Dear Parishioners,

"Your light must shine before others."

When we are baptized, a candle is lit from the Paschal Candle and the priest or deacon says, "Receive the light of Christ! This light is entrusted to you to keep burning brightly. May you walk always as a child of the light." Our faith is intended to be a source of light that shines before us and within us.

Being a bearer of light is a noble aspect of living the Christian life. We all confront the forces of darkness and find at its source selfishness, resentment, cruelty, impatience, the list could go on and on.

There is something about people who are forces of light. You know them! They touch us by their kindness, their humility, their "other centered" manner of living. Our Lord invites us into his light as a gift to be shared and witnessed.

As a pastor I see the power of the light "shining before others." I see it in the Sharing Room, I see it in the face of someone who was comforted by the visit of a care minister, I see it when a catechist is sharing their faith with their class, I see it when a Confirmation candidate gives of their time to be of service to others.

The light that Jesus calls us to is a transformative power. It challenges us to live our faith in evident and deliberative ways.

This weekend is the announcement weekend for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Its theme is quite appropriate to the readings, "Together we bring light." The mission of the archdiocese is to be a bearer of light to our metropolitan community and beyond. With the resources that are raised the light of hope serves low-income parishes and schools, the many ministries of the archdiocese, a continued investment in the spiritual renewal of our diocesan community, and to support the efforts of Catholic Relief Services.

Each parish is given a goal based on our offertory income. The goal for OLPH is \$221,256. Any funds raised more than that goal remains in the parish. Last year we exceeded our goal by \$80,000. We were able to enhance the renovations of McDonnell Hall. If we exceed our goal, we would like to purchase new tables and chairs for McDonnell Hall and paint and repair the stage area. Thank you for considering supporting this year's Annual Appeal. Next week, there will be a reflection by the Cardinal on the Appeal, and I will lead us through an in-pew process.

This weekend on Saturday at 5:00pm Mass we will have our annual Ministry Appreciation Mass and reception. Talk about the "light" shining before others. I am impressed by the commitment of so many to the ministerial life of our faith community. Every week, a legion of parishioners bears the light of hope, compassion, faith, and presence to the youngest among us to the oldest. Each week our liturgies, our faith formation efforts and our outreach to the larger world is a beacon of hope. Thank you to everyone who serves us as bearers of the light.

We recently had a wonderful retreat for our confirmation candidates in Religious Ed. It was so good. I am grateful to **Zoe Sundstrom** and many of our eight grade catechists who organized such a moving event.

One of the treasures on Glenview Road is the Oil Lamp Theater. A new chapter of their future is beginning with great plans to enhance their facility and their future. They need our support as they undertake an exciting capital campaign.

Let your light shine!

Little by Little continues to provide financial support to Haiti via Mountain Top Ministries (MTM) health and nutrition program for students and teachers at the school. The program feeds over 500 children and teachers daily and cost \$5,000 per month (\$60,000 per year).

Along with the efforts of several medical teams providing care at MTM throughout the year, we were amazed to see how our care significantly improved the general health of the village.

New support efforts in Uganda

We share a vision of serving the marginalized with **Fr. Patrick Kizza**. His dreams to support the Nyenga Parish community in his home country of Uganda match the aims of Little by Little: to relieve suffering and provide access to care for malnutrition, hypertension, diabetes, AIDS and malaria where 27% of deaths in Uganda are due to Malaria. Little by Little has been maintaining a medical outreach program with Nyenga Hospital in Uganda. Grateful to God for this ongoing opportunity that has cared for approximately 12,000 patients. This cost is \$20,000 per year.

What is Alpha?

You may have seen the Alpha flyer in the bulletin or even heard the announcement in church about our upcoming session, yet you may still be wondering, "What is Alpha"? Briefly, the Alpha program introduces the basics of the Christian faith and is designed for those seeking God, for those new to Christianity, and for those who want to strengthen their existing faith. Alpha started in an Anglican Church in the 1970's, and the program is now run in thousands of churches worldwide. It is not catechesis, nor does it focus on scripture; the goal of Alpha is to get people talking about the bigger issues like why we are here, who is Jesus, the importance of forgiveness, the power of the Holy Spirit, etc. Alpha stresses establishing a personal relationship with Jesus and feeling his great love and forgiveness as well as learning about and experiencing the power of the Holy Spirit.

Alpha meetings always start with sharing a meal together which encourages friendship and community. After dinner, there is a 20 to 30 minute video followed by small group discussion. All are encouraged to express their views in a welcoming atmosphere where we meet people no matter where they are on their faith journey. This is our third Alpha session, and those who have been our guests expressed feeling a deep sense of belonging as well as enjoying the videos and having the freedom to express themselves in small group discussion.

We would love for you to join us at our next Alpha, which begins on Wednesday, March 4, and runs through eleven consecutive Wednesdays from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm. After the seventh Wednesday, we have an all-day Saturday session from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm with an emphasis on prayer, song, and the Holy Spirit. There is no fee to join Alpha, and all are welcome. Alpha is a unique opportunity to enjoy the company of others, make new friends, and discuss topics relevant to all of our lives. 


