



seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

“Jesus was led by the Spirit.”

Well, our annual Lenten journey is off and running. Lent always kind of sneaks up on us, more so this year because Lent has begun earlier than usual.

In these early days of Lent, it can seem like we have a long way ahead of us before Easter, but the fact is the days will pass quickly, and we will be swept into the Easter season before we know it. It is even more imperative that we immerse ourselves in the spirit of our Lenten practices.

On Ash Wednesday the spiritual foundations of Lent were described. Lent is built on three pillars, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

The Gospel retells the story of Jesus being tempted in the desert. We are told that Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert. He begins his ministry, facing temptations, allowing the Spirit to lead him, and finding the power to overcome them.

We are being “led by the Spirit” as we begin our Lenten journey. We all have “stuff” to face and deal with. Like the Lord we can discover the spiritual power to prevail against darkness and evil.

One of the pillars of the Lenten journey is fasting. We most often associate that practice with denying our usual eating routines for a spiritual purpose. In his first Lenten reflection, Pope Leo suggested we consider a different kind of fasting. He invites us to a very practical consideration. He suggests we consider fasting and abstaining from words that offend and hurt our neighbor. “Let us begin by disarming our language, avoiding harsh words and rash judgement, refraining from slander, and speaking ill of those not present and cannot defend themselves. Instead, let us strive to measure our words and cultivate kindness and respect in our families, among our friends, at work, on social media, in political debates, in the media and in Christian communities. In this way words of hatred give way to words of hope and peace.” I found this a helpful way to begin my Lenten journey, which led by the Spirit, I may encounter the conversion of heart to embrace Easter this year.

Please review our Lenten calendar (see pages 10-11 in this Bulletin.). As you can see, we have a multitude of opportunities to enhance your Lenten journey. If you have not picked up a Lenten reflection book, they are available at the exits. They provide a daily reflection that can center

your thoughts based on the daily readings. Our Scripture Study semester will reflect on the passion.

There is a virtual opportunity being led by **Fr. Michael Sparough SJ**. In a few weeks, our parish almsgiving project will be reflected by **Sr. Lucia Murashko** on behalf of Catholic Extension Society supporting her ministry in Ukraine.

We have our annual St. Joseph Men’s Day of Reflection on March 21 and our parish mission scheduled for March 28. Alpha also begins in March. We also have a Lenten retreat for the teens.

This Sunday is the Annual Blood Drive being held in the Playdium. Please consider a donation. Your pint of blood can help so many in need.

Congratulations to our eighth graders who were confirmed on Saturday by **Bishop Mark Bartosic**.

We are in the midst of the finishing touches on McDonnell Hall. We just had an “industrial clean up” of the Hall following these months of construction. Once the sanctuary furniture arrives, we will be able to reinstate the 9:30am family Mass. As soon as we are ready, we will announce the restoration of that Mass.

I am so grateful for your financial support of the renovation and especially for your patience. We will be having a formal rededication of McDonnell Hall at some point in the Easter season.

Please pray for me as I begin my annual retreat in Assisi. Of many things I am reflecting on “pre-retirement” jitters! Hopefully, St. Francis can help me find the way!

May your Lenten journey be “led by the Spirit,”






CREATE IN ME A NEW HEART

Our Lenten theme “Create in Me a New Heart,” calls us to reflect on repentance—to turn away from sin and to return to God. During the Lenten Season, we often make resolutions to give up a bad habit or cultivate a new one.

We seek to rid our hearts of hatred, resentment, and ill will toward others that if gone unchecked can fester, preventing love, forgiveness, and compassion to enter our hearts and to grow.

The painting by **Ron DiCianni**, entitled “Salvation,” chosen to represent this year’s theme, depicts a young man kneeling in repentance at the foot of the cross, a mallet in one hand, a spike in the other.

This powerful image illustrates the guilt we all share in the crucifixion of Our Lord; for the cross Jesus bore as he stumbled his way to Calvary was weighed down not by the sins of just a few but by the sins of all from the beginning of time to its end. This young man represents the World kneeling in repentance as the dawn of salvation shines through the darkness.

All of us are guilty of sin, but, despite our failings, God still and always will love us. John assures us of this when he proclaims, “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life (3:16). How glorious to know that we are loved so unconditionally and to believe that through the Father’s love and his Son’s sacrifice, we have been saved and have been called to follow in the footsteps of our Savior.

The weeks before Easter as we think about the sacrifice Jesus made, we seek forgiveness for our wrongdoings, and through the mercy of Our Father, we ask to be washed clean of our sins, to be made new.

There are times we might feel that God’s disappointment in us is so great that we are not worthy of His love and forgiveness.

We convince ourselves that God has surely given up on us. Please know that nothing could be further from the truth. St. Augustine believed that, “If you were the only one on earth, Jesus would still die for you.”

What could be more wonderful than to know that we are all unique and beloved in the eyes of Our Father! If we stand before him with true repentance, God with his loving touch will mend the pieces of our broken heart.

For several years, “Create Me Again” has been our weekly psalm during Lent in which we sing “God of compassion, your servant has sinned. Breathe out your spirit: create me again.” So, as we raise our voices in praise this Lenten season, let us think about the words we sing as we ask Our Father to, “Give me back the joy that comes from salvation; teach me to live life anew.”

Like the young man in DiCianni’s painting, let us fall to our knees in humble repentance in the shadow of the cross as we fervently pray “Create in Me a New Heart.”



"Mere Christianity" is one of the most popular introductions to Christian faith ever written. The book brings together C.S. Lewis's legendary broadcast talks of the WWII years in which he set out simply to explain and defend the belief that has been common to nearly all Christians at all times.

It is a collection of scintillating brilliance that remains strikingly fresh for the modern reader, and at the same time confirms C.S. Lewis's reputation as one of the intellectual giants of the twentieth century and arguably one of the most influential writers of his day.



What is Alpha?

You may have seen the Alpha flyer in the bulletin or even heard the announcement in church about our upcoming session, yet you may still be wondering, "What is Alpha"? Briefly, the Alpha program introduces the basics of the Christian faith and is designed for those seeking God, for those new to Christianity, and for those who want to strengthen their existing faith. Alpha started in an Anglican Church in the 1970's, and the program is now run in thousands of churches worldwide. It is not catechesis, nor does it focus on scripture; the goal of Alpha is to get people talking about the bigger issues like why we are here, who is Jesus, the importance of forgiveness, the power of the Holy Spirit, etc. Alpha stresses establishing a personal relationship with Jesus and feeling his great love and forgiveness as well as learning about and experiencing the power of the Holy Spirit.

Alpha meetings always start with sharing a meal together which encourages friendship and community. After dinner, there is a 20 to 30 minute video followed by small group discussion. All are encouraged to express their views in a welcoming atmosphere where we meet people no matter where they are on their faith journey. This is our third Alpha session, and those who have been our guests expressed feeling a deep sense of belonging as well as enjoying the videos and having the freedom to express themselves in small group discussion.

We would love for you to join us at our next Alpha, which begins on Wednesday, March 4, and runs through eleven consecutive Wednesdays from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm. After the seventh Wednesday, we have an all-day Saturday session from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm with an emphasis on prayer, song, and the Holy Spirit. There is no fee to join Alpha, and all are welcome. Alpha is a unique opportunity to enjoy the company of others, make new friends, and discuss topics relevant to all of our lives. There is a place for everyone, and we cordially invite you to be a guest at our table. For more information, please contact Margie André at mandre@olphglenview.org.

Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance, puts us face to face with the mercy and forgiveness of Christ. Each Saturday afternoon, a priest is available in church to hear confessions.

Fasting

The Church requires all those between 18 and 59 years of age to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. All Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent.

Almsgiving


