches, and providing healthcare and education. This World Mission Sunday, let us shine forth with the light of hope and illuminate the whole world OLPH supports World Mission Sunday as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% of annual giving among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection on World Mission Sunday during the weekend of October 18-19, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

If you choose, however, to make a separate gift, there are envelopes available at the entrances to the Church; there is a button open on the GiveCentral OLPH portal; or, you can give directly to the Archdiocese at WeAreMissionary.org/wms.

Let us also remember to pray for the missionary movement of the Catholic Church throughout the world.

St. Sabina News

On September 30, 2024, Catholic Charities closed five food pantries, one of which was the Auburn Gresham location, located at 1120 W 79th St. On October 14, 2024, St. Sabina reopened the food pantry, St. Sabina Social Service Center.



In the last year, the Faith Community of St. Sabina, in conjunction with the Chicago Food Depository, along with donations from the church, **Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Glenview**, 1-800-Truck-Wreck, and local stores, as a part of the food rescue, has provided food for over 40,000 individuals. The social service center has also partnered with countless organizations such as TCA Health Clinic, The Chicago Foundation for Mental Health, All Chicago, Street Samaritans, and CEDA, to create a one-stop social service center for clients.

Fr. Michael Pfleger said,"With the current government cuts of food programs, including SNAP, the numbers are growing each week and will soon make us unable to keep up."

On October 14, 2025, to celebrate the one-year anniversary, over 20 organizations participated in an event to provide services, as well as hot lunches and many givaways.

From OLPH's **Bill Lynch**,"It's hard to put into words what we saw last week at St. Sabina. Fr. Mike introduced us to his four major leaders - incredible light shining with hope, purpose + results. They are making a difference one person at a time, through therapy, education, job placement, + doing PRECISELY what Jesus told us to do. 
