seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more."

This weekend begins our annual observance of the commemoration of the dead. We call to mind all our deceased relatives and friends and entrust them to the eternal presence of the Risen One, Jesus Christ.

Each year I am blown away by the number of parishioners we lose through death. This past year so many families had to encounter the death of loved one. In some cases, death was the result of a long process of diminishment, for others death came like a thief in the night with no preparation or expectation.

The readings proclaimed this weekend are often used at funeral liturgies. They are words that wash over us at times of grief, reassuring us that the Lord does not abandon us in our grief but accompanies us. We are invited to recall the central message of our Christian faith, Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

I am grateful to our Ministers of Bereavement: **Janet Pomillo, Lynn Schwabe, Monica Cassidy, Bob Jansen, Barb Tchaou and Cathy Lutz**. They do an outstanding ministry to our grieving families. I applaud the efforts of **Russell Stern** and our music ministry that brings such comfort to families at the time of the funeral. I am grateful to **Linda Feo, Gloria Gaughan and Karen Daniels** who are often the first contact a grieving family has with the parish. I am grateful to the presiders who make an earnest effort to address the families as well as our deacons. We are so blessed by the three funeral homes that care for many of the funerals here at OLPH, Donnellan, NH Scott, and Smith Corcoran, they are all just wonderful. You never forget the kindness extended at the time of loss.

We are living in such contentious times. There are so many different perspectives, political opinions, and views. Certain topics or issues can turn a conversation red hot in minutes. Navigating these issues and conversations is really challenging.

A source of strength and discernment is our faith, where is the Lord amid these controversial and contentious issues? I am often asked what the Church's positions are on hot topics ranging from immigration to gun violence, to the death penalty to environmental concerns.

I really appreciate how many of you can distinguish political opinions from moral teaching. Jesus was not a politician, and his moral voice was rooted in his New Testament command, "love one another as I have loved you." As an observant Jew, he was firmly rooted in the moral foundation of the Ten Commandments. When one reviews the Catholic Catechism, we see a significant difference between political opinions and moral principles. The Church always struggles in its mission to teach and form people in the moral vision of Jesus amid political rhetoric which can lead us far away from the moral direction of Jesus Christ and our Bishops.

We can see that challenge in reflecting on **Cardinal Cupich's** letter last week that was a moral response to the immigration crises.

We are invited to consider Jesus' moral vision when we are forming political opinions. How does my Catholic identity invite us to look beyond political rhetoric to the consequential decision to walk in the embrace of the Good Shepherd.

This is a busy weekend! This Saturday, Nov. 1, we welcome home parishioner and seminarian **Luke Lato** for a gathering of OLPH United which begins after the 8:30am Mass in the Playdium. Sunday the 5:00pm Mass will be our annual All Souls Mass of Remembrance. It is always a beautiful and solemn gathering.

Good Luck to our 8th Grade Warriors who are in the Catholic League Football Championship Game. The Game is this Sunday at 11:30am at Loyola's Stadium.

Welcome Home **Fr. Honoratus** who was on vacation visiting with family and friends in Tanzania and Rwanda.

PARISH CONSULTATION AT OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

Upon the retirement of **Father Jerry Boland** in July of 2026, **Cardinal Cupich** will be appointing a new pastor to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. The process of selecting that priest involves a great deal of prayer, research, discernment and discussion.

One of the important groups in this process is the Priest Placement Board (PPB). This group advises Cardinal Cupich on candidates for pastor based on the talents and skills of the priest-candidates in light of the strengths and challenges of the parishes in the pastor pool.

The PPB is composed of nine priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago who serve full-time as pastors or associate pastors; one of the members is retired. The work of the PPB is directed by **Fr. Michael Knotek**, the Vicar for the Professional and Pastoral Development of Priests who does this work full-time along with the ongoing formation for priests.

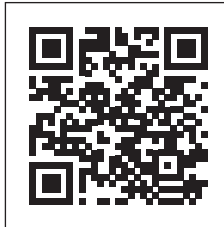
In order to gain wisdom from parish staff and parish leaders about the skills and talents needed in your next pastor, the PPB will be conducting a Parish Consultation at OLPH on November 18, 2025. Two members of the PPB will facilitate two meetings, one with the staff and the other with the Parish Council Members and Finance Committee. These discussions are very important to give the Priests Placement Board insight about OLPH and the capabilities needed in your next pastor.

The wisdom from the parishioners is also extremely important in the pastor selection process. To gather that wisdom, a form is now available to parishioners to answer questions which the staff and lay leadership will also address in their discussions.

The preferred method for collecting parishioner responses will be through the digital form.

For any parishioners who would rather use a paper form, forms will also be placed in pews at Mass.

These parishioner input forms will continue to be gathered until January of 2026.

The discernment process leads up to a two day meeting in early March of 2026 whereby Cardinal Cupich gathers all of the input from the Parish Consultations and meets with the Vicar General, all the Auxiliary Bishops, the Priests Placement Board members, and other key personnel at the Archdiocese to make his decision about who he will appoint to be the next pastor of OLPH as well as pastors for the other parishes in the pastor pool this year.

Please pray for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit to help identify the next pastoral leader of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish.

Carrying Christ to Others: Jim Vlazny and the Ministry of Care at Our Lady of Perpetual Help

For more than 50 years, Jim Vlazny has called Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Glenview home. He and his wife, Sue, settled in the community when Jim started work nearby, and they have been part of the parish ever since.

Jim's Catholic roots run deep, from grammar school on Chicago's South Side to Mendel Catholic High School and Loyola University Chicago, where he earned a degree in chemistry and met his wife.

Faith remained central throughout his life, especially in times of struggle. "My dad died when I was going into eighth grade," he shared. "For a while, I felt lost. Mendel High School—the teachers, coaches, and students—helped me through. Football and my Catholic community meant a lot to me."

Over the years, Jim has witnessed remarkable growth at OLPH. Reflecting on this, he notes, "What stands out is the outreach. People helping people—that's what a parish should be." Jim's path into the Minister of Care program began unexpectedly—through his own experience of illness.

After retiring in 2012, he was diagnosed with cancer just months later, confronting years of surgery, chemotherapy, and radiation. While he underwent treatment, a Minister of Care would visit him in the hospital to bring Holy Communion.

"It was wonderful to have someone come who wasn't there to poke or prod me, but simply to pray with me," Jim said. "You can choose to feel sorry for yourself, or you can turn to God and say: help me, dear Lord, I need you."

That experience inspired Jim to join the Ministry of Care himself once he recovered. "Retirement causes you to ask, 'Who am I now? Where does the Lord want me?'" he said. "For me, this ministry became the answer."

Today, Jim co-coordinates the program with Chaplain Rick Nash. Nash covers hospital and nursing home visits, while Jim tends to the homebound. "It's wonderfully uplifting to bring Christ to people," he reflected. "At first it was intimidating, but now I know this is what Jesus wants—be there for others and carry Him to them."

Encounters with Christ

Jim describes the ministry as deeply humbling. "Going into someone's home and seeing their face light up—it's not me, it's what I carry," he said.

Alongside moments of joy, Jim has also walked with parishioners through suffering. "Part of being a Minister of Care is that you see a lot of pain," he explained. "But you also see spouses, children, and friends caring for others in incredible ways. That, too, is being Jesus for one another. I draw a lot of strength from it."

Lessons in Faith and Family

Jim and his wife recently celebrated 60 years of marriage. He credits their journey to their shared faith. "I don't know if we could have done it without our faith in God and each other," he said.

That same faith continues to inspire him as a grandfather. His granddaughter got married recently, and he shared some advice: take turns. Sometimes, it's your turn to be patient and loving, even if you're right. Other times, it's your partner's turn. "You have to take turns," he reminded her.

Jim also draws inspiration from his wife's resilience. She has been legally blind for nearly five decades yet continues to adapt without complaint. "She is a wonderful role model for me," Jim said. "Her example shows me that when you suffer, you can either stew in anger or you can say, 'Here I am, Lord. Help me.' I thank God for her every day."

Teaching and Witnessing

In addition to his own ministry, Jim helps train new Ministers of Care through a parish formation program. Over two Saturdays, participants learn about the Eucharist, prayer, suffering, and the practical aspects of bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. From the start, he tells people: this is not about you—it's about Christ and the people you are serving. Carrying Christ to others is both humbling and uplifting.

Jim is even grateful for the cancer that once threatened his life. "I don't wish it on anyone, but it changed me," he said. "I realized I couldn't do it myself. I had to put everything in God's hands. That suffering deepened my faith."

Jim sums up his ministry simply: "When I walk into a home and someone smiles because Christ has entered with me, I know I am exactly where the Lord wants me."

The work of the Ministry of Care is open to all members of our parish community. Training sessions are facilitated by **Rick Nash** and **Jim Vlazny**, Coordinators of the Ministry of Care at OLPH.

Completion of this course qualifies you to receive the Archdiocesan mandate to bring Communion to the sick, homebound and hospitalized of our parish.

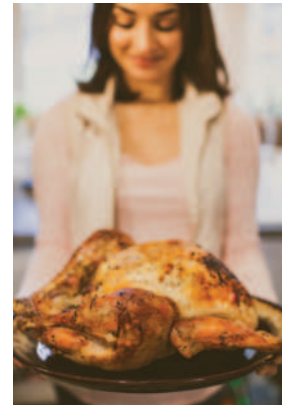
Befriend a Family – Holiday Support for Needy Sharing Parish Families

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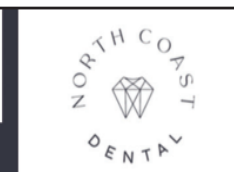
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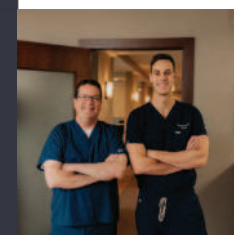
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
