

# **Retirement Fund for Religious**


OLPH supports the Retirement Fund for Religious by contributing to the Archdiocesan collection for this purpose, which will take place the weekend of December 13 & 14. We do this as part of our parish First Fruits Program, in lieu of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year.

This Archdiocesan second collection for our retired Religious priests, brothers, and sisters, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

## A Report from Abroad

#### 2025 Builders Al Forum in Rome — a gathering of Catholic educators

On November 6–7, I had the privilege of joining the 2025 Builders AI Forum in Rome — a gathering of innovators, theologians, and business leaders hosted by the Pontifical Gregorian University. As someone who has worked with AI tools in several industries, it was inspiring to be with Faith-filled experts from around the world, committed to championing good uses of AI.

The Forum opened with Mass in St Peter's Basilica, which rooted us in the heart of our Faith before we discussed new and challenging questions humanity faces today. I was moved by the letter we received from **Pope Leo XIV** reminding us that every human invention reflects the creative power

God has entrusted to us, and that we must guide technology to serve human dignity and the common good. "AI," he wrote, "carries an ethical and spiritual weight, for every design choice expresses a vision of humanity."

In our Working Group on Education, one message especially resonated with me: Parents are the first educators of their children, even in the age of Al. Together with grandparents and other adults, we can help our children use Al safely and responsibly by:

#### · Forming minds before relying on machines

Children grow in imagination, attention, and critical thinking through ordinary things: talking with us, reading together, playing, and asking questions.

#### · Modeling healthy tech habits

How we use our phones, social media, and Al tools teaches more than any rule we set.

#### Teaching caution

Al can be helpful — but it shouldn't be the "expert." We can show how to pause, question, and double-check Al-generated answers.

#### · Encouraging good uses of Al

At home, in school, and in daily life, we can welcome technologies that help people — and thoughtfully push back on those that diminish dignity, well-being, or relationships.

#### · Protecting what makes us human

Creativity, empathy, curiosity, and good judgment can't be downloaded. They grow through family time, friendships, prayer and real-life experiences.

Let us, as families of faith, champion the good uses of AI — and be role models in using technology with purpose, wisdom, and compassion.

#### PARISH CONSULTATION AT OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

Upon the retirement of Father Jerry Boland in July of 2026, Cardinal Cupich will be appointing a new pastor to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. The process of selecting that priest involves a great deal of prayer, research, discernment and discussion.

One of the important groups in this process is the Priest Placement Board (PPB). This group advises Cardinal Cupich on candidates for pastor based on the talents and skills of the priest-candidates in light of the strengths and challenges of the parishes in the pastor pool.

The PPB is composed of nine priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago who serve full-time as pastors or associate pastors; one of the members is retired. The work of the PPB is directed by Fr. Michael Knotek, the Vicar for the Professional and Pastoral Development of Priests who does this work full-time along with the ongoing formation for priests.

In order to gain wisdom from parish staff and parish leaders about the skills and talents needed in your next pastor, the PPB will be conducting a Parish Consultation at OLPH on November 18, 2025. Two members of the PPB will facilitate two meetings, one with the staff and the other with the Parish Council Members and Finance Committee. These discussions are very important to give the Priests Placement Board insight about OLPH and the capabilities needed in your next pastor.

The wisdom from the parishioners is also extremely important in the pastor selection process. To gather that wisdom, a form is now available to parishioners to answer questions which the staff and lay leadership will also address in their discussions.

The preferred method for collecting parishioner responses will be through the digital form.

For any parishioners who would rather use a paper form, forms will also be placed in pews at Mass.

These parishioner input forms will continue to be gathered until January of 2026.

The discernment process leads up to a two day meeting in early March of 2026 whereby Cardinal Cupich gathers all of the input from the Parish Consultations and meets with the Vicar General, all the Auxiliary Bishops, the Priests Placement Board members, and other key personnel at the Archdiocese to make his decision about who he will appoint to be the next pastor of OLPH as well as pastors for the other parishes in the pastor pool this year.

Please pray for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit to help identify the next pastoral leader of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish.



# Hearing Assistance available in OLPH Church

# and McDonnell Hall



**OLPH** has a hearing loop installed. Users with a t-coil in their hearing aids can listen to the sound system directly. Check with your hearing care professional to determine whether your hearing aid or cochlear implant has a t-coil.

Please note that while the hearing loop can be accessed in both the main church and McDonnell Hall, both spaces cannot access the hearing loop at the same time. For example, at the 9:30am Sunday Mass when services are held concurrently in the main church and McDonnell Hall, the hearing loop can only be accessed in the main church.

For best results in the church, please sit in the front half of the church. The hearing loop may not be effective in the back of the church, in the side pews, or in the Lady Chapel.

For those with a hearing device that does not have a t-coil, or if you simply would like to hear the service better, **FM** based Assistive Listening Devices (ALD's) are available to borrow. Please plan to arrive for Mass a few minutes early to find Sr. Paulanne or an usher to access an ALD.

Note: An FM based ALD uses radio waves to conduct sound that is broadcast through the microphone.

#### Instructions for an FM based ALD

- 1. Remove any hearing aid that you may be wearing
- 2. Turn on the ALD device
- 3. Place the ALD ear piece in your ear
- 4. Adjust volume as necessary

#### Return all borrowed equipment to Sr. Paulanne after Mass.




