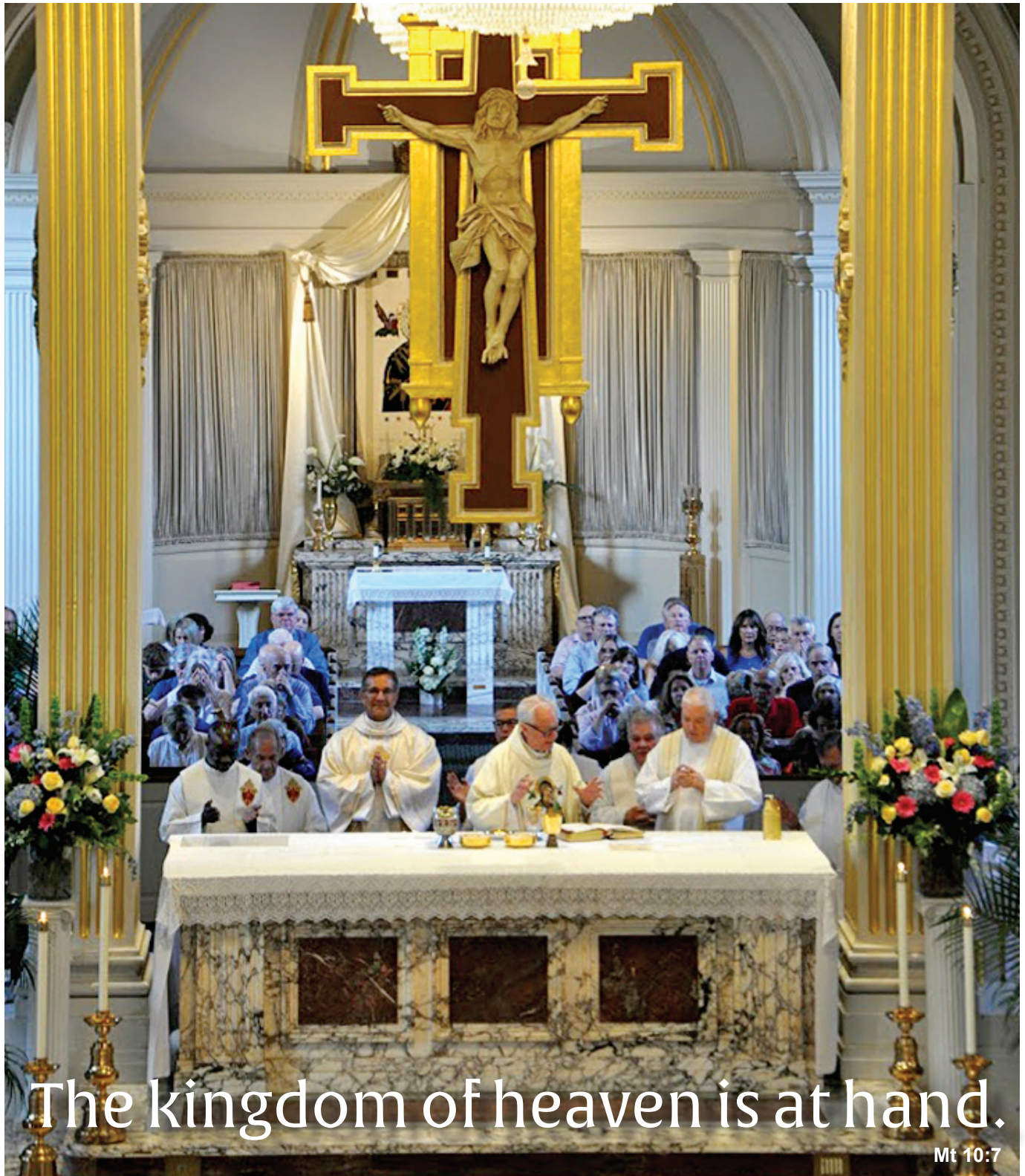

From Russell:

"The Parting Glass" (Roud 3004) is a Scottish traditional song, often sung at the end of a gathering of friends. It has also long been popular in Ireland, and modern versions reflect strong Irish and North American influences.

The "parting glass", or "stirrup cup", was the final hospitality offered to a departing guest. Once they had mounted, they were presented one final drink to fortify them for their travels. The custom was practised in several continental countries."

Here is a 1654 version of the Lyrics:

Now come is my departing time,
And here I may no longer stay,
There is no kind comrade of mine
But will desire I were away.
But if that time will me permit,
Which from your Company doth call,
And me inforceth for to flit,
Good Night, and GOD be with you all.

For here I grant some time I spent
In loving kind good Company;
For all offences I repent,
And wisheth now forgiven to be;
What I have done, for want of wit,
To Memory I'll not recall:
I hope you are my Friends as yet
Good Night, and GOD be with you all.

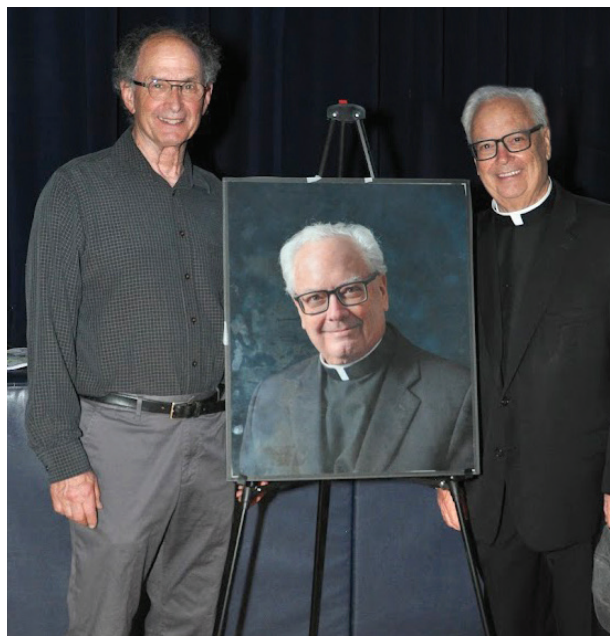

Summer with St. Francis

Welcome to our first weekly excerpt from the book *The Life of St. Francis* written by St. Bonaventure, a Franciscan monk and mystic

Prologue by St. Bonaventure

I feel like I am unworthy and unequal to the task of writing a life of a man so venerable and worthy of imitation. I would never have attempted it if the fervent desire of the friars had not aroused me, the unanimous urging of the General Chapter had not induced me, and the devotion which I am obliged to have to our holy father Francis had not compelled me. For when I was a boy, as I still vividly remember, I was snatched from the jaws of death by his invocation and merits.

So if I remained silent and did not sing his praises, I feel that I would be rightly accused of the crime of ingratitude. I recognize that God saved my life through him, and I realize that I have experienced his power in my very person. This, then, is my principal reason for undertaking this task, that I may gather together the accounts of his virtues, his actions, and his words—like so many fragments, partly forgotten and partly scattered—so that they may not be lost when those who lived with this servant of God die.

To avoid confusion I did not always weave the story together in chronological order. Rather, I strove to maintain a more thematic order, relating to the same theme events that happened at different times, and to different theme events that happened at the same time as seemed appropriate. - Bonaventure



Excerpt from Chapter 1: On Saint Francis' Manner of Life While in Secular Attire

God implanted in the heart of a youthful Francis, a certain openhanded compassion for the poor. Growing from his infancy, this compassion had so filled his heart with generosity that even at that time he determined not to be deaf to the Gospel but to give to everyone who begged, especially if he asked "for the love of God."

On one occasion, when Francis was distracted by the press of business, he sent away empty-handed a certain poor man who had begged alms for the love of God. As soon as Francis came to his senses, he ran after the man, promising God from that moment onward, that he would never refuse those who begged for the love of God. He kept this promise with untiring fidelity until his death and merited an abundant increase of grace and love for God.

Afterward, when he had perfectly put on Christ, he used to say that even while he was in secular attire, he could scarcely ever hear any mention of the love of God without being moved in his heart. Up to this time, however, Francis was ignorant of God's plan for him.

He was distracted by the external affairs of his father's business and drawn toward earthly things by the corruption of human nature. He had not yet learned how to contemplate the things of heaven nor had he acquired a taste for the things of God.

Since affliction can enlighten our spiritual awareness, the hand of the Lord came upon him, and the right hand of God affected a change in him. God afflicted his body with a prolonged illness in order to prepare his soul for the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

After his strength was restored, when he had dressed as usual in his fine clothes, he met a certain knight who was of noble birth, but poor and badly clothed. Moved to compassion for his poverty, Francis took off his own garments and clothed the man on the spot. At one and the same time he fulfilled the twofold duty of covering over the embarrassment of a noble knight and relieving the poverty of a poor man.

The following night, when he fell asleep, God in his goodness showed him a large and splendid palace full of military weapons emblazoned with the insignia of Christ's Cross. Thus God vividly indicated that the compassion he had exhibited toward the poor knight for love of the supreme King would be repaid with an incomparable reward.

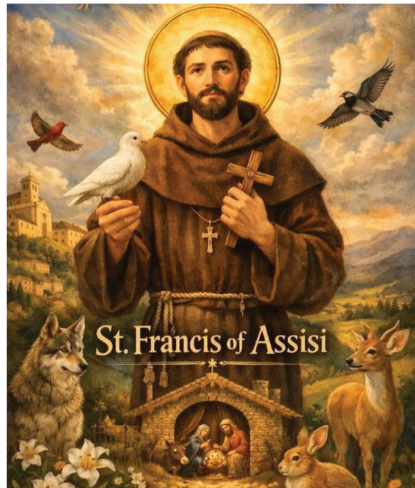
And so when Francis asked to whom these belonged, he received an answer from heaven that all these things were for him and his knights. When he awoke in the morning, he judged the strange vision to be an indication that he would have great prosperity; but he had no experience interpreting divine mysteries nor did he know how to pass through

visible images to grasp the invisible truth beyond. Therefore, still ignorant of God's plan, he decided to join a certain count in Apulia, hoping in his service to obtain the glory of knighthood, as his vision seemed to foretell. He set out on his journey shortly afterwards; but when he got as far as the next town he heard during the night, the Lord, addressing in a familiar way, saying, "Francis, who can do more for you, a lord or a servant, a rich man or poor man?"

When Francis replied that a lord and a rich man could do more, he was at once asked, "Why, then, are you abandoning the Lord for a servant and the rich God for a poor man?" And Francis replied, "Lord, what will you have me do?" And the Lord answered, "Return to your own land, because the vision with which you have seen foretells a spiritual outcome which will be accomplished in you not by human but by divine planning."

In the morning, then, he returned in haste to Assisi, joyous and free of care. Already a model of obedience, he awaited the Lord's will.



From that time on he withdrew from the bustle of public business and devoutly begged God in his goodness to show him what he should do. The flame of heavenly desire was fanned in him by his frequent prayer, and his desire for his heavenly home led him to despise as nothing all earthly things.

He realized that he had found a hidden treasure, and I like the wise merchant, he planned to sell all he had and buy the pearl he had found (Matthew 13:44-46). Nevertheless, how he should do this, he did not yet know. But it was being suggested to him inwardly that to

be a spiritual merchant one must begin with contempt for the world, and to be a knight of Christ one must begin with victory over oneself.
