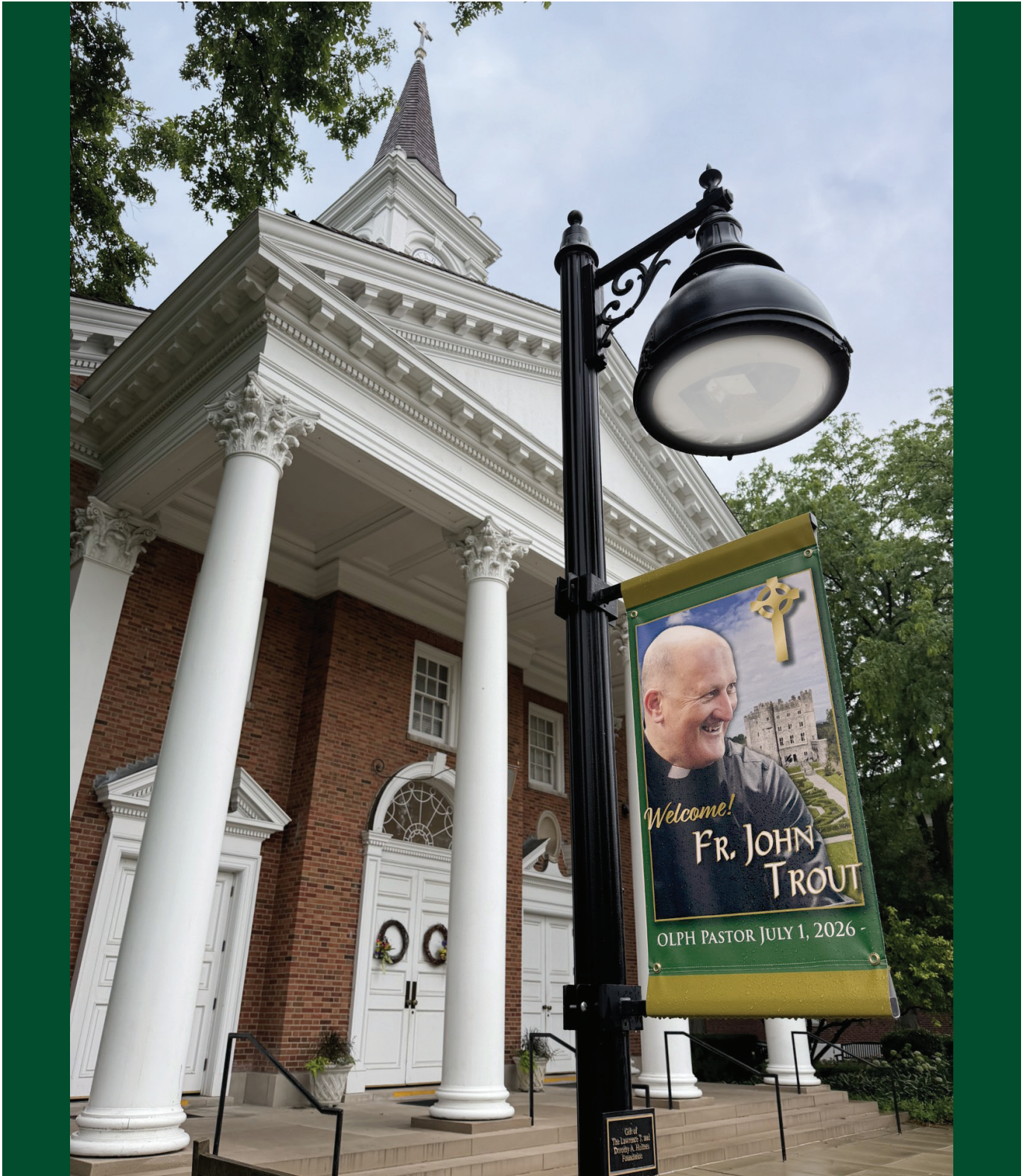

In the last five years DC IPS facilitated:

- 12 Circuit Riders for ongoing Maintenance Programs with the hope of expanding to include every WASH project.



Madame Adijatou Ouegraogo, Burkina Faso is a regular patient at the clinic Notre Dame de Esperance. In her words “I want to thank the donors for this project that have made the facilities in the clinic more decent. Before it was difficult to have access to water. Now everywhere you are you can wash your hands. The toilets are a great thing for the service users of the clinic. I feel very safe and clean using the facilities of the clinic, thanks to this new project!”

Why WASH?: Sisters at the local level repeatedly request assistance with WASH Projects. DC IPS has played a lead role in the Vatican’s initiative to increase WASH access in Catholic health facilities.

Pope Leo XIV issued a statement of support, sending “the assurance of his spiritual closeness to the members of the health agencies and networks attending the gathering on improving

water, sanitation and hygiene in healthcare facilities.” He further states he is “pleased to see so many organizations of various faith backgrounds working together on this pressing issue and seeking to improve the living standards of our brothers and sisters” and imparted his Apostolic Blessing.



“This project has transformed our lives and our health. Today we have access to clean water, and it also gives us security for food preparation. We have a continuous water supply all week long. This project is a model for other families to implement this rainwater harvesting system in their homes to cope with water scarcity during times of drought.” Sister Aurelia

Cardinal Michael F. Czerny, Prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development at the Vatican, said,

“No one needs lofty theological concepts to justify proper WASH. Without it, healthcare cannot be healthy. No treatment, no surgery, no delivery can be safely performed without meeting basic WASH conditions. Providing them for all is an elementary step toward equal human dignity and integral human development, which otherwise are at risk.” (2023)

Did you know?: According to WHO/UNICEF across 60 low-resourced countries 37% of healthcare facilities lack basic water services and 81% lack basic sanitation services. The critical lack of WASH infrastructure means pregnant women must carry large containers of water to clinics in order to give birth. Communities without WASH have increased maternal and infant morbidity and mortality, higher rates of preventable illness and disease, antibiotic resistance, and a resulting rise in poverty.

In response to these dire conditions across the globe, IPS joined a Vatican Dicastery committee in 2019 to improve WASH in Health Care Facilities. At the start, IPS committed to complete 4 WASH healthcare projects. Since then, IPS responded to Sisters’ requests for an additional 15 WASH projects in Daughter of Charity health facilities and a subsequent 11 requests for ongoing maintenance (aka Circuit Rider). Although the focus of the committee is healthcare, IPS also addressed requests from Sisters for 15 more projects in schools, hostels, community outreach programs, and refugee camps.

These efforts depend on the generosity of donors. Every contribution goes directly to support a Sister-led project, making a real and meaningful difference.

Summer with St. Francis

From the book *The Life of St. Francis*
written by St. Bonaventure, a Franciscan monk and mystic, in 1260.

Week 3: Chapter 2 Part 1 *On His Perfect Conversion to God*

One day when Francis went out to meditate in the fields, he walked beside the church of San Damiano, which was threatening to collapse because of extreme age. Inspired by the Spirit, he went inside to pray. Prostrate before an image of the Crucified, he was filled with no little consolation as he prayed. While his tear-filled eyes were gazing at the Lord's Cross, he heard with his bodily ears a voice coming from the Cross, telling him three times: "Francis, go and repair my house, which, as you see, is falling completely into ruin."

Trembling with fear, Francis was amazed at the sound of this astonishing voice since he was alone in the church; and as he received in his heart the power of the divine words, he fell into a state of ecstasy. Returning finally to his senses, he prepared to obey, gathering himself together to carry out the command of repairing the church materially, although the principal intention of the words referred to that Church which "Christ purchased with his own blood" (Acts 20:28) as the Holy Spirit taught him and as he himself later disclosed to the friars.

He rose then, made the sign of the cross, and taking some cloth to sell, hurried off to the town called Foligno. There he sold all he had brought with him and, lucky merchant that he was, even sold the horse he was riding. Returning to Assisi, he reverently entered the church which he had been commanded to repair.

When he found the poor priest there, he greeted him with fitting reverence, offered him money for the repairs on the church and for the poor, and humbly requested that the priest allow him to stay with him for a time. The priest agreed to him staying there but would not accept the money out of fear of his parents. True despiser of money that he was, Francis threw it on a window sill, valuing it no more than if it were dust.

When his father learned that the servant of God was staying with this priest, he was greatly disturbed and ran to the

place. But Francis, upon hearing about the threats of those who were pursuing him and having a premonition that they were approaching, hid himself--being still untrained as an athlete of Christ--in a secret pit. There he remained in hiding for some days, imploring the Lord incessantly with a flood of tears to deliver him from the hands of those who were persecuting his soul and in his kindness to bring to realization the pious desires he had inspired. He was then filled with excessive joy and began to accuse himself of cowardice. He

cast aside his fear, left the pit and took the road to the town of Assisi.

When the townspeople saw his unkempt face and his changed mentality, they thought that he had gone out of his senses. They threw filth from the streets and stones at him, shouting insults at him as if he were insane and out of his mind. But the Lord's servant passed through it as if

he were deaf to it all, unbroken and unchanged by any of these insults. When his father heard the shouting, he ran to him at once, not to save him but to destroy him.

Casting aside all compassion, his father dragged him home, tormenting him first with words, then with blows and chains. But this made Francis all the more eager and stronger to carry out what he had begun, as he recalled the words of the Gospel: "Blessed are they who suffer persecution for justice's sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:10).

After a little while, when his father went out of the country, his mother, who did not approve what her husband had done and had no hope of being able to soften her son's inflexible constancy, released him from his chains and permitted him to go away. He gave thanks to Almighty God and went back to the place where he had been before.

Returning and not finding Francis at home, his father violently reproached his wife and in rage ran to that place. If he could not bring Francis back home, he would at least drive him out

of the district. But strengthened by God, Francis went out on his own accord to meet his furious father, calling out in a clear voice that he cared nothing for his chains and blows. Besides, he stated that he would gladly undergo any evil for the name of Christ. When his father, therefore, saw that he could not bring him around, he turned his attention to getting his money back. When he finally found it thrown on the window sill, his rage was mitigated a little, and the thirst of his avarice was somewhat alleviated by the draft of money.

Thereupon his carnally minded father led this child of grace, now stripped of his money, before the bishop of the town. He wanted to have Francis renounce into his hands his family possessions and return everything he had. A true lover of poverty, Francis showed himself eager to comply; he went before the bishop without delay or hesitating. He did not wait for any words, nor did he speak any, but immediately took off his clothes and gave them back to his father.

Then it was discovered that the man of God had a hairshirt next to his skin under his fine clothes. Moreover, drunk with remarkable fervor, he even took off his underwear, stripping himself completely naked before all. He said to his father, "Until now I have called you father here on earth, but now I can say without reservation, 'Our Father who art in heaven' (Matthew 6:9) since I have placed all my treasure and all my hope in Him."

When the bishop saw this, he was amazed at such intense fervor in the man of God. He immediately stood up and in tears drew Francis into his arms, covering him with the mantle he was wearing, like the pious and good man that he was. He bade his servants give Francis something to cover his body. They brought him a poor, cheap cloak of a farmer who worked for the bishop.

Francis accepted it gratefully and with his own hand marked a cross on it with a piece of chalk, thus designating it as the covering of a crucified man and a half-naked beggar. Thus the servant of the most high king was left naked so that he might follow his naked crucified Lord, whom he loved. Thus the Cross strengthened him to entrust his soul to the wood of salvation that would save him from the shipwreck of the world.

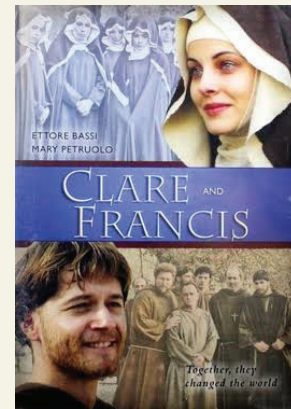

The Way

Experience Francis' Conversion On Screen

This epic film on the lives of St. Clare and St. Francis of Assisi was shot on location in Italy. It is unique among films about St. Francis because of the historical accuracy of the story and its authentic spirit of joy and piety so characteristic of Francis, as well as the major role played by Clare.



The two leads are played by very appealing performers who give genuinely inspiring and beautifully moving performances of the daughter of a patrician family and the son of a rich merchant who leave everything to follow Christ.

Francis renounces his inheritance of wealth to live the Gospel and serve the poor and outcasts. Clare reads deep into his heart and decides to follow him, leaving her home and family to give herself as a bride of Christ. Both founded major religious orders, and together they inspire many to follow their radical call to live the Gospel. Their impact has reached across the centuries to change the world.

Originally a miniseries, this film was turned into a three-hour feature film and dubbed in English. It is available to watch on FORMED or YouTube by searching for "Clare and Francis."



Generation to Generation Campaign Update



On or around June 8, we reached our base goal for the Generation to Generation Campaign. We now receive 80% of every payment made to the campaign for the benefit of OLPH.

As of June 18, receipts directed to OLPH for our local projects total \$1,938,405. We will see another distribution into our G2G account at the ARCH near the end of July.

Bids for the Lexington Lobby and Elevator project were received. The lower bidder, NORCON, Inc., was chosen by the G2G Projects Steering Committee. This is also the company we felt comfortable working with. Our Archdiocesan construction/project manager has been assigned. The contract was signed on June 10. Projected construction cost, with allowances, contingencies and architect costs, is \$1,215,000.

Preliminary work has begun, relating to the demolition plan and asbestos removal. **Tito Diaz** has met with the project manager, subs, and others to go through the project plan to be sure we remain on task. Our first construction meeting was held on June 24.

Another of the projects of the Generation to Generation Campaign is a gift of \$100,000 to our Sharing parishes. The G2G committee is committed to paying the first installment of \$25,000 from the funds currently available. That will be taken care of in the next week, as we approach year end.

We are currently also researching and working with the architect on a Glenview Road/OLPH Beautification Plan, which will include landscaping and proposed movement of the sidewalk to enhance safety, as well as a possible option for storage of items currently staged under Carrollton, either somewhere under that space or somewhere else on campus. Discussion has begun with the Village regarding this project.

Also, we are currently moving forward with a plan for Sr. Paulanne's parking garage. The committee felt strongly that we need to get these two parish projects going, even as we continue to build up enough funds to tackle the Playdium Elevator project.

Thanks to OLPH parishioners who have pledged and have been making their installment payments thus far. As a gentle reminder, we cannot begin any project without having the funds available in the bank for the entire project cost. We ask those who have not begun their pledge payments, or may be behind in their payments, to assist us in growing the funds available for our remaining projects, which include the Playdium Elevator, Hospitality Center, refurbishing of our church pews and purchase of replacement air conditioning units for some of our school classrooms.

Thank you also to those who have chosen to complete their pledges early. We are ever grateful for your commitment and sacrifice and for all you do for OLPH Parish.

Fiscal Year Notes

Security upgrades made possible by the Illinois Not-for-Profit Security Grant Program are now complete.

Thanks to this grant of \$150,000, three entrances to the Parish Center now have new doors and locks. Window safety film has been applied to all first floor and basement windows of the Parish Center, as well. You will also find additional security cameras and new, brighter lighting around campus.

McDonnell Hall remodel, along with all the other needed upgrades found during the construction, is fully complete. The final bill is still in process, with total cost projected of \$2.2 million. Remaining To Teach Who Christ Is (TTWCI) funds, along with new restricted donations to the project, Annual Catholic Appeal rebates over two-three years, and parish savings all contributed to the funding of the project. Thank you to all donors!

Although it is anticipated that fiscal year donations will fall short of budget by approximately \$75,000, we expect to end the fiscal year with a small operations surplus in the Parish financial statement. This is due to net savings in total expenses and small increases in other revenue items. A more detailed financial report will be provided over the summer and, of course, in our Annual Report, which is published in the Fall. As always, we thank you for your continued gifts of time, talent and treasure, all of which are needed to help OLPH thrive!
