

Dear Parishioners,

"You are God's building."

Core to the moral teachings of the Church is the conviction that life is sacred. This is far more profound than a nifty slogan. It is a foundational premise that provides a filter for how we determine our moral response to the myriads of questions on how to apply this moral conviction to the practical challenges that we face.

Our annual celebration of the commemoration of our beloved dead got me thinking about some of the challenges families face as death is approaching and plans need to be made.

One of the more challenging moments is the end of life and the reality that decisions with serious moral implications must be made. The Church has taught that extraordinary means to prolong life are not morally obligatory. The challenge is the line between ordinary and extraordinary means is difficult to gauge with the remarkable advance of medical technologies.

I would encourage you to check out the website for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and review their resources and recommendations. (Here is the website link: https://www.usccb.org/prolife/end-life) I would encourage everyone to review their plans and their expectations. It is important to determine who would be your durable power of attorney for health care. Not only should someone be selected, but you need to have a conversation with them about decisions you would like to have made if you were incapacitated. This sense of your wishes can be of immense comfort for the person who might be called upon to decide on your behalf.

Pain management, hydration, and hospice are all morally responsible ways to address the care of a person whose life is diminishing. Physician assisted suicide and euthanasia are not.

Catholic Cemeteries provide many resources to assist a person who would like to plan for their funeral and internment. All our funeral homes here in Glenview have excellent services to assist you in making sure your wishes are observed. Many times, a family in the midst of grieving the death of a loved one also must make complicated decisions about the funeral, getting graves and other considerations when they are least able to think things through. It can be a great gift to one's family if some of these decisions were made ahead of time.

I am often asked about the Catholic Church's position on cremation. In 1963, the Church lifted its ban on cremation. All our Catholic cemeteries provide options for the internment of ashes. The Church teaches that the cremated remains of the deceased should be dealt with the same respect as the deceased body. It should be interred promptly after the funeral. If you have the cremated remains and want to explore options, representatives of Catholic Cemeteries would be more than happy to assist you.

At the time of a funeral, we here at OLPH want to do everything possible to assist you. Ministers of bereavement will assist you in planning the funeral liturgy. **Russell Stern**, our Director of Music, tries to do everything to accommodate family requests for the funeral service. He can help you determine when a certain song might be more appropriate at a different time in the funeral process.

It is one of the great privileges of being a priest is to accompany families as they face the death of a loved one. Never hesitate to reach out to the priest that is presiding at the funeral of a loved one. Sometimes there can be family issues that should be brought to his attention to avoid any undo pain or misunderstanding.

The priests are very committed to doing our part in reaching out to grieving families and help ensure the liturgy reflects the tone and temperament of the family.

I always pray this ancient prayer of the Church during this month of November, "Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord! May they rest in Peace. May their soul and all the souls of the faithful departed, Rest in Peace."



PARISH CONSULTATION AT OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

Upon the retirement of **Father Jerry Boland** in July of 2026, **Cardinal Cupich** will be appointing a new pastor to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. The process of selecting that priest involves a great deal of prayer, research, discernment and discussion.

One of the important groups in this process is the Priest Placement Board (PPB). This group advises Cardinal Cupich on candidates for pastor based on the talents and skills of the priest-candidates in light of the strengths and challenges of the parishes in the pastor pool.

The PPB is composed of nine priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago who serve full-time as pastors or associate pastors; one of the members is retired. The work of the PPB is directed by **Fr. Michael Knotek**, the Vicar for the Professional and Pastoral Development of Priests who does this work full-time along with the ongoing formation for priests.

In order to gain wisdom from parish staff and parish leaders about the skills and talents needed in your next pastor, the PPB will be conducting a Parish Consultation at OLPH on November 18, 2025. Two members of the PPB will facilitate two meetings, one with the staff and the other with the Parish Council Members and Finance Committee. These discussions are very important to give the Priests Placement Board insight about OLPH and the capabilities needed in your next pastor.

The wisdom from the parishioners is also extremely important in the pastor selection process. To gather that wisdom, a form is now available to parishioners to answer questions which the staff and lay leadership will also address in their discussions.

The preferred method for collecting parishioner responses will be through the digital form.

For any parishioners who would rather use a paper form, forms will also be placed in pews at Mass.

These parishioner input forms will continue to be gathered until January of 2026.

The discernment process leads up to a two day meeting in early March of 2026 whereby Cardinal Cupich gathers all of the input from the Parish Consultations and meets with the Vicar General, all the Auxiliary Bishops, the Priests Placement Board members, and other key personnel at the Archdiocese to make his decision about who he will appoint to be the next pastor of OLPH as well as pastors for the other parishes in the pastor pool this year.

Please pray for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit to help identify the next pastoral leader of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish.






