Meditation on Sunday's Gospel

Matthew 13:44-52

Around the time that the gold rushes ended in the nineteenth-century West, a curious phenomenon arose in New England known as money diggers. These were men who roamed the countryside with shovels, divining rods, and superstitious hope, convinced that treasure lay buried beneath their feet. Surely there must be gold under our feet. But there was not. The craze of these wild goose chases caused many to lose farms, families, and sanity.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus inaugurates a new era of spiritual money digging. He announces, "**The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field.**" He invites us to become treasure seekers who search in the right place. What is of greatest value is not money beneath our feet, but the infinite treasure hidden deep in the humanity of Jesus himself, God's own blessed life. The glory of heaven lies veiled in his ordinary life, his teaching, his suffering, his Church.

This teaching about the Kingdom changes things. Now we see the Church's doctrinal and moral teachings are not arbitrary rules. They are a treasure map. Follow them, and we will uncover divine happiness. Ignore them, and we will wander aimlessly, spade in hand, digging in empty fields, discouraged.

Where have we wasted energy seeking treasure in the wrong places? How have we given up on seeking the treasure of truly finding God's love for us? If so, let us repent of both. Then let us dust off our shovels and get back to digging deep into the field of Christ Jesus and his Church. After all, He never ceases seeking his treasure in us.

Summer with St. Francis

From the book *The Life of St. Francis*
written by St. Bonaventure, a Franciscan monk and mystic, in 1260.

Week 6, Chapter 4 - Part 2

On the Progress of the Order and the Confirmation of the Rule

As the merits of virtue increased in Christ's little poor men, their good reputation spread all about and attracted a great number of people from different parts of the world to come and see our holy father. Among them was a spirited composer of worldly songs, who had once been crowned by the emperor and was therefore called the King of Verses. He decided to visit the man of God, who despised the things of the world.

When he found Francis preaching in a monastery in the village of San Severino, the hand of the Lord came upon him; and he saw Francis, the preacher of Christ's Cross, signed with a cross, in the form of two flashing swords, one of which stretched from his head to his feet, the other crossed his chest from one hand to the other.

He did not know Christ's servant by sight, but he quickly recognized him once he had been pointed out by so great a miracle. Dumbfounded at the vision, he immediately began to resolve to do better. He was struck in his conscience by the power of the saint's words, as if pierced by a spiritual sword coming from Francis' mouth. He completely despised his worldly popularity and joined our blessed father by making a religious profession.

When the holy man saw that he had been completely converted from the restlessness of the world to the peace of Christ, he called him Brother Pacificus. Afterwards, he advanced in holiness; and before he went to France as provincial minister—indeed he was the first to hold that office there—he merited to see a second vision: **a great Tau on Francis' forehead**, which shone in a variety of colors and caused his face to glow with wonderful beauty.

The holy man venerated this symbol with great affection, often spoke highly of it, and signed it with his own hand at the end of the letters which he sent, as if his whole desire were to mark with a Tau the foreheads of men who have been truly converted to Jesus Christ and “who moan and grieve,” according to the text of the Prophet (Ezekiel 9:4).

As the number of friars increased with the passing of time, Francis began to summon them, like a solicitous shepherd, to a general chapter at St. Mary of the Portiuncula, so as to allot to each a portion of obedience in the land of their poverty, according to the measuring-cord of divine distribution.

Although there was a complete lack of all necessities and sometimes the friars numbered more than five thousand, nevertheless with the assistance of Divine Mercy, they had adequate food, enjoyed physical health, and overflowed with spiritual joy. Francis could not be physically present at the provincial chapters, but he was present in spirit through solicitous care and governing, his insistent prayers, and his effective blessing.

Occasionally, however, he did appear visibly by God's miraculous power. For at the chapter of Arles that outstanding preacher Anthony, who is now a glorious confessor of Christ, was preaching to the friars on the inscription of the cross: “Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews” (John 19:19).

A certain friar of proven virtue, Monaldus by name, was moved by divine inspiration to look toward the door of the chapter and saw with his bodily eyes blessed Francis lifted up in midair, his arms extended as

though on a cross, and blessing the friars. All the friars felt themselves filled with such unusual inner consolation that it was clear the Spirit was giving them certain testimony that their holy father had been really present. In addition to these evident signs, it was later confirmed by the external testimony of the words of the holy father himself.

When the Order was already widely spread and Francis was considering having the rule which had been approved by Pope Innocent permanently confirmed by his successor Pope Honorius, he was advised by the following revelation from God. It seemed to him that he had to gather some tiny bread crumbs from the ground and distribute them to many hungry friars who were standing around him.

He was afraid to distribute such small crumbs lest they should fall from his hands. Then a voice spoke to him from the above: “Francis, make one host out of all these crumbs and give it to those who want to eat it.” When he did this [in the vision], whoever did not receive it devoutly or despised the gift they had received suddenly appeared covered with leprosy.

In the morning, the holy man told all this to his companions, regretting that he did not understand the meaning of the vision. On the following day while he was keeping watch in prayer, he heard a voice coming down from heaven, saying:

*“...the host

"Francis the crumbs of last night are the words of the Gospel, the host is the rule, and the leprosy is wickedness."

Since the profusion of texts from the Gospel had lengthened the rule unduly, Francis wished to condense it into a more concentrated form as the vision he was shown had commanded.

Led by the Holy Spirit, he went up to a certain mountain with two of his companions, where he fasted on bread and water, and dictated the rule as the Holy Spirit suggested to him in prayer. When he came down from the mountain, he gave the rule to his vicar to keep. But after a few days had elapsed, the vicar claimed that he had lost it by an oversight.

A second time the holy man went off to a place of solitude and at once rewrote the rule just as before, as if he were taking the words from the mouth of God. And he obtained confirmation for it, as he had desired, from the Lord Pope Honorius, in the eighth year of his pontificate.

Fervently exhorting the friars to observe this rule, Francis used to say that nothing of what he had placed there came from his own efforts, but that he dictated everything just as it had been revealed by God. To confirm this with greater certainty by God's own testimony, when only a few days had passed, the stigmata of our Lord Jesus were imprinted upon him by the finger of the living God, as the bull or seal of Christ, the Supreme Pontiff, for the complete confirmation of the rule and the approval of its author, as will be described later after an exposition of Francis' virtues.

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The Tau Cross: a revolutionary response to goodness

from the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration

There is, perhaps, no greater or more recognizable symbol for Franciscans than the image of the Tau Cross. Early biographies tell us that Francis favored this cross above all others. Friar Thomas Celano wrote: “[Francis] favored the sign of the Tau over all other [crosses]. With it alone he signed letters he sent and painted it on the walls of cells everywhere.” The Tau became, for Francis and his followers, an external representation of the very core of their Franciscan life.

Francis, however, was not the originator of this symbol. Though there are several Tau references in Scripture and the writings of early Church Fathers (see Ezekiel 9:4 and St. Antony of Egypt), the most recognizable reference to the Tau (aside from Francis) was its use by Pope Innocent III in the Fourth Lateran Council (1215). Coinciding with the major themes of the council, the Tau was to be used as 1) a sign of the Eucharist, 2) a sign of conversion, and 3) a symbol of the Crusades. It was marked on the clothing of the crusaders.

To those who know Francis’ mission and vision, it is easy to see how his use of the Tau would converge with the first two objectives of the council. But what about the last? Why would Francis use a symbol that had been appropriated for the Crusades? To answer this question we must understand what this symbol meant to Francis. First, the Tau was a sign of personal conversion — a deliberate choice to follow the life and teachings of Jesus as expressed in the Gospel. At the heart of the Gospels is the fundamental belief that all human beings, having been created out of God’s abundant goodness and love, have an inviolable dignity and worth. Thus for Francis, a life of conversion meant continually choosing to live in a way that recognized the sacred dignity and universal fraternity of all. The Tau becomes the symbolic reminder of this.

Second, the Tau was a symbol of a deliberate life of penance. Francis understood sin to be the disruption or breach of sacred fraternal relationships. Francis suggested that the way to overcome these sins was to engage in a type of penance which required both an external action (turning away from sin) and an internal change of heart (metanoia). The Tau then becomes a vivid reminder that one must continually choose to turn away from sin by turning toward God and the fraternal relationships that God has ordained.

Finally, the Tau was the ultimate symbol of God’s love and healing — the cross of Christ. Jesus’ very way of life

demonstrated the way to promote human dignity while fostering the bonds of respect among humans. And while Jesus would be crucified in an extreme violation of dignity and broken relationships, his refusal to return violence for violence became the ultimate act of love and restoration. Francis called upon his followers to embrace and emulate this paradoxical way of life. Thus, as a Franciscan symbol, **the Tau stands as a reminder that we are called to find love in the hate, beauty in the mess, goodness in the profane, and the potential in the problem.**

As to the question of why Francis would willingly adopt a symbol associated with the antithesis of his usage, we must acknowledge that Francis never wrote about the Crusades nor did he associate the Tau with the crusaders. Further, he demonstrated time and again that war was an ugly and vile testament to the failure of humans to live as God intended.

Rather than reject the Tau, Francis skillfully used this symbol as a reminder that we are called to affirm the innate goodness of God’s creation by engaging in relationships that pledge nonviolent living for the sake of our human family. He refused to accept the distortion of this symbol and actively worked to boldly proclaim its true meaning. The Tau stood—and continues to stand—as a revolutionary response to a culture of reactive fear and dehumanizing violence. — by **Sister Laura Nettles, FSPA**

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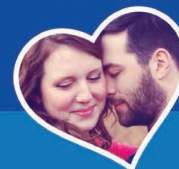
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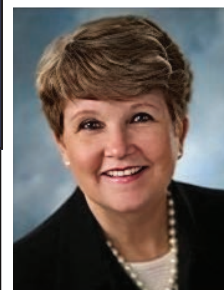
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
