Dear Parishioners,

“Seek the Lord all you humble of the earth.”

Recently Pope Leo declared 2026 a Year of Jubilee to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the death of St. Francis of Assisi. Many theologians and Church historians consider St. Francis the most consequential Christian since the Apostolic Era, the time of the Apostles.

There will be many commemorations of this anniversary throughout the coming year culminating with his feast day in October. One of the truly remarkable events announced by the Holy Father was his casket will be open for the first time in history for veneration by pilgrims in Assisi from Feb. 22 to March 22 in the Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi. You must register online and 300,000 people have already registered.

As many of you know, I have been blessed to go on retreat to Assisi every other year. St. Francis of Assisi has been a profound influence in my life. I usually go on retreat in October but this opportunity to venerate his tomb is so extraordinary. I rolled the dice and applied for a registration and I made the cut! I am so blessed that I will begin my annual retreat visiting his tomb on March 2. Please pray for me!

Francis' journey to sainthood was the result of several conversion moments. He gave his cloak to a freezing homeless person and experienced solidarity with a suffering person he had not known. He restored his parish church desperate for repair and realized the Lord was calling him to be part of the healing of the larger church that fell victim to corruption. He enunciated his wealth and title to beg for the poor and felt liberated. He became a source of inspiration for hundreds of people who wanted spiritual renewal in their lives. He ushered in one of the most profound renewal movements in the history of the Church.

Francis reminds us that the humble of the earth need to seek the Lord. In being humble we become the vessel of the Lord's spirit and hope. This desire to be a more authentic witness of Christ is hard to do but the Gospel's reference to the Beatitudes gives us a roadmap!

As we draw closer to the beginning of Lent, give some

thought to joining Scripture Study. The series will focus on the Passion of Our Lord. It will be great.

This weekend we celebrate Scout Sunday at the 7:30am Mass. Sunday morning there will be the annual Pancake Breakfast in the Playdium. Hands down the best breakfast in Glenview!

Next Saturday will be our annual Ministry Appreciation Mass and reception. It will begin with the 5:00pm Mass. Our parish thrives because of the countless number of parishioners who minister so faithfully. From the liturgy to the Sharing Room to the classroom and beyond, this parish reaches out to so many because of this devoted and committed community of ministers. Thank you for your generous service!

We recently implemented our new security protocols for the 8:30am Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The Church will be locked at 8:30 to secure the Church when children are attending from the school. It has gone very well, and I am so grateful for everyone's cooperation.

The Annual Catholic Appeal is underway. You may have received information in the mail. This year's theme is “Together We Bring Light.” The Annual Appeal supports so many ministries of the archdiocese. Money raised supports initiatives especially for the poor and parishes struggling. The Appeal also supports Catholic Relief Services that assists so many people facing catastrophes because of natural disasters. There is much more information on the Appeal in the Bulletin. There will be an in-pew process on the weekend of Feb. 14-15. We have been blessed each year with exceeding our goal and those excess funds stay in the parish. In recent years proceeds helped us to replace the carpet in the church, upgrade the clock in the bell tower, and purchase new tables and chairs for McDonnell Hall. If we exceed our goal this year, I hope we can paint and enhance the stage area of McDonnell Hall and have some funds to enhance our capital campaign project to upgrade the Glenview Road entrance.

I extend my deepest sympathies to our Music Director, **Russell Stern** on the death of his father **Jerome**. May his memory be a blessing.

Together, let us “seek the Lord” with humble hearts!

Little by Little continues to provide financial support to Haiti via Mountain Top Ministries (MTM) health and nutrition program for students and teachers at the school. The program feeds over 500 children and teachers daily and cost \$5,000 per month (\$60,000 per year).

Along with the efforts of several medical teams providing care at MTM throughout the year, we were amazed to see how our care significantly improved the general health of the village.

His dreams to support the Nyenga Parish community in his home country of Uganda match the aims of Little by Little: to relieve suffering and provide access to care for malnutrition, hypertension, diabetes, AIDS and malaria where 27% of deaths in Uganda are due to Malaria. Little by Little has been maintaining a medical outreach program with Nyenga Hospital in Uganda. Grateful to God for this ongoing opportunity that has cared for approximately 12,000 patients. This cost is \$20,000 per year.
