Dear Parishioners,

"A child shall lead us."

Our Advent journey begins!

Suddenly, the beautiful Advent Season begins in the afterglow of Thanksgiving. The pre-Christmas hype began months ago but the reality is that we are given this gift of Advent to prepare our hearts for the celebrations surrounding Christmas.

It is not easy keeping the spirit of Advent in the midst of so much energy focused on Christmas. The word means "the arrival of a significant person or event." Advent for Christians is a celebration of both, the commemoration of the birth of the long-awaited Messiah and the moment our God was born into history, ushering in the Christian era.

How do we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ into our hearts and the larger community?

There are many wonderful traditions from the beautiful Advent hymns and biblical passages of the Advent Season. Here are some of my favorite traditions from around the world:

- The Mexican tradition of "la Posada" reenacts Mary and Joseph's search for lodging.
- The Filipinos celebrate a wonderful tradition of "Simbang Gabi," nine Masses celebrated in honor of the Blessed Mother as Christmas approaches.
- In Northern Europe, the Feast of St. Lucy is a celebration of light amid the longest days of darkness.
- Many Europeans celebrate St. Nicholas Day on December 6 with gifts and sweets for children.

Spiritually here at OLPH we have many offerings to assist you in your observance of Advent. We have meditation books available at all the church exits this weekend. The "blue book" and the Advent edition of Magnificat have become an annual tradition for many parishioners to reflect on the daily scriptures. Many decide to attend daily Mass at either 6:30am or 8:30am.

Our annual Reconciliation Service with St. Catherine Labouré and the Catholic Community of Northbrook is on Dec. 10 at 7:00pm. here at OLPH.

The upcoming season of Christmas can be challenging for those who have lost a loved one, have painful memories this time of year or just feeling "out of it." On Dec. 17,

St Norbert and Our Lady of the Brook will host "Blue Christmas", a service of hope and healing beginning at 7:00pm.

In the Bulletin there are many opportunities to assist families that are struggling financially at this time. The Befriend a Family program, the OLPH New Hope Apartment Christmas Wish List and the Sharing Room can all assist you in helping others.

Finding time for silence and prayer is not easy but can help to tune out the "noise" that gets in the way of our desires to prepare spiritually. There are any number of podcasts and virtual offerings that can be of great help. **Bishop Barron**, the USCCB, the Jesuits, Ascension Press, Formed, are just a few to explore.

Next Friday, Dec. 5, there is our annual Christmas Party at the North Shore Country Club. Thanks to everyone who has planned this amazing gathering. *(There are still a limited number of tickets left! See the ad on page 12 of this Bulletin for the link to place your reservation.)*

Thanks to the Men's Club for an awesome gathering on Thanksgiving morning, the Glenview Gobbler at Jackman Park. It was terrific. Plans are well underway for their annual Christmas Party with the children of St. Sabina.

A CHILD SHALL LEAD US

*The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid,
and the calf and the lion and the fatling together,
and a little child shall lead them (Isaiah 11:6).*

We might ask why God chose to send his Son to earth as an infant, born of a woman in a stable in Bethlehem. Jesus could have just as easily descended from Heaven fully grown, possibly clad as a mighty warrior, a king prepared to lead his people into battle. Instead, Jesus arrived with no earthly pomp and circumstance and was greeted by poor and lowly shepherds, who were the first to kneel in awe at his coming.

With the birth of Jesus, the World was called to a rebirth of harmony and peace. Unlike kings such as Saul, Solomon, and David, whose might and power were signified by precious jewels, flowing robes, and conquering armies, Jesus entered his kingship as a helpless infant.

As a newborn, his innocence and dependence paved the way to his teachings on humility, gentleness, and love. Into our darkness, he brings us his light. He tames our arrogance with humility and our selfishness with a call to care for one another. Through the teachings of Jesus, we come to realize that life is not about how much we accumulate but how much we give away.

Jesus' humble beginnings in a stable, to living in obedience with Mary and Joseph, and finally in traveling in ministry with his disciples prepared him for the sacrifice he would be asked to make, modeling for us the greatest love the World has ever known.

Children's hearts tend to be open to believing and to trusting. The season of Advent is a time of nostalgia where we are all drawn to memories of our own childhood, that time when the wonders of the Christmas season abound and the days are long, filled with the possibility of marvels and of miracles.

Let us open our hearts to a childlike faith, of following in the footsteps of the Child Jesus as he leads us to a greater love for our Heavenly Father and a greater love for one another.

Let us also follow the child within us who can still find delight in the wonders of the season and the joy of giving. May we rekindle a childlike faith in God that comes only when we rid ourselves of anxiousness and fear, embracing the innocence of our own remembered youth.

This Advent season, may we all take the hand of the Child Jesus and allow Him to lead us home.

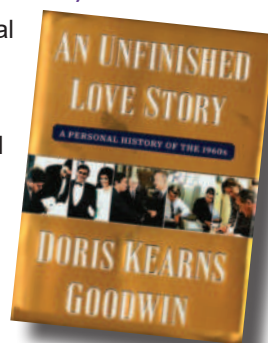

Advent is an ideal time to stop and ponder some of the wondrous mysteries of the Incarnation. PARISH CONSULTATION AT OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

Upon the retirement of **Father Jerry Boland** in July of 2026, **Cardinal Cupich** will be appointing a new pastor to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. The process of selecting that priest involves a great deal of prayer, research, discernment and discussion.

One of the important groups in this process is the Priest Placement Board (PPB). This group advises Cardinal Cupich on candidates for pastor based on the talents and skills of the priest-candidates in light of the strengths and challenges of the parishes in the pastor pool.

The PPB is composed of nine priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago who serve full-time as pastors or associate pastors; one of the members is retired. The work of the PPB is directed by **Fr. Michael Knotek**, the Vicar for the Professional and Pastoral Development of Priests who does this work full-time along with the ongoing formation for priests.

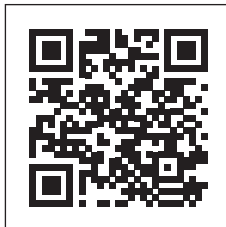
In order to gain wisdom from parish staff and parish leaders about the skills and talents needed in your next pastor, the PPB will be conducting a Parish Consultation at OLPH on November 18, 2025. Two members of the PPB will facilitate two meetings, one with the staff and the other with the Parish Council Members and Finance Committee. These discussions are very important to give the Priests Placement Board insight about OLPH and the capabilities needed in your next pastor.

The wisdom from the parishioners is also extremely important in the pastor selection process. To gather that wisdom, a form is now available to parishioners to answer questions which the staff and lay leadership will also address in their discussions.

The preferred method for collecting parishioner responses will be through the digital form.

For any parishioners who would rather use a paper form, forms will also be placed in pews at Mass.

These parishioner input forms will continue to be gathered until January of 2026.

The discernment process leads up to a two day meeting in early March of 2026 whereby Cardinal Cupich gathers all of the input from the Parish Consultations and meets with the Vicar General, all the Auxiliary Bishops, the Priests Placement Board members, and other key personnel at the Archdiocese to make his decision about who he will appoint to be the next pastor of OLPH as well as pastors for the other parishes in the pastor pool this year.

Please pray for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit to help identify the next pastoral leader of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish.
