

Dear Parishioners,

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

The Christmas season formally concludes with the feast this weekend of the Baptism of Our Lord.

Today, we commemorate that moment that marks the beginning of His public ministry as He was baptized by the Holy Spirit by John and affirmed by God the Father.

There are few things that bring me more joy than presiding at baptisms. I get a lot of opportunities to experience this joy, **last year we baptized about 150 children.**

I look into the eyes of the parents and am aware of the profound influence they will have on the faith formation of their child. I am aware of the larger circle of relatives and close friends who will be the first community this young person will come to know. I think of the larger role our faith community of OLPH will play in the liturgical, educational and faith formative efforts which will shape this child's values and sense of the world.

In this rapidly changing world, there are challenges to parenting that can be overwhelming. The old African proverb says it best, "it takes a village." Raising children requires a buy-in from all of us! In a society that can overly value individualism, there is the reality that a young life is influenced by many people, many forces. We all have a part to play in supporting our children so they know they are loved and valued.

As a Christian community we want to form values of compassion, kindness, and mercy. They need to see people around them that are motivated to make the world a better place because of their religious values and their response to Our Lord's command, "love one another as I have loved you."

One of the highlights of any visit to the Holy Land is to visit the place Bethany Beyond the Jordan, the place where tradition has it Our Lord was baptized in the Jordan River.

Through a cooperative effort between the Israeli and Jordanian governments, hundreds of land mines were removed, remnants of the 1967 war. As a gesture of goodwill King Abdullah II donated land to allow for the building of churches and a pilgrimage center - an unprecedented act of kindness by a Muslim leader.

All of us share in the power of baptism, we have been washed cleaned by the waters of baptism and anointed with oil of chrism. All of us have received the light of Christ which will guide our earthly journey.

Today, let us pray for all parents that are expecting a child in 2026. Let us pray for everyone who will be baptized in the coming year. We pray for those candidates in the OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) program who will be baptized on Holy Saturday.

I am so grateful to **Steve and Sheree Kodros and Mike and Maggie Wycklendt** who head our Baptismal Prep Program. They help to put a face on the parish's role in assisting our parents to realize how a solid foundation of faith is one of the greatest gifts they can give their children.

This week the Christmas decorations will be taken down in the Church. What a tremendous season it has been; I am grateful beyond words to our music ministry, Arts and Environment committee, maintenance staff, Youth Ministry, liturgical ministers, and parish staff.

I am also grateful beyond words for the financial support all of you have given to the parish in support of our Christmas collection. Your stewardship of the parish is deeply appreciated. In addition to all of that, from the Sharing Room to the Needy Family Fund, to the Befriend a Family Program, to gifts for the New Hope Apartments, what a difference you have made in helping people in need face the challenges of poverty, homelessness, or are food insecure.

I am so grateful for your support of me and the priests as we continue to grieve the death of **Father Barrett**. His funeral was so uplifting. His family cannot say enough about how grateful they are to the community of OLPH.

In the adage, "when it rains it pours." We are dealing with being shorthanded as the result of Fr. Barrett's death. **Fr. Roy** is in the Philippines for his annual vacation. While there, he was involved in a minor motorcycle accident that resulted in a fracture of his forearm that required surgery. **Fr. Honoratus** and I will do our best! I am also grateful to a few priests who are helping us.

There is a significant outbreak of the flu going on. As a precaution, we will suspend the offering of the cup at Mass until this outbreak subsides.

May the New Year be abundant in blessings for you and your loved ones,

Fr. Jim Barrett loved leading the OLPH Book Club. The Book Club had been growing in popularity with each book.



Project Linus Ministry - Project Linus "blanketeers" have been very active this year creating hundreds of quilts that provide love, a sense of security, warmth, and comfort to children ages 0-18 years who are seriously ill, traumatized or otherwise in need of our new handmade quilts.

The OLPH Project Linus group recently celebrated the 90th birthday of its beloved former leader, **Esther Behnke** (pictured right). Esther recalls that when she first became involved with Project Linus many years ago, the quilts didn't actually have batting. She took charge and bought batting so the quilts actually were warm.

At times she was the only one who showed up for sewing meetings! We now are a productive group of enthusiastic sewists! We have created over **175 quilts for children during the past year!**

We welcome new members! Volunteers can come to any session their schedule allows, and can contribute by cutting, sewing, or ironing. The ability to use a sewing machine is NOT required - just a desire to help children that are going through a difficult time.

We have an advertising opportunity for signage in the OLPH Playdium gym. This is a great opportunity for a family or a business to be the Scoreboard Sponsor and have great visibility within the parish.

Background:

There are two (2) beautiful scoreboards in the Playdium gym. One is in the Southwest (SW) corner and the other is in the Northeast (NE) corner.

The Southwest scoreboard is slightly larger and is most likely viewed more often than the Northeast board. This is due to its location across from the bleachers that are used most frequently. The scoreboards were built with a rectangular area across the bottom for placement of a sign.

The Playdium is one of the premier buildings on the OLPH campus and the gym is used extensively by the school, various clubs and guilds, and the broader OLPH community.

The Scoreboards

- Both the SW and NE scoreboards have space for an advertisement on the bottom panel of each board.
- The dimensions of each panel are approx. 8 ft. x 18 in.
- The winning bidders will be responsible for creating and purchasing the sign. We can refer you to a parishioner who makes signs at a reasonable price, but bidders may choose a different sign maker as well.
- At least two different companies have made signs for the scoreboards in the past. OLPH assumes no responsibility for the cost or delivery time related to the production of the signs.

The Process

- Please submit your bid for the right to advertise on either one or both scoreboards.
- The signs will remain on the boards for a period of at least two (2) years.
- Also submit the content of your sign(s). Signs will be evaluated to ensure content is appropriate.


