Dear Parishioners,

"Your light has come!"

We are greeted this first weekend of the year with such glorious scriptures on this Feast of The Epiphany of the Lord. This is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church, observed older than Christmas. In many countries, this is the feast that is the highlight of the Christmas Season.

In many parts of the world there is the custom of Christians writing a special message in chalk over their front door. This year they will inscribe 20+C+M+B+26. It commemorates

the visit of the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The inscription asks blessings upon all who visit and that this New Year will be filled with abundant graces and that their home be protected.

Another custom is the Epiphany Proclamation. Long before there were calendars available to people, the upcoming dates of the New Year were announced on this feast day. Because Easter is a movable feast whose date is set by an ancient calculation like the determination of the date pf Passover, people were anxious to hear when it would be, I thought you might like to read this year's Epiphany Proclamation:

Know dear brothers and sisters, that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the **eighteenth day of February**, Ash Wednesday will fall, and the **beg**inning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the **fifth day of April,** you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal Feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the seventeenth day of May, will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-fourth day of May will be the feast of Pentecost.

On the **seventh day of June**, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the **twenty-ninth day of November**, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever Amen.

Speaking of Calendars, make sure you get a copy of our parish calendars available at the exits of the church.

Another great Epiphany tradition is the three kings' cake. The cake is served on the 12th day of Christmas on the feast of the Epiphany. It is made of brioche dough, and a figurine of the Christ Child is placed in the cake. When the cake is sliced whoever gets the slice with the figurine gets a special gift and is specially blessed for the New Year.

"Your light has come." As the New Year begins, I pray that this year will be one of abundant blessings for you and your loved ones. Despite the long days of darkness, we now have passed the winter solstice, and the amount of daylight begins to expand. May the light of Epiphany shine upon you. May the new year have many "epiphanies" when the glory of the Lord will be made manifest to you.

Rise up in splendor! Your light has come!







Volunteers can come to any session their schedule allows, and can contribute by cutting, sewing, or ironing. The ability to use a sewing machine is not required.





# Hearing Assistance available in OLPH Church

### and McDonnell Hall



**OLPH** has a hearing loop installed. Users with a t-coil in their hearing aids can listen to the sound system directly. Check with your hearing care professional to determine whether your hearing aid or cochlear implant has a t-coil.

Please note that while the hearing loop can be accessed in both the main church and McDonnell Hall, both spaces cannot access the hearing loop at the same time. For example, at the 9:30am Sunday Mass when services are held concurrently in the main church and McDonnell Hall, the hearing loop can only be accessed in the main church.

For best results in the church, please sit in the front half of the church. The hearing loop may not be effective in the back of the church, in the side pews, or in the Lady Chapel.

For those with a hearing device that does not have a t-coil, or if you simply would like to hear the service better, **FM** based Assistive Listening Devices (ALD's) are available to borrow. Please plan to arrive for Mass a few minutes early to find Sr. Paulanne or an usher to access an ALD.

Note: An FM based ALD uses radio waves to conduct sound that is broadcast through the microphone.

#### Instructions for an FM based ALD

- 1. Remove any hearing aid that you may be wearing
- 2. Turn on the ALD device
- 3. Place the ALD ear piece in your ear
- 4. Adjust volume as necessary

#### Return all borrowed equipment to Sr. Paulanne after Mass.


