Dear Parishioners,
"The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ"

Holy Week always begins with Palm Sunday and the solemn proclamation of the "Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ." This most sacred of weeks invites us to recall those words central to our annual observance of Our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Matthew's account begins with the events that led to Judas' betrayal of our Lord. One of the striking things about the Garden of Gethsemane in Jerusalem is a tree that has been determined to be over 2,000 years old. That tree was there when Jesus was taken into custody. That betrayal

would result in the crucifixion and the death of Our Lord. There is an eerie silence in Jerusalem this week. Many of the shrines of the Holy Land are closed because of security concerns. For the first time in anyone's memory, the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher has been closed.

While the tragic events surrounding the current violence in the Middle East have had such painful consequences, there is no way the story of Holy Week can be kept from being proclaimed and venerated. All over the world the "Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ" is being told. We recall with profound reverence the journey of Jesus to Calvary, the empty tomb and Easter Morning.

I invite you to open your hearts to the power of this Holy

Week. Some of the most profound and moving liturgies are celebrated this week. Allow the beauty and solemnity of the liturgies and prayers of Holy Week sweep over you. Holy Week culminates with the greatest feast of the liturgical year - Easter Sunday.

Let us hold in your hearts the candidates for Baptism and their reception into the Church and Confirmation, who will be received on Holy Saturday. Their spiritual journey has been profound and we praise God for their willingness and commitment to come to the life-giving waters of baptism, the Eucharistic table, and the anointing with the chrism of confirmation.


I have two wonderful announcements regarding Easter:

Horseradish - a reminder of Christ's suffering and the bitter herbs offered Him on the cross


Salt - symbolizing wisdom needed in our daily lives








The Easter Triduum is the three-day celebration for which Lent prepares us. From Holy Thursday evening through Easter Sunday, our Lenten mood of repentance gives way to our eager anticipation of the Resurrection of the Lord, the culmination of the entire liturgical year.

By doing what Jesus commanded in the washing of feet and service to the poor, we recall the precept that still forms our vision of church. The Passover meal recounted in the gospel is an invitation to dedicate ourselves anew even as we welcome those who have been preparing for baptism and reception into full communion with the church.

We keep watch into Good Friday through services of Morning Prayer and Stations of the Cross during the day, and at night we ponder Christ’s passion and death in the liturgy of the Word and Veneration of the Cross. After the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the place of repose, a solemn vigil continues until Saturday night. With prayer and fasting we make room in our lives for the presence of the Lord.


The Triduum concludes with great festivity on Easter Sunday with Masses throughout the morning.



Get on Board the “Mercy Train”

Many of us knew **Therese Tirpak** as a music teacher at Our Lady of Perpetual Help School and a long-time parishioner. From when she joined OLPH in 1981 until she passed away in 2022, Therese actively participated in a number of parish ministries including the Rosary and 3:00 Friday Prayer Groups, Bible studies, and the Easter Basket Blessing. And for more than 30 years, she fostered the **Divine Mercy Devotion** which Jesus had revealed to Saint Faustina Kowalska.

On numerous occasions, Therese was asked to write a book but preferred the personal interaction of a heartfelt conversation, usually one-on-one or in a small group, sharing things she knew to be invaluable on the journey to heaven. In 2024, **Relevant Radio** invited her son Tom and his family to present a Divine Mercy testimonial at the National Eucharistic Congress. This motivated him to reach out to **Marian Press** with a book proposal, a collection of **40 short stories** based on interviews recorded with Therese in 2020 about the “mercy moments” she had noted in a notebook over the years.



These engaging and uplifting narratives are drawn from ordinary—and sometimes unexpected—experiences: family life, travel, work, and chance encounters. Each begins with a Bible verse, offering broader context and inviting readers to reflect on its meaning for their own lives.

As a teacher, wife, mom, and trusted friend, Therese connected with people and enthusiastically shared the message of Divine Mercy. Stories such as — *The Mustard Seed, A Neighborly Act of Sharing, The Holy Card Team, A Birthday Gift for Tony, and A Miracle in St. Peter’s Square*, convey that same warmth, purpose, and joy.

One of the first stories in the book *Mercy Starts at Home* includes a beautiful recollection of OLPH’s very first Celebration of Mercy Sunday in April 1991:

“... During the Mass, when it was time for Communion, I went up to the choir loft to join Alison O’Brien, our cantor, for a duet of “Ave Maria.” Looking down from above, I saw a sight that brought great joy to my heart — the entire church filled with people, receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, embracing Jesus’ boundless mercy for us...

After everyone had gone, I stood momentarily at the back of the church, gazing up at the large crucifix over the marble altar, the stately white columns framing the rows of pews, and the gold and crystal chandeliers hanging from the arched ceiling. The church’s architecture reflected something vast, strong, and welcoming — just like

God’s mercy. Decades earlier, Father John Dussman had led the parish in building this church, incorporating the artistic styles of Colonial America into an imposing yet inviting house of worship... the heart of a Catholic community in a growing Chicago suburb...”






Barrett Book Club
