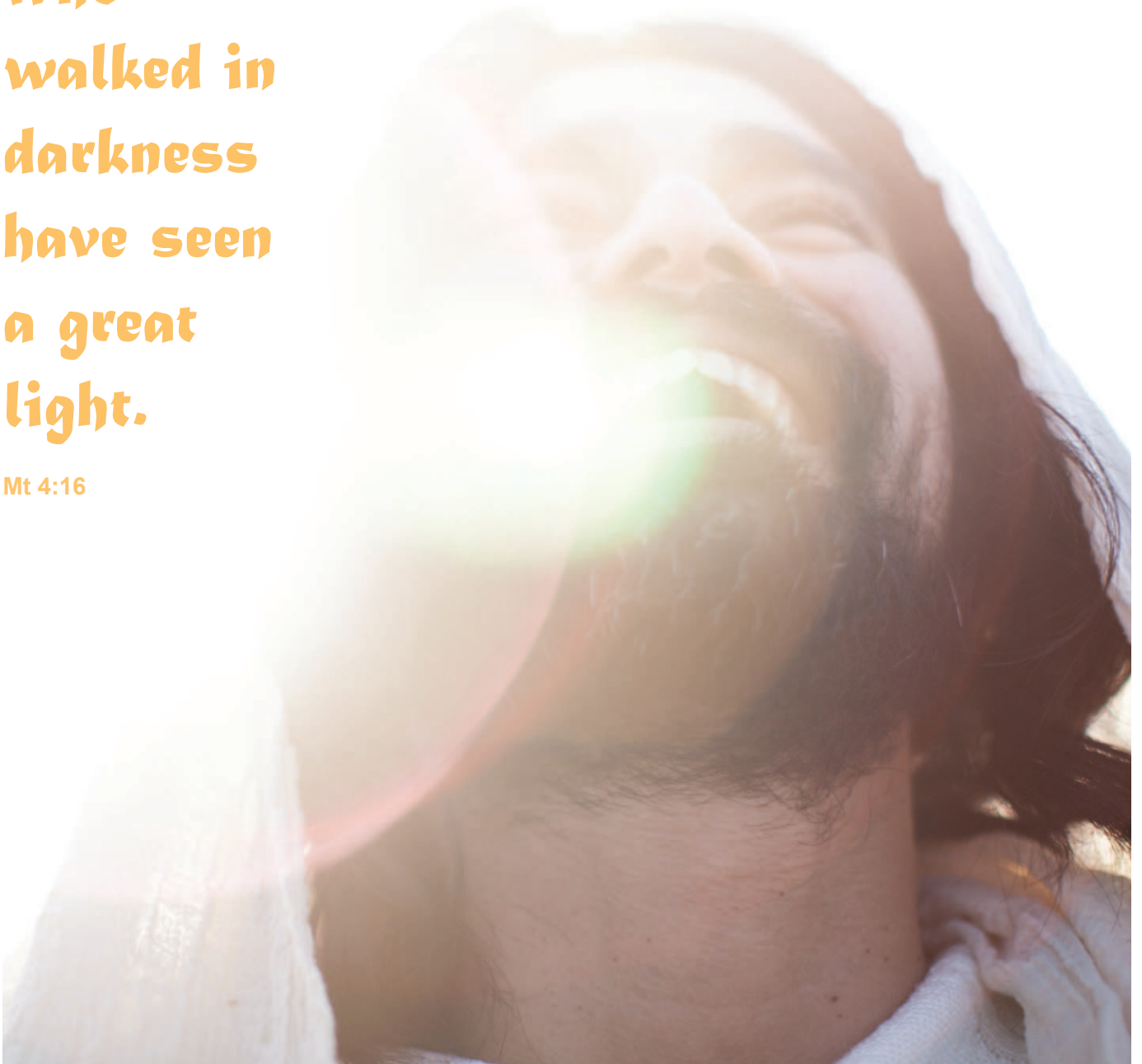

Dear Parishioners,

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light."

In these weeks since the celebration of Epiphany, the theme of light over darkness has been a recurring invitation. Darkness still pervades our experience each day but little by little the time of daylight is expanding.

The scriptures acknowledge this physical reality, but they also speak to a deeper spiritual reality. Our faith in Jesus Christ as the light of the world reassures us of the transforming power Jesus Christ can have on our faith journey.

We all must contend with some degree of spiritual darkness; fear of the unknown, anxieties about the wellbeing of family or close friends, uncertainties surrounding impending decisions. The fact is life is complicated and we all have stuff going on.

The readings this week are a big shot in the arm. They speak to hope, perseverance, and courage. We have walked in darkness, but the redemptive light of Jesus Christ prevails!

In the starkness of winter, the lines between light and darkness can be more evident. There is nothing like beginning to feel better after a lengthy period of illness or distress. There can be the relief of coming to a resolution of a perplexing problem. There can be the peace of mind that results from the healing of a resentment or misunderstanding.

Let us embrace the light! We do not have to walk in darkness!

Last weekend our two seminarians, **Andrew Whipple** and **Jeff Davlin** completed their semester with us and will now be entering their pastoral internships in the Diocese of Grand Rapids. We will miss them but look forward to their return next Fall. **Charlie Leidel** was ordained as a deacon for the Diocese of Grand Rapids. He will be visiting us in March.

Our Steering Committee for the implementation of the projects for the capital campaign, Generation to Generation, has been meeting and getting close to initiating the sequence of projects. Our Director of Facilities, **Tito Diaz**, has been gathering quotes and initial plans. We have already completed the first project under our security initiatives.

We installed panic bars on all the Church doors. We are getting the plans for the scope of installation of the two elevators, the Glenview Road entrance, and the security upgrade to the main entrance to the school in the Lexington building.

We also will be upgrading the entrance to the Parish Center from a security perspective. The funding for this project will be coming from a grant we received from the State of Illinois.

McDonnell Hall is open for business. We have some remaining projects to complete but these will not prevent the Hall from beginning to be used. It is going to be great! There needs to be a little more work to complete the kitchen, we are awaiting the delivery of new tables and chairs, sanctuary furniture, some wall coverings, and a part of the lighting system.

Overall, we will gradually be expanding its use for the many areas of parish life that depend on that space. Thank you for your patience! Once the sanctuary furniture is in place we will restart the 9:30am Family Mass.

The hottest ticket in town is for the Scout's Pancake Breakfast on February 1! Best breakfast of the year! Make sure you get a ticket; they are selling like "hotcakes."

This weekend begins Catholic Schools week. We are blessed with an outstanding school. I am grateful to **Dr. Amy Mills**, her staff, and our outstanding faculty. I am grateful to the sacrifices of our parents who are so supportive. I am grateful to you, the parishioners who so generously support the mission of our school.

This Catholic Schools Week is an opportunity to celebrate so many aspects of our parish school. We are the largest school in the archdiocese. Year after year our students excel in many of the area schools.

Most important to me is the faith formation of our students. I am so proud of the efforts of so many to help form a solid foundation of our Catholic tradition for these future leaders.

I want to express my tremendous admiration for teachers both here at OLPH and in all educational institutions. You can have the most beautiful facilities, a state-of-the-art curriculum, but if you do not have outstanding teachers, you will not have much of a school. We are blessed here with outstanding teachers! Thank you for your devotion, your vocation to teaching with such excellence.

Fr. Barrett's Book Club

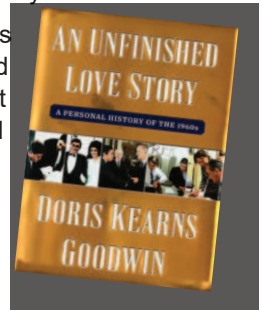

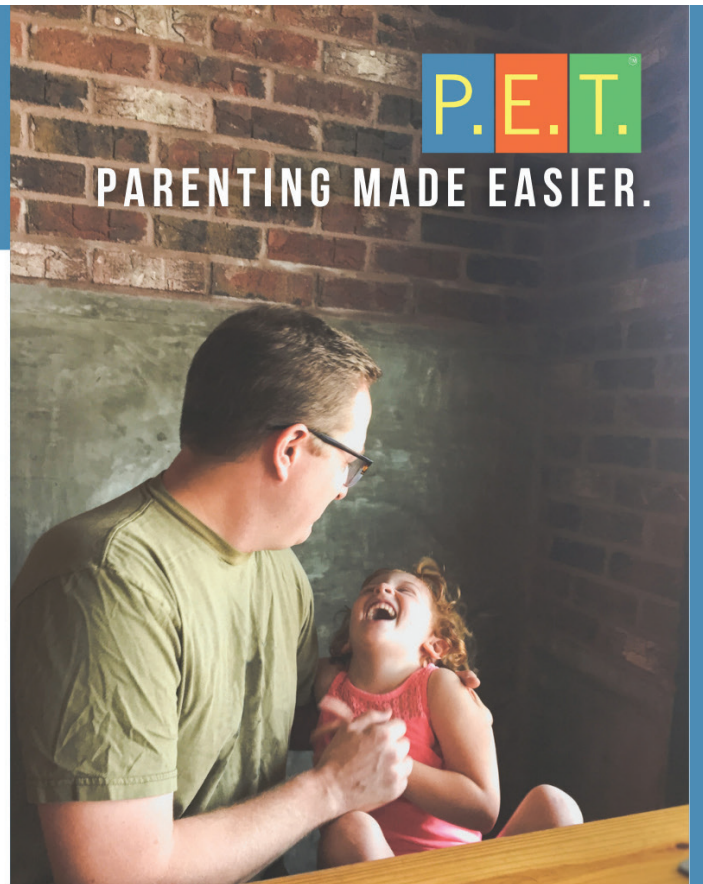

Generation Generation Campaign and Project Update

Thanks to your generosity and commitment to OLPH, we have enough funds available to begin discernment of what projects can be entertained at this juncture. Members of our parish leadership groups comprise our Project Steering Committee, and include **Bridget Baumstark**, Finance Council; **Mike Crowe**, Parish Council; **Ken Kraft**, School Advisory Board; and **Bill Macfadden**, Generation to Generation Fundraising Campaign Committee. **Tito Diaz**, Facilities Director, and **Mary Lynne Januszewski**, Director of Finance and Operations, along with **Fr. Jerry Boland** participate in these meetings, as well.

We have recently moved forward with engaging an architectural firm who will develop the design drawings, followed by construction documents, and then carry us through the bidding and construction phases for our two Elevator projects, as they require a lead time of many months for production. We expect both the Lexington elevator and the Carrollton/Playdium elevator, bridge and entrance would be completed by the start of school in 2027.

Also to be provided by these architects will be design, drawings and construction documents for the secure vestibule at the first-floor entrance of Lexington. We expect the construction for this project to take place this summer and be ready for the start of school.

The architects will also produce designs and drawings for the Glenview Road entrance, streetscape and landscape project. Their design and drawings will be done concurrently with the other projects mentioned above, although the timeline for this project going into production is still being evaluated.

As a reminder, as part of the campus security case statement for the Campaign, the parish has already installed panic bars on all the Church doors to enhance safety for our children. Replacing air conditioners needed for certain school classrooms, another part of our case statement, will take place over a few years. We purchased and installed one just a few months ago.

Remaining projects from our case statement continue to be discussed and prioritized and more concrete plans will depend on how and when future pledge payments come in. More on this in the next couple of months.

Little by Little continues to provide financial support to Haiti via Mountain Top Ministries (MTM) health and nutrition program for students and teachers at the school. The program feeds over 500 children and teachers daily and cost \$5,000 per month (\$60,000 per year).

Along with the efforts of several medical teams providing care at MTM throughout the year, we were amazed to see how our care significantly improved the general health of the village.

Thank you for making this possible! We will continue to support this program with your help.

New support efforts in Uganda

We share a vision of serving the marginalized with **Fr. Patrick Kizza**. His dreams to support the Nyenga Parish community in his home country of Uganda match the aims of Little by Little: to relieve suffering and provide access to care for malnutrition, hypertension, diabetes, AIDS and malaria where 27% of deaths in Uganda are due to Malaria. Little by Little has been maintaining a medical outreach program with Nyenga Hospital in Uganda. We have just completed our 5th year of providing various health services including life saving interventions to four underserved communities. Grateful to God for this ongoing opportunity that has cared for approximately 12,000 patients. This cost is \$20,000 per year.

We have an advertising opportunity for signage in the OLPH Playdium gym. This is a great opportunity for a family or a business to be the Scoreboard Sponsor and have great visibility within the parish.

Background:

There are two (2) beautiful scoreboards in the Playdium gym. One is in the Southwest (SW) corner and the other is in the Northeast (NE) corner.

The Southwest scoreboard is slightly larger and is most likely viewed more often than the Northeast board. This is due to its location across from the bleachers that are used most frequently. The scoreboards were built with a rectangular area across the bottom for placement of a sign.

The Playdium is one of the premier buildings on the OLPH campus and the gym is used extensively by the school, various clubs and guilds, and the broader OLPH community.



Important Campus Safety Update

We have implemented new Safety Protocols with the intention of improving the safety of our students from external threats.

We recently installed "panic bars" on doors at all entrances in the church. They can be locked from the outside but opened from the inside.

New Protocols for Tue. & Thu. 8:30am Masses

Students arrive around 8:15am. Staff will begin locking the doors at 8:30am. The last two doors that will be closed are the Church St. entrance and the South Vestibule entrance at 8:35am. At that point, all doors are locked in the Church. No one will be allowed in. If you are planning on attending 8:30am Mass on these days, make sure you arrive before 8:30am or you will not be allowed in the church.

Occasions With Limited Access to the Lady Chapel Only.

There will be other times during the school year when children will be in the church or McDonnell Hall, when the main entrances will be closed, but there will be access to our Lady Chapel for those who want to come and pray or for adoration.

The safety of our students and staff is of the highest importance to us. We will continue to find ways to improve the safety of our OLPH Campus. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

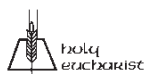
