Dear Parishioners,

"I will make you a light to the nations."

Pope Leo has quickly established himself as a highly regarded voice on the global stage. He has addressed several conflicts and international challenges with the moral clarity that few others can match.

There was a time for many centuries when the Pope exercised much authority in the temporal world as the leader

of the Papal States. He was a power to reckon with. As papal authority as a sovereign leader diminished, the political currents turned against him and the Papal States ceased when the Italian troops captured Rome in 1870. The formal relinquishing of temporal power ended with the Lateran Treaty of 1929 granting the establishment of the Vatican City State not much bigger than a postage stamp.

Many thought this was the nail in the coffin for the influence of the Pope on the stage of world politics.

Well, it has been the best thing to happen to papal authority. The Pope left the world of political power for the world of moral authority. In my lifetime we have experienced the golden age of the Papacy. The Popes of the 20th and 21st centuries have had a profound influence shaping the moral direction of the world. Look at the role St. John Paul II had in bringing down communism in Europe.

Pope Francis was a fierce advocate for political refugees and immigrants fleeing oppressive governments and poverty.

Pope Leo has picked up the mantle and has established himself as a moral authority on protecting the dignity of the most vulnerable. He has not shied away of condemning immoral political decisions that contradict the moral teachings of Jesus Christ. His years as a missionary in the poorest regions of Peru transformed him.

He is embodying a theme in the scriptures this weekend, "I will make you a light to the nations." The teachings of Jesus call us to light not darkness, to love not hatred, to generosity not selfishness, to peace not war. Our moral foundation in the light of Jesus needs to be heard in this troubled world. The world, as Pope Leo recently lamented, finds itself where "war is in vogue" again. The powerful rolling over the powerless.

"I will make you a light to the nations" is a profound endorsement of the moral responsibility we as Christians must pursue considering our baptism. We cannot be passive bystanders when so many of our brothers and sisters endure indignity, poverty, oppression, and violence.

Next week will be our annual observance of Catholic Schools week. Our parish school has been a significant part of our parish mission since it was founded in 1929. It has had a tremendous influence on forming thousands of our students to be "a light to the nations." Our graduates have gone on to take their place as solidly formed Christian men and women influencing their families, their communities, and the marketplace as "bearers of the light."

Important Safety Announcement

Starting next Tuesday, January 20, we will be implementing new Safety Protocols with the intention of improving the safety of our students from external threats.

Whenever our students are scheduled to be in the church, whether for student Mass, events, rehearsals, or any other reason, church doors will be locked from the outside.

We recently installed "panic doors" at all entrances in the church. They can be locked from the outside but opened from the inside.

New Protocols for Tue. & Thu. 8:30am Masses

Student Masses are 8:30am every Tuesday and Thursday. Our maintenance staff will be in the Church at 8:00am to do a safety check in all rooms, McDonnell Hall, and the Elevator entrance. Students arrive around 8:15am. Staff will begin locking the doors at 8:30am, The last two doors that

will be closed are the Church St. entrance and the South Vestibule entrance at 8:35am. At that point, all doors are locked in the Church. No one will be allowed in. If you are planning on attending 8:30am Mass on these days, make sure you arrive before 8:30am or you will not be allowed in the church.

Occasions With Limited Access to the Lady Chapel Only.

There will be other times during the school year when children will be in the church or McDonnell Hall, when the main entrances will be closed, but there will be access to our Lady Chapel for those who want to come and pray or for adoration.

The safety of our students and staff is of the highest importance to us. We will continue to find ways to improve the safety of our OLPH Campus. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.



We have an advertising opportunity for signage in the OLPH Playdium gym. This is a great opportunity for a family or a business to be the Scoreboard Sponsor and have great visibility within the parish.

Background:

There are two (2) beautiful scoreboards in the Playdium gym. One is in the Southwest (SW) corner and the other is in the Northeast (NE) corner.

The Southwest scoreboard is slightly larger and is most likely viewed more often than the Northeast board. This is due to its location across from the bleachers that are used most frequently. The scoreboards were built with a rectangular area across the bottom for placement of a sign.

The Playdium is one of the premier buildings on the OLPH campus and the gym is used extensively by the school, various clubs and guilds, and the broader OLPH community.

- Please submit your bid for the right to advertise on either one or both scoreboards.
- The signs will remain on the boards for a period of at least two (2) years.
- Also submit the content of your sign(s). Signs will be evaluated to ensure content is appropriate.


